HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is provided by section two hundred and seventy-four of the Public Works Act, 1928 (herein-after called "the said Act") that the Governor-General may, if he thinks fit, by Order in Council, authorize the Minister of Public Works to construct, maintain, or control any water-race or water-supply works, either within or outside a mining district, which are proposed to be constructed or which have been constructed out of funds provided by Parliament: Parliament :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the above in-part-recited Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize the Minister of Public Works to construct, maintain, and control the water-supply works described in the First Schedule hereto, and doth hereby also define the district to be served by such water-supply works as set out in the Second Schedule hereto, and herein referred to as the Downlands Water-supply District.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

THE Downlands Water-supply Works, to provide a water-supply to the Downlands Water-supply District (described in the Second Schedule hereto) by means of water drawn from the Tengawai River and from any dam or dams which are or may be constructed on the said river or its tributaries, such water being conveyed into the said district by a pipe-line

known as the Downlands Water-supply Pipe Line, and by any enlargement or extension thereof or by any other pipe line or lines constructed or acquired by the Minister of Public Works in addition to or in lieu of the said Downlands Watersupply Pipe Line and any enlargement or extension thereof; the said works, including all dams, weirs, reservoirs, tunnels, fluming, syphons, piping, gauge-boxes, break-pressure tanks, walves, bridges, pumps, spillways, regulating-gates, hydrants, meters, and all other works incidental to or required for the construction, maintenance, and control of the said works to provide a water-supply to the said Downlands Water-supply District District.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize Barbara Hope Deans, of Taueru, Masterton, married woman (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee") to lay, construct, put up, place, and use the electric lines described in the Schedule hereto on the following conditions.

CONDITIONS.

1. Purpose of Lines.

THE said lines may be used for lighting, power, and heating purposes.

2. License to be subject to Regulations.

The license hereby conferred is subject to compliance by the licensee with the Electrical Wiring Regulations, 1935, the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935, and with all regu-lations made or to be made in amplification or amendment thereof or in substitution therefor.

The conditions directed to be implied in all licenses by the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935, shall be incorporated in and shall form part of this license except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

3. System of Supply.

The system of supply shall be classified under paragraphs (a) and (f) of clause 21–01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935.

4. Voltage.

Electrical energy shall be transmitted at a pressure of 11,000 volts between phases and transformed down to 400 volts between phases or 230 volts between any phase and earth or neutral.

5. Duration of License.

Unless sooner lawfully determined, this license shall continue in force until the 31st day of March, 1942, or until the Waira-rapa Electric-power Board is authorized by license to erect electric lines generally within an area which includes the licensee's premises, whichever is the earlier.

THE following lists of assistant teachers employed in technical schools, combined schools, recognized techni-cal classes and recognized manual-training classes, or classified for employment in such schools or classes, are issued under the authority of the Minister of Education in accordance with the Manual and Technical Instruction Regulations and the Regulations for combined secondary and technical schools, made by Orders in Council dated the 20th November, 1925, and 25th September, 1931.

Under the heading "Division" is shown the division and class in which the teacher is classified. The class of salary corresponding with the class and division

in which the teacher is placed is given in the Schedule to the aforementioned regulations.

Attention is drawn to the regulations relating to appeals of teachers against their classification and grading, under which any teacher who considers he has good grounds for objection to his classification may lodge an appeal to reach the Director of Education not later than forty clear days after the publication of this list in the New Zealand Gazette—

arter the publication of this list in the New Zeduna Gazette— *i.e.*, such appeals must reach the Director not later than 18th January, 1938, and must contain an explicit statement of the grounds on which the appeal is based.
Norte.—In the last column of the classification list T.S. stands for "Technical School," E.B. for "Education Board,"
S. of A. for "School of Art," Int. for "Intermediate School (or Department)," and C.S. for "Combined School."
