ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 16th day of February, 1938.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section thirty-one of the Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1928, it is enacted that the Governor-General, at the request of the Board of any Rabbit District, may by Order in Council alter and redefine the boundaries of its district:

And whereas the district known as the Otorohanga Rabbit District has been constituted under and for the purposes of the said Act:

And whereas the Board of the said district has, pursuant to the said section thirty-one of the said Act, requested that the boundaries of its district be altered and redefined by including an additional area therein:

And whereas the consent of a majority of the persons in such additional area qualified to be enrolled on the ratepayers' list for the said district has been given to the inclusion of such additional area in the said district:

And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter and redefine the boundaries of the said district accordingly :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby—

1. Alter and redefine the boundaries of the said district so constituted as aforesaid ;
2. Declare that the boundaries of the said district shall be those set forth in the Schedule hereto ; and, further
3. Declare that this Order in Council shall come into force on the day following publication hereof in the *Gazette*.

PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby grant to Graham Brothers, Limited, being a company duly incorporated under the Companies Act, 1933, having its registered office at Waiho (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee"), a license, subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth, to obstruct, impound, or divert the waters of the Atupau River situated in Block XII, Waiho Survey District, in the Land District of Westland, and to take and use therefrom for the purposes hereinafter set forth a stream of water not exceeding twenty cubic feet per second at any one time, and to lay, construct, put up, place, and use the electric lines hereinafter described, also such further lines as may be necessary for the supplying of electricity within the area of supply hereinafter defined.

5. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined, continue in force until the 31st day of March, 1958.

6. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraphs (a) and (f) of clause 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935. The generating voltage shall be 400 volts and transmission voltage shall be approximately 11,000 volts alternating current between phases.

7. CHARGES ON SALE.

Maximum Charges.

(1) The licensee is authorized to make a maximum charge as follows for electrical energy distributed under the authority of the license:—

- (a) In respect of each house or shop supplied, a sum not exceeding 7s. 6d. per month.
- (b) In respect of each shop with living quarters attached, a sum not exceeding 10s. per month.
- (c) In respect of other consumers, such sum as may be agreed upon, or alternatively, in the event of meters being installed, the maximum charge shall not exceed the sum of 1s. per unit for lighting purposes, and 6d. per unit for other purposes.

Intervals of Payments.

(2) Payment shall not be demanded from any consumer at intervals apart of less than twenty-one days.

8. RENTAL.

For the purpose of assessing the rental or annual sum payable in respect of the license, the licensee may install a suitable maximum-demand indicator to the satisfaction of the Inspecting Engineer of the Public Works Department

or, failing such installation, the rental shall be determined on the maximum capacity of the generating plant installed. The rental shall be determined pursuant to clauses B and C of Regulation 6 of the Water-power Regulations, 1934. In addition to the amount so determined annually, there shall be added the sum of 10s. to be credited to the Miscellaneous Rents Account in Consolidated Fund, and the residue to the Electrical Supply Account. The rating of the generator at present installed is 150 kilowatts.

9. MAINTENANCE OF WORKS.

The licensee shall maintain the works used under this license in proper working order during the continuance of such license; the headworks and pipe-lines shall be so constructed and at all times maintained by the licensee so that no damage or disfigurement shall be done to or suffered by the scenic reserve.

10. PROTECTION OF BIRDS AND WILD ANIMAL LIFE.

The licensee or its assigns shall not do or permit any of their servants, agents, or workmen to do anything in pursuance of this license which may cause the destruction of birds or of any form of wild animal life.

11. TREES NOT TO BE FELLED OR BRANCHES REMOVED EXCEPT BY CONSENT.

No trees shall be felled or branches removed in connection with the construction or maintenance of any works (including transmission-lines) without the prior consent in writing of the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the district being first had and obtained, and the Commissioner may in granting such consent impose such conditions as he may consider necessary.

12. LICENSEE SHALL PROTECT BUSH AND TREES FROM FIRE.

The licensee shall take all reasonable precautions to protect the bush and trees on the scenic reserve from fire.

Electrical energy at a pressure of 11,000 volts shall be received in bulk from the Public Works Department.

The primary-distribution voltage shall be 11,000 volts between phases. The secondary-distribution voltage shall be approximately 400 volts between phases and 230 volts between any phase and neutral.

3. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force until the 29th day of October, 1950. HIS Excellency the Governor-General in Council has been pleased to approve of the following new rules of the Wellington Stock Exchange.

INTERPRETATIONS.

THE marginal notes hereto shall not affect the construction hereof.

“Stock Exchange Association” or “Association” means the Stock Exchange Association of New Zealand.

“The Exchange” means the Wellington Stock Exchange.

“In writing” or “written” includes printing, lithography, typewriting, and other methods of representing or producing words in a visible form.

“Month” means a calendar month.

Words importing the singular number include the plural number also and *vice versa*.

Words importing persons include firms and corporations.

“Committee” means the Committee of the Wellington Stock Exchange saving only where in these rules a contrary intention appears.

“Member” means a member of the Wellington Stock Exchange and includes country member save where in these rules a contrary intention appears.

CONSTITUTION.

1. The Wellington Stock Exchange (hereinafter called the “Exchange”) shall consist of members engaged in the purchase or sale of stock, shares, debentures, bonds, mines, and mining interests, the negotiation of mortgages, and other similar monetary transactions.

2. No member or his partner shall be a member of any other Stock Exchange.

3. No member other than a country member or any partner of such member shall engage or be concerned or employed in any business other than that of member of the Exchange as defined in these rules, except such business as is reasonably incidental thereto: Provided always that a member who within thirty days of the delivery to him of a copy of this rule satisfies the committee that prior to the 1st day of November, 1937, he has either alone or in partnership regularly carried on other business shall be entitled to continue carrying on such other business; but this privilege shall not attach to the member's seat or enure for the benefit of any purchaser or of successor to such member's seat.

4. A member shall not be deemed to be engaged or employed in other business by reason of his being a trustee of an estate or a shareholder in or a director of a company engaged, carrying on, or concerned in other business or by reason of his acting as attorney.

5. A member may act as interim secretary of any company, the prospectus of which has been passed by a Stock Exchange affiliated to the Stock Exchange Association of New Zealand, but he must resign such position within three months of the statutory meeting of such company.

6. No member or firm shall have more than one place of business, and such place of business shall be within the City of Wellington.

7. As from the 1st day of November, 1937, no member other than a country member shall enter into partnership with any person who is not a member: Provided always that a member who within thirty days of the delivery to him of a copy of this rule satisfies the committee that he has carried on the business of stock and share broker in partnership with another or others shall be entitled to continue his existing partnership if such member procures from each of his non-member partners within one month an undertaking to be bound in all respects by these rules as if a member, and to agree that his partnership with his member partner will be forthwith dissolved if demanded by the Exchange in any case in which the Exchange could under these rules expel him from membership had he been a member: but this privilege shall not attach to the member's seat or enure for the benefit of any purchaser or of successor to such member's seat, and shall cease and determine upon the member's partner failing to dissolve the partnership if demanded as aforesaid by the Exchange: And, provided further, that a member may hereafter enter into partnership with a son or sons if and only if such son or sons have first been proposed for the approval of the Exchange

and have been approved by ballot in the manner provided by Rules 47 to 51 inclusive as though they were candidates for admission to membership, and such son or sons have signed an undertaking to be bound in all respects by these rules as if members and to agree that their partnerships will be forthwith dissolved if demanded by the Exchange in any case in which the Exchange could under these rules expel them from membership had they been members.

8. Nothing in the foregoing rule contained shall give a non-member partner any voice in the management of the Exchange or a right to attend, speak, or vote at any meeting of members.

OBJECTS.

9. The objects and purposes of the Exchange are to provide, regulate, and maintain a suitable building, room, or rooms in Wellington for the promotion and facilitation of dealings in stocks, shares, and monetary transactions; to establish just and equitable principles in the transaction of business; to adjust controversies between members; and to maintain uniformity in its rules and usages.

NUMBER OF MEMBERS.

10. The number of members shall be limited to forty, exclusive of country members, or to such other number as may from time to time be determined by the members.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT,

11. The management of the Wellington Stock Exchange shall be vested in a committee of five members, comprising the chairman and the vice-chairman, who shall be members of the committee *ex officio*, and three other members elected in the manner hereinafter provided; and such committee shall (subject to these rules) have the direction and control of the affairs of the Exchange.

12. The office-bearers of the Wellington Stock Exchange shall be the chairman, the vice-chairman, and the three other members of the committee.

13. The office-bearers shall be elected at each annual general meeting in the manner hereinafter provided, and shall hold office until the next annual general meeting, when they shall retire.

14. Retiring office-bearers shall be eligible for re-election without nomination, but all other candidates must be nominated in writing by one member and seconded by another, and such nomination must bear the written consent of the nominee and be handed to the secretary at least seven days before the day fixed for the annual meeting.

15. Should an election be necessary, such election shall be by ballot, and, in the case of the three members to be elected to the committee, any voting-paper recording a vote for less names than the required number shall be informal and shall not count.

16. No member of the committee shall in such capacity speak or vote at any meeting on any matter or charge in which he is personally interested or concerned.

17. No member of the committee shall, if a charge affecting himself or his firm has been made, take part in any of its meetings pending the investigation and disposal of such charge.

18. The surviving or continuing members on the Committee, notwithstanding any vacancy in their number, may act pending the filling of such vacancy.

19. At meetings of the committee all questions shall be decided by a majority of the members present, subject to the provision of Rule 26.

20. The quorum for meetings of the committee shall be three (3).

SECRETARY.

21. The committee shall appoint a secretary who shall keep the books of account, take and keep minutes of all meetings, and generally carry out such other duties as directed by the committee. All employees shall be appointed by, and be under the control of, the committee. The committee shall have full power of dismissal of any employee, and the secretary shall have power to suspend any employee and report thereon to the committee.

22. In the absence of the secretary from any meeting, the chairman shall appoint a member or an officer of the Exchange to carry out the duties of the secretary at such meeting.

