WHEREAS by Order in Council made on the twenty-seventh day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, and subject to the determinations as to and thirty-five, and subject to the determinations as to borrowing and repayment therein set out, consent was given to the raising by the Dunedin Drainage and Sewerage Board (hereinafter called "the said local authority") of the amount of one hundred and fifty thousand pounds (£150,000), being part of certain unexercised loan authorities more particularly set out in the said Order in Council, of which amount the sum of seventy thousand pounds (£70,000) has not yet been raised:
