WHEREAS it is provided by section thirty-one of the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that the creation, abolition, merger, union, division, or other alteration of any constituent district or combined district shall not in itself have any operation so as to affect the then existing membership of a Harbour Board, and that the Governor-General may from time to time, by Order in Council, whenever in his opinion it becomes necessary or expedient so to do, make such provision with respect to the representation of any part of any rating-area or constituent or combined district as he thinks fit :

And whereas it is *inter alia* provided in the First Schedule to the said Act that three members of the Whangarei Harbour Board shall be elected by the electors of the County of Whangarei :

And whereas the Kamo Town District no longer forms part of the County of Whangarei, and it is expedient to make provision for the representation of the said town district :

And whereas it is expedient for the electors of the Hikurangi Town District and of the Kamo Town District to combine for the purpose of electing a representative to the Whangarei Harbour Board :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby order and declare that one member of the Whangarei Harbour Board shall be elected by the electors of the Hikurangi Town District and of the Kamo Town District, in lieu of one member by the electors of the Hikurangi Town District, and doth hereby select and appoint the Hikurangi Town Board to be the principal authority for the purpose of such elections by the electors of the said combined district.

WHEREAS by Order in Council made on the twenty-third day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, consent was given to the raising in New Zealand by the Napier Borough Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority") of the sum of four thousand

requires a different construction), to use and occupy all those parts of the foreshore in Tory Channel, as shown on plan marked M.D. 5773, approved on the eighteenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, for the purpose of reclaiming land as shown on the said plan, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the terms—

“Foreshore” means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides:

“Low-water mark” means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides:

“Minister” means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensee shall pay to the Minister the sum of £1, and thereafter an annual sum of £3 in advance, payable on the 1st day of April in each year, the proportionate part of such rental in respect of the period from the 18th day of February, 1938, until the 31st day of March following to be paid on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all persons in the Government service acting in the execution of their duties, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said reclamation without payment.

5. The licensee shall keep any retaining-wall which the licensee may construct for the purpose of reclaiming the land included in this license in good order and condition, and shall provide and maintain all necessary outlets for storm-water.

6. The licensee shall keep the land included in this license free from noxious weeds.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said reclamation and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last-known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such reclamation requiring the licensee within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensee shall with all reasonable speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulations of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force until the 29th day of March, 1940, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, and the licensee may be required to remove any structures on the reclamation at the licensee's own cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last-known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

11. In case the licensee shall—

- (1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2) Cease to use or occupy the said reclamation for a period of thirty consecutive days;
- (3) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions; or
- (4) Become bankrupt or be in any manner brought under the operation of any Act for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy—

then, and in any of the said cases, this Order in Council and every licensee, right, power, or privilege thereby conferred may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General

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in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee and to all persons concerned or interested that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

12. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the licensee shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove any structures entirely from the site and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and, if the licensee fails so to do, the Minister may cause any structures to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover from the licensee the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration.

13. The occupation of the said reclamation shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the licensee of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

IN pursuance of section 18 of the Surveyors Registration Act, 1928, a certified copy of the names, qualifications, and addresses entered in the Register of Surveyors as at 31st December, 1937, is published for general information. Under the heading of qualifications is shown the section under which the surveyor has been registered.

The sections under which surveyors are registered are as follows:—

“6. (1) Every person shall on payment of the prescribed fee and subject to the provisions of this Act be entitled to be registered under this Act as a surveyor who—

“(a) Obtains a certificate of competency as a surveyor after examination in accordance with the rules of the Board; or

“(b) Holds a recognized certificate as hereinafter defined granted out of New Zealand, and who satisfies the Board that he has had such experience in New Zealand of the duties of a surveyor as may be prescribed by the rules of the Board.

“7. Every person who at the commencement of this Act is registered as a licensed surveyor in accordance with the provisions of the Surveyor's Institute Act, 1908, shall, without payment of any fee, be entitled on application to be registered as a surveyor under this Act and to receive a certificate of registration under the hand of the Registrar.”