TREASURER.

23. The secretary shall keep the accounts and act as treasurer, and shall have the custody of all books and papers. He shall present at each annual general meeting a statement of the finances of the Exchange to the end of the previous year, duly audited by the member appointed by the members for that purpose.

CHAIRMAN.

24. The chairman or, in his absence, the vice-chairman or, in his absence a member of the committee, shall preside at the meetings of the Exchange and of the committee, and, in the event of there being no office-bearers present, the members present shall elect a chairman for such meeting: Provided always that the chairman, though present, may request the vice-chairman or any other member to act as chairman, and thereupon the vice-chairman or other member may act as chairman at such meeting.

25. The chairman of any meeting shall have full control thereof, and shall regulate the order and manner in which the business shall be conducted. The decision of the chairman shall be final in all cases submitted to him. The chairman shall have power to inflict a fine, not exceeding £5, on any member or members who, in his opinion, obstructs the business of the meeting, disobeys any ruling of the chairman, or is guilty of any breach of etiquette.

CASTING VOTE.

26. The chairman shall have a second or casting vote at any meeting in the event of the voting being equally divided.

OFFICIAL VACANCY.

27. Any extraordinary vacancy in the office of chairman, vice-chairman, or committeeman occurring during the year shall be filled by election from nominations made at a special general meeting of members to be summoned by the committee for that purpose without unnecessary delay. The election shall be by ballot if necessary. It shall be competent for such meeting to fill any further vacancy in the office-bearers that may be caused by the filling of the initial vacancy or vacancies such meeting was summoned to fill.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING AND SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING.

28. The financial year of the Exchange shall close on the 31st day of October in each year. A general meeting of members shall be held annually not later than the 31st day of January, at which the business shall be to receive from the treasurer a balance-sheet showing the financial position of the Exchange, to elect a committee and officers for the ensuing year, and any other business that may in accordance with these rules be dealt with.

29. The committee shall fix the date of the annual meeting, and shall give members fourteen days' notice thereof.

30. At any annual general meeting, after the business herein provided for shall have been disposed of, it shall be competent for any member to bring under the notice of the meeting any business or matter within the objects or purposes of the Exchange, and give notice of any motion relating thereto he proposes to move at a future general meeting. Any motion of which notice has been given in the manner aforesaid shall be dealt with at the next general meeting of members.

31. A special general meeting may be called by the committee at any time.

32. A special general meeting shall be called by the committee upon the receipt of a requisition addressed to the secretary, requesting it to do so, signed by at least five members, and stating the business for which such meeting is required; and, if the same shall not be convened within seven days from the time of such requisition being so left with the secretary, the requisitionists or any five members may themselves convene a meeting by giving the required notice at an official meeting.

33. A special general meeting shall be convened by notice to members as follows: A notice specifying the place, day, and hour of the meeting, and the general nature of the business to be considered shall be posted by the secretary on the official notice board, and a copy of such notice shall be posted to each member at least forty-eight hours before the time at which the meeting is to be held, and the contents of the said notice shall, before such time as aforesaid, be announced at an official meeting by the chairman, acting-chairman, or secretary.

34. No other business shall be transacted at a special general meeting except that stated in the announcement or notice convening the meeting, and no resolution shall be passed or other business transacted which is not included within the objects and purposes for which the meeting is convened. No amendment not directly pertinent thereto shall be allowed upon any resolution contained in the notice convening any such meeting.

35. Any general meeting shall have power to adjourn from time to time as may be found necessary. Whenever an adjournment has been decided on, notice of the date of the adjourned meeting shall be given in such manner as may be determined by the chairman of the meeting adjourning. No business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting so adjourned.

36. Every member shall have one vote, and all questions shall be decided by a majority of the members present and voting. Voting by proxy shall not be permitted.

37. The quorum for general or special general meetings of members shall be one-half of the members of the Exchange. In the event of there not being a quorum present at the time appointed for any meeting, the chairman or, in his absence, the vice-chairman or, in his absence, any other office-bearer or, in the absence of all the office-bearers, the secretary, may adjourn such meeting to such day and time within the next ensuing seven days as he may determine. Notification of the adjournment of such meeting, stating the date and time to which such meeting is adjourned, shall be forthwith posted by the secretary on the official notice board and a copy posted to each member.

FUNDS.

38. The committee shall have full control over the funds of the Exchange, and shall pay therefrom all current expenses and outgoings, and any other payments authorized by the members in general meeting. All moneys received shall be paid into a bank account, and all accounts, salaries, &c., shall be paid by cheques drawn on such account.

39. The committee may invest any surplus funds in such investments as it may in its absolute discretion think advisable, and shall have full power to sell, call up, and vary any investments.

40. The committee may in its discretion appoint two trustees and vest in the names of such trustees, so long as they remain trustees, any funds or investments, and may revoke the appointment of any trustees at any time and appoint a new trustee to fill a vacancy caused by the death, retirement, or revocation of appointment of any trustee.

41. Cheques drawn upon any funds of the Exchange shall be signed by any two members of the committee and the secretary.

ENTRANCE FEE.

42. An entrance fee, which shall be such sum as the Exchange from time to time determines, shall be paid by all candidates for membership, other than purchasers of seats, at the time of lodging application for admission to membership. In the event of a candidate being rejected, his entrance fee shall be returned to him. A candidate for admission by virtue of the purchase of a seat shall not be required to pay any entrance fee other than the sum mentioned in Rule 60.

43. The nominal value of a seat on the Exchange shall, until altered by members at a general meeting, be as heretofore determined, but no motion to increase or reduce the nominal value shall be moved at a general meeting unless the member intending to move has first given to the secretary ten clear days' written notice of his motion, and not less than seven days' notice in writing of such motion has been given to members.

Nominal Value
of Seats.

ANNUAL SUBSCRIPTION.

44. An annual subscription of fifteen guineas, or such other sum as may from time to time be determined by the Exchange, shall become due and payable on the 1st day of November in each year and may be paid in two equal instalments, one by the 30th day of November and the other by the 31st day of May. Any member not paying his instalments within the prescribed period shall be charged an additional sum equal to ten per centum of the instalment due, and if such additional sum, together with the instalment due is not paid within one calendar month after the 30th day of November or the 31st day of May, as the case may be, such member shall thereupon be deemed to be suspended from membership until he has paid the instalment and such additional sum. Failing payment of the instalment within six

months of the date on which it first became payable, and of such additional sum as aforesaid, the committee shall have power to direct that the member be given notice in writing that unless within one month after the date of such notice he pays the instalment, together with such additional sum as aforesaid, his name will be struck off the Register of Members. If such member fails to pay the instalment, together with such additional sum as aforesaid, within one month of the date of such notice, his failure so to pay may thereupon be announced by the committee to the members at an official meeting; and upon such announcement being made he will thereupon *ipso facto* cease to be a member and forfeit his seat, which will thereupon become the property of the Exchange. The committee may at its discretion sell and transfer any seat forfeited as aforesaid, subject to the purchaser being duly elected a member. The proceeds of the sale of any forfeited seat shall be applied in the manner so directed by Rule 64.

45. A new member if elected during the first three months of a current half-year shall be required to pay the full half-year's subscription in respect of such half-year, but if elected after the expiration of three months of a current half-year shall be required to pay one-quarter of the annual subscription in respect of such half-year.

46. The membership of a resigning member, from the date of his resignation until the election of his nominee, shall be subject to the same annual subscription as that of existing members during that period.

ELECTION OF MEMBERS.

47. Every candidate for admission to membership must be proposed in the prescribed form by a member and seconded by another member, and his name, occupation, and address, and in the case of country members the names of his partners, if any, shall be submitted to the committee. Every candidate must prove to the satisfaction of the committee that he is a British-born subject or a British subject by naturalization in New Zealand for not less than five years, and that he is able to discharge all his liabilities and make good from his own means deficiencies in any of his transactions to the extent of £1,000 or such larger sum as the committee may determine by resolution, or produce a guarantee to the satisfaction of the committee. The committee may thereupon, and not otherwise, submit the name of a candidate for election by the members. The candidate's name, address, and occupation and the names of his proposer and seconder shall be announced at an official meeting, and posted in the room of the Exchange, at least fourteen days before the day of election, and forthwith a copy of such details shall be posted to every member. The ballot shall be taken at the first call of shares on the day after such fourteen days have expired.

48. Applications for admission to membership except as otherwise provided shall be in the following form:—

49. The candidate shall be elected by the members by ballot. One adverse vote in every five valid votes shall exclude from election. No ballot shall be valid unless one-half of the members actually register valid votes. Proxies shall not be allowed.

50. Should any ballot prove invalid by reason of an insufficient number of valid votes being recorded, another ballot shall be held at a time to be fixed and announced by the chairman within fourteen days.

51. The committee may at any time change the method of taking the ballot, but the provision that one adverse vote in five shall exclude from election must be maintained.

52. No rejected candidate shall be again proposed for election within the space of six months after his rejection.

Members to sign Rules.

53. Every member and country member shall sign a copy of the rules, and he shall not be entitled to the privileges of membership until he has done so.

RIGHTS AND PRIVILEGES OF MEMBERS.

Personal.

54. The rights and privileges of every member shall be personal to himself, and shall not be transferable by operation of law, nor by his own act except as provided in these rules.

Interest in Membership.

55. Every member shall have an interest in his membership, but he shall have no power to, and shall not, encumber or assign the same by way of mortgage; and the Exchange shall have a preferential lien thereon for any debt or debts owing by the said member to the Exchange, or to any member or members thereof.

Transfer of Membership.

56. Any member may propose a candidate for membership in his stead or may submit such a proposal by another member provided he at the time of such proposal lodges with the secretary the resignation of his own membership. In the event of such candidate being rejected, the member may propose or have proposed another candidate until a candidate shall have been elected. Pending the election of a candidate in his stead, the member shall retain his membership and all the privileges thereof; but as soon as a candidate proposed in his stead shall have been elected, the resignation of such member shall take effect.

57. When a member notifies the committee in writing at any time that he desires to dispose of his seat, it shall not be competent for the Exchange to create a new seat until the seat of such member has been disposed of. This rule, however, shall not be binding on the Exchange if the price the member is asking for his seat is more than the nominal value of the seat for the time being as determined by the the members under Rule 43.

Seat of a Deceased Member Transferable.

58. The executors or administrators of any deceased member shall have the same privileges as that possessed by a resigning member of nominating a candidate who may be proposed for membership in the place of the deceased member.

60. On application for transfer of membership, the whole amount of the purchase price shall be lodged with the Exchange. The committee may require from all or any of the parties concerned such evidence as they may deem necessary as to the price paid for the seat. Upon election ten per cent. of the nominal value for the time being of the seat shall be retained by the Exchange, and the balance of the purchase money shall be paid to the transferor. In the event of his rejection the amount of the purchase price paid shall be returned to the proposed transferee.

61. The election of any candidate for admission to membership by virtue of his purchase of a seat from a member, or from the executors or administrators of a deceased member, shall not be proceeded with until all claims which the Exchange or any member or members thereof may have under these rules against the member whose membership has been sold shall have been satisfied.

62. Should any member at the time of resignation from membership, death, or expulsion, be indebted to the Exchange or indebted to any member or members by reason of default in the ordinary course of Stock Exchange business, he shall forfeit his seat to the Exchange, and at any time after the resignation, death, or expulsion of such member who is indebted as aforesaid, the committee may sell and transfer the seat and membership of the said late member subject to the purchaser being duly elected a member. DECEASED OR EX-MEMBERS HAVE NO CLAIMS ON ASSETS.

66. Members who resign or cease to be members from any cause whatever, and the executors or the administrators of any deceased member, shall have no claims on the assets of the Exchange.

DEFAULTERS.

67. The committee shall have the power to fine, suspend from membership, or recommend the expulsion of any member who shall fail to pay when due any debt incurred by him to the Exchange or to the association, or shall make default to any other member of the Exchange, or any member of any other Exchange in the ordinary course of Stock Exchange business. Should the committee decide to recommend the member's expulsion, it shall report accordingly to the members at a special general meeting called for that purpose. It shall be competent for the said special general meeting, provided a special quorum of not less than two thirds of the total number of members are present, to confirm or vary the committee's recommendation and expel such member or deal with him by fine or suspension from membership. The decision of such general meeting shall be taken by ballot. If the special quorum of two-thirds of the total number of members is not present within a reasonable time of the hour appointed for the meeting, the chairman shall adjourn such meeting to such time and day within seven days as he determines. Such notice of the adjourned meeting as the chairman directs shall be given. No member shall be expelled, suspended from membership, or fined, nor shall any of his rights of membership be affected by resolution of the committee unless and until notice in writing specifying the ground of complaint shall have been delivered to such member or posted addressed to his usual or last-known place of business, and such notice shall specify a place, day, and hour not earlier than four hours after the receipt by him of such notice, if given, or four hours after the time such notice would in the ordinary course of post be delivered at his usual or last-known place of business, if posted, at which such member may be heard by the committee or a quorum thereof in his defence; and, if such member shall appear on such notice he shall be heard by the committee in his defence, but, if he fails to appear, the committee may proceed in his absence: Provided, however, that in the case of a country member his defence may be submitted by him in writing.

The fines mentioned herein shall not be less than £5 or more than £100: Provided always that in the case of a continuing offence the fine may be a sum not exceeding £10 for each and every day during which such offence has continued.

68. During the time a member is suspended under these rules or fails to pay a fine inflicted by the Committee of the Exchange within the time fixed by these rules, he shall have no right to attend any of the official meetings nor shall he have during such time any rights or privileges of membership, nor shall a country member have such rights or privileges of membership.

69. A member who becomes bankrupt or insolvent or assigns his estate for the benefit of, or compounds with, his creditors, shall *ipso facto* cease to be a member, but may be reinstated without payment or fee, by ballot taken in the same manner and subject to the same procedure as provided in Rule 49, after he has obtained his discharge from his bankruptcy or becomes solvent or obtains a release from his creditors.

70. The committee shall have power to order that all open transactions, including time-bargains, between any member unable to meet his engagements and other members of this Exchange or any other recognized Stock Exchange or members of the public, shall be closed within a time to be named by the committee.

71. The committee shall have power to investigate the accounts of members with a member in default, and to reject or require the correction of any items which it may deem unsatisfactory.

72. Members, creditors of a member in default, shall have a preferential claim on all surpluses in the hands of other members resulting on the closing of transactions open at the time of default, and also on all moneys which may become payable to a member in default out of funds in the hands of the committee from the estate of another member in default. All surpluses in the hands of members resulting on the closing of open transactions with a member in default shall be paid to the committee.

73. The committee shall distribute as soon as possible amongst members, creditors of the member in default, the surpluses received from other members on his account, and all moneys due to him out of funds in the hands of the committee from the estate of any other member in default.

DISTRIBUTION OF ASSETS OF EX-MEMBERS.

74. The committee in dividing amongst member creditors of a late member, the proceeds received by it on sale of a membership, in the manner set out in Rule 62 or Rule 64, or in dividing any surpluses received by it from members on account of a defaulting member's estate, or in dividing any moneys due to him out of funds in the hands of the committee from the estate of another member in default, shall not necessarily distribute the same *pro rata*, but may, in its discretion give preference, either wholly or in part, to claims of recent date over claims of longer standing which were not divulged to the committee at the time they arose.

Distribution of Assets.

75. Claims on the estate of a resigning, retiring, or deceased member that do not arise from transactions under the rules shall not be recognized by the committee until all claims that have arisen from transactions under the rules shall have been satisfied.

Claims not arising from Transactions.

MEMBER'S ACCREDITED REPRESENTATIVE.

76. The committee, upon application in writing in terms of this rule and Rules 77, 78, 79, 80, and 81, may grant a member permission for his accredited representative to attend the official meetings for the purpose of making quotations and the purchase and sale of shares on behalf of the said member. Such authorized clerk shall be subject to the rules and usages of the Exchange, but shall not have a vote at any meeting, nor any voice in the management of the Exchange. The committee may withdraw the permission at any time.

77. Such authorized clerk so admitted to official meetings shall be deemed to be the agent of the member on whose application he is admitted, and the member shall be responsible for all the transactions of the said representative.

Conditions of Admission.

A member or firm of members desirous of obtaining permission for the admission of an authorized clerk to official meetings shall pay in advance an additional annual subscription of £5 5s. for the financial period from 1st November to 31st October. Should, however, authority be granted after the 1st May the fee payable may be reduced by half.

Application for admission shall be made in the following form :—

78. No authorized clerk of a member shall be eligible for admission unless he be at least twenty-one years of age.

79. A clerk shall not buy or sell time-bargains or deal except in cash transactions unless he shall have written authority to do so from his employer, such authority to be lodged with the chairman, and all his dealings shall be on account of his employer.

80. A member may, by a letter addressed to the secretary, withdraw the authority to his clerk to act, but his responsibility shall continue until such withdrawal shall have been notified to the members at an official meeting.

Members may withdraw Authority given to a Clerk.

(a) No member shall employ any clerk unless such clerk first agrees in writing with the member to observe all the usages of the Exchange, and the letter and spirit of these rules.

(b) If the clerk of any member commits any violation of any usage of the Exchange, or of the letter or spirit of these rules, the committee in addition to any other powers over such member, may at its discretion call upon such member to dismiss such clerk from his employment within such time as the committee thinks fit.

(c) Without the permission of the committee first had and obtained, no member shall at any time hereafter employ a clerk dismissed by any member under the provisions of this rule.

(d) Any member who is called upon under the provisions of this rule to dismiss any clerk and who fails to do so within the time mentioned in the committee's requisition, shall be liable to be dealt with by the committee under the provisions of Rule 94.

81. In the event of a member's illness, absence from town, service on a jury, or other special emergency, the committee or the chairman may grant temporary permission on the application of the member for such period as may be considered necessary under the circumstances for a member's clerk, provided he is twenty-one years of age, to attend calls in his absence. The member shall be bound in all ways as if he had made application under Rule 77.

COUNTRY MEMBERS.

All Partners of a Country Member to be approved.

82. An applicant for country membership shall furnish with his application for membership a written statement setting forth the full names of each and every partner with whom he carries on business. The information contained in such written statement shall be furnished to members of the Exchange before the application is submitted to ballot. All the incoming partners of any firm of which one of the members thereof is a country member of the Exchange shall be proposed for the approval of the Exchange in manner provided in Rules 47 to 51 inclusive, as though he were a candidate for admission to membership, not later than one calendar month after the formation of the partnership. In the event of any partner not being approved of by the Exchange, the country member shall be called upon to dissolve the partnership with the partner disapproved of. If within one calendar month after such disapproval the country member has not dissolved such partnership, he shall be deemed to have retired from the Exchange and the committee shall announce to the members that he has so retired, and his name shall be erased from the list of members. The approval by the Exchange of the members of any such firm shall continue for so long only as the country member through whom they have been so approved remains a country member of the Exchange and their partnership with him whilst he is a country member is undissolved.

Election.

83. The election of a country member shall be carried out in the same manner as prescribed in Rules 49, 50, and 51 in respect to the election of members. The provisions of Rule 52 shall also apply.

Re-election.

85. All country members must apply not later than seven days before the close of the financial year, the 31st day of October, in every year and be re-elected annually. Any application received during the last seven days prior to the 31st of the month of October, shall not be put to the ballot for re-election until a fine of £1 1s. has been paid by such country member. A country member whose application is not in the hands of the secretary before the 1st November shall ipso facto cease to be a country member and must make fresh application for admission to membership and pay the usual entrance fee.

The annual ballot for the re-election of existing country members shall be taken not later than the 14th November. Application form for election must be accompanied by payment of the annual subscription for the coming year.

OFFICIAL MEETINGS.

Time, Place, and Purpose.

86. The official meetings of the Exchange shall be the meetings of members, held at such place and time as the members shall appoint, at which the business shall be to make prices, effect sales, and receive and record quotations of sales, also to do any general business in accordance with these rules.

HOLIDAYS.

87. The official holidays to be observed by all members of the Exchange shall be fixed by the Stock Exchange Association of New Zealand. Special holidays shall not be declared except by the vote of not less than two-thirds of the members present at any official meeting. Notice of intention to take such vote shall if practicable be given by the chairman at a previous meeting. No meeting shall be held on public holidays, unless requested by the members in the same manner as is provided for declaring special holidays.

88. When for any purpose it is decided by members at an official meeting to close their offices for share business all the members of the Exchange shall be bound by such decision, and any member committing a breach of this rule shall be dealt with under Rule 94.

89. No member or accredited representative of a member shall, under penalty of a fine of £5, which shall be paid within twenty-four hours, leave an official meeting without the permission of the chairman of such meeting or of a majority of the members present.

Permission to leave Meeting.

90. If any quotation of sale be challenged, the chairman of the meeting shall, immediately after the call, go together with the member whose quotation is doubted, and shall at such member's office satisfy himself by examination of the books or papers of such member as to the *bona fides* of the quotations, and shall report the result either to the committee in the first instance or direct to the members in official meeting assembled, as to him shall seem fit. Any member refusing an inspection of his books by the chairman shall be treated by the committee as guilty of making a false quotation. Any such offender shall be deemed to be guilty of conduct unworthy of a member, and be dealt with accordingly.

PAYMENT FOR DOCUMENTS DELIVERED.

91. Payment for documents shall be made in accordance with Association Rule 77 except that in addition for local delivery the buyer must be ready to make payment by 2.30 p.m. (and 10.30 a.m. on Saturdays) at his office or in such manner as the committee shall decide upon from time to time.

DISPUTES, APPEALS TO LAW.

92. In disputes between members with reference to stock and share transactions which are brought under the consideration of the committee, the decision of the committee shall be carried out forthwith by the member or members concerned.

Disputes between Members.

93. Every member shall be debarred from appealing to law against any decision of the Stock Exchange or of the Stock Exchange Association of New Zealand.

Appeal to Law debarred.

VIOLATION OF RULES—PENALTIES FOR.

94. The committee shall take cognizance of all violations of these rules, and of the rules of the Stock Exchange Association of New Zealand, whether in letter or spirit, and the committee shall have the power to fine, suspend from membership, or recommend the expulsion of any member found by it to be guilty of such violation, or of failure to comply with any of the Committee's decisions or the decisions of the Stock Exchange Association of New Zealand, or of conduct which in the opinion of the committee is unworthy of a member. Should the committee decide to recommend a member's expulsion it shall report accordingly to the members at a special general meeting called for that purpose. It shall be competent for the said special general meeting, provided a special quorum of not less than two-thirds of the total number of members are present, to confirm or vary the committee's recommendation and expel the offending member, or to deal with him by fine or suspension from membership. The decision of such general meeting shall be taken by ballot. If the special quorum of two-thirds of the total number of members is not present within a reasonable time of the hour appointed for the meeting, the chairman shall adjourn such meeting to such time and day within seven days as he determines. Such notice of the adjourned meeting as the chairman directs shall be given. No member shall be expelled, suspended from membership, or fined, nor shall any of his rights of membership be affected by resolution of the committee unless and until notice in writing specifying the ground of complaint shall have been delivered to such member or posted addressed to his usual or last-known place of business and such notice shall specify a place, day, and hour, not earlier than four hours after the receipt by him of such notice, if given, or four hours after the time such notice would in the ordinary course of post be delivered at his usual or last-known place of business, if posted, at which such member may be heard by the committee or a quorum thereof in his defence; and, if such

95. Any member of the Exchange, who fails to observe or be bound by the terms of any decision or ruling of the committee, or the spirit or intention thereof, relating to the conduct by the members of the Exchange of their business, or to their dealings with one another, or relating to other matters arising out of the objects or purposes of the Exchange, shall be deemed guilty of conduct unworthy of a member, and be dealt with in manner provided by the preceding Rule No. 94.

Fines to be paid
within One Week.

96. If a fine imposed on any member by a special general meeting of members is not paid within seven clear days, the member in default shall thereupon *ipso facto* cease to be a member and shall forfeit his seat, and the committee may announce to the members that he has ceased to be a member of the Exchange, and his name shall thereupon be erased from the list of members.

Restrictions to
Members voting.

97. No member, or his partner or clerk being a member, shall vote at any meeting at which a charge affecting himself is under consideration.

Publication of
Expulsion, &c.

98. The committee for the time being may, in its absolute discretion, and in such manner as it may think fit, notify or cause to be notified to the public that any member has been expelled, or has become a defaulter, or has been suspended, or has ceased to be a member. No action or other proceeding shall under any circumstances be maintainable by the person referred to in such notification against any member or official publishing or circulating the same, and this rule shall operate as leave and authority to any member or official to publish or circulate such notification and be pleadable accordingly.

99. Should a fine be imposed by the committee and not paid within the time fixed by the committee it shall be competent for the committee to refer such failure to a special general meeting, when it shall be competent for such meeting to suspend or expel the member failing to pay the fine.

ALTERATION OF RULES.

Votes required
to alter Rules.

100. These rules shall not be amended, repealed, or added to except by a vote of a majority of the members present at a meeting specially called for that purpose, at which at least two-thirds of the members shall be present.

Procedure.

101. Notice shall be given in writing, addressed to the secretary, of any proposed amendment or repeal of or addition to the rules. A special general meeting of which not less than seven days' notice shall be given shall be called to consider any proposed alteration. The notice calling the meeting may be posted to the last-known business address of a member and shall state the proposed alteration, but the accidental omission to give such notice to any member shall not invalidate any proceedings taken or any resolution passed at such meeting. No amendment shall be entertained, at the meeting which introduces fresh matter, and no proposed amendment or repeal of or addition to these rules, if rejected, shall be proposed again within six months of having been rejected unless three-fourths of the members in general meeting by resolution grant special leave to propose such amendment, repeal, or addition within the said six months of having been rejected.

RULES OF STOCK EXCHANGE ASSOCIATION OF NEW ZEALAND.

Rules of Association
binding on all
Members.

102. The rules of the association shall be binding on all members and shall apply to and govern all dealings by a member whether such dealings are with another member or members of the Exchange or with a member or members of another Exchange affiliated with the Stock Exchange Association of New Zealand.

Rules of Association
prevail.

103. In the case of any conflict between the rules of the Exchange and the rules of the association, the rules of the association shall prevail.

DISSOLUTION.

104. The distribution of the property of the Exchange in the event of its ceasing to exist shall be determined by a special general meeting of the members of the Exchange.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR JANUARY, 1938.

General.—January was a very warm and humid month. Though the rain was very heavy in some parts and above average in most districts there were comparatively few wet days, and in the middle of the month there was almost a fortnight of brilliantly fine weather with little wind. During the latter period some very high temperatures were recorded. As has been characteristic of this summer, the rain has come at very opportune times, and when it did come was generally heavy. In consequence, there is abundance of pasture in most parts of the country. The wheat crop is turning out much better than seemed likely a few months ago, and most other crops are doing very well. Stock are in good condition, and the milk yield has been well maintained. Lambs, though fattening better than earlier in the season, are still, apparently, somewhat on the light side.

Rainfall.—The total rainfall for the month was generally above average. This was especially the case in Taranaki, Hawke's Bay, Wellington, and Canterbury. In North Auckland, the Bay of Plenty area, Nelson, and Marlborough, the departures from normal were not generally large, and excesses and deficits were mingled. In parts of Southland and south-eastern Otago the month was a dry one.

Temperatures.—Mean temperatures were 3 to 5 degrees above normal over the North Island, and mainly from 2 to 3 degrees above over the South Island. In the North Island, the only warmer January hitherto recorded was that of 1935. But for the one cold spell, which set in from the 23rd to the 26th, the means for the month would have been considerably higher. Many high readings were reported, but the atmosphere was generally too humid for records to be broken.

Sunshine.—Sunshine was above average over most of the country, some high totals being recorded in the northern part of the North Island, including 284.8 hours at Tauranga and 283.5 at Hamilton East. Southland had an unusually sunny month for that part, Invercargill reporting 230.1 hours. There was slightly less than the average in Canterbury and Westland.

Pressure Systems.—There were only three disturbed periods during the month. The first was from the 4th to the 5th. A deep westerly depression passed in the south on the 4th, and a shallow one crossed the central portion of the Dominion on the 5th. A somewhat similar sequence of events occurred during the 6th to the 9th, the second depression on this occasion being rather deeper and taking a more southerly course. Except in the north-eastern portion of the North Island, these disturbances each brought almost general rains, with many heavy falls. The rain was very beneficial after the preceding dry and warm spell.

From the 10th to the 21st high pressure and anticyclonic conditions prevailed. The weather was almost continuously fine and very warm.

On the 22nd a depression was approaching from the Tasman Sea. In this a vigorous cyclonic centre developed suddenly on the 23rd and was located to the west of Cook Strait until the evening of the 24th. It was responsible for a brief northerly gale at Auckland on the 24th, but the southerly gales which commenced in the South Island on the 23rd, and, extending northwards, did not finally die out until the 25th, were more severe and some damage was done by them. This storm caused general rain, which was heavy everywhere except in parts of Otago and Southland. Particularly heavy falls were recorded in North Canterbury, Wellington, Taranaki, and Hawke's Bay. Severe flooding occurred in southern Hawke's Bay, where the falls in the low levels were unprecedented. A number of places had over 9 inches in 24 hours, and at Rissington in three days there were 12.15 inches. Fortunately, the rain in the ranges was much lighter, so that the amount of damage done was relatively small.

A slight depression caused some scattered rains on the 29th and 30th, particularly in districts with a westerly aspect. In some places the rain was accompanied by thunder, and thunderstorms were generally of frequent occurrence during the month.
