A PROCLAMATION.

**I**N pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on me by section three of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in that behalf, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby alter the boundaries of the Wairarapa Electric-power District so as to include the area described in the Schedule hereto.

ALL that area situated in the Wellington Land District, and being portion of the Masterton County, bounded by a line commencing at a point situated on the northern boundary of the Wairarapa Electric-power District, as at

WHEREAS it is considered expedient that the name of the harbour known as "Kioreroa," in the County of Whangarei, should be changed to "Port Whangarei":

Now, therefore, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the Designation of Districts Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf do hereby proclaim and declare that the name of the harbour known as "Kioreroa," in the County of Whangarei, shall be and the same is hereby altered to "Port Whangarei," and do assign the last-mentioned name to such harbour accordingly; and also do hereby proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, not being earlier than six months after the first publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

Now, therefore, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto shall be a scenic reserve under the said Act, and subject to the provisions thereof.

## SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Canterbury Land District containing by admeasurement 13,100 acres, more or less, being Reserve No. 4378 (formerly part of Run 233A), situated in Blocks VI, VII, IX, X, XI, XIII, XIV, and XV of the Boyle Survey District, and Blocks II and III of the Skiddaw Survey District, and bounded by lines commencing at a point on the eastern boundary of Reserve 4326 at the confluence of the Lewis and Boyle Rivers; thence north-westerly by that boundary to a point on the Nina River opposite a stream flowing southward into that river approximately 168 chains east of Trig. ## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 23rd day of March, 1938.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the Palmerston North Fire Board (hereinafter called "the said local authority"), being desirous of borrowing the sum of seven hundred pounds (£700) by way of bank overdraft under the provisions of section thirty-one of the Fire Brigades Act, 1926, for the purpose of purchasing a new fire-engine suitably equipped, has complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, as required by the said Act, should be given to the borrowing as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this

behalf, doth hereby consent to the borrowing of moneys by the said local authority by way of bank overdraft up to an amount of seven hundred pounds (£700), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section thirteen of the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand do hereby vest the control of the reserves described in the Schedule hereto (being lands reserved under the said Act) for the period of five years from the date hereof (unless previously altered or revoked under the said Act), in the undermentioned persons, namely,—

The Commissioner of Crown Lands, Blenheim, *ex officio*,  
The Chairman, Kaikoura County Council, *ex officio*,  
The President, Canterbury Automobile Association, *ex officio*,  
Robert Lanktree Withers,  
John Trewin,  
Patrick Curran,  
William Reynolds Carey,  
Hugh Edwin Kennett, and  
James Boyd,

who are hereby constituted for that purpose a special Board by the name of the Hundalee Scenic Reserves Board (herein referred to as "the Board"), in trust, for the preservation of scenery, and with the powers and subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The first meeting of the Board shall be held on Saturday, the second day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, at eleven o'clock a.m., in the Caretaker's cottage, Goose Bay, Kaikoura, and thereafter the Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Saturday in each quarter at the time and place aforesaid, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board.

2. The Commissioner of Crown Lands shall be the chairman of the Board. He may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote.

3. Special meetings may be convened by the chairman, provided that two days' notice of such meeting is given to



each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. Any five members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at the meeting.

6. If at any meeting the chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be chairman for such meeting.

7. If, by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise, the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself, without reasonable cause, from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.

8. The Board may, with the approval of the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation, make such rules as it deems necessary for the good conduct of the public frequenting the reserves, and may set apart areas for camping-grounds or other purposes, and may fix reasonable charges for the use thereof in accordance with a scale to be approved from time to time by the Minister.

9. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

10. The Board shall control the said reserves in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and of the regulations made thereunder.

2. The present division of the County of Akitio into five ridings is revoked, and in lieu thereof the said county shall be divided into six ridings, to be called respectively Akitio Riding, Rakaunui Riding, Pongaroa Riding, Mataikona Riding, Waihi North Riding, and Waihi South Riding.

3. The said Akitio County Council shall consist of seven members, who shall be elected as follows:—

- (a) The electors of Pongaroa Riding shall elect two councillors;
- (b) The electors of the Akitio Riding, Rakaunui Riding, Mataikona Riding, Waihi North Riding, and Waihi South Riding shall each elect one councillor.

4. The alteration hereby made shall take effect on and after the 1st day of April, 1938.

#### SCHEDULE.

THE existing Waihi Riding shall be divided by a line commencing on the western boundary of the said riding at a point on the Puketoi Ranges 100 chains N.N.E. of the Summit Trig. NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR FEBRUARY, 1938.

General.—The weather in February was tropical as regards both the temperature and the humidity of the atmosphere. The rainfall, also, especially in the North Island, was frequently tropical in intensity and in its erratic distribution. The warm and humid conditions were practically continuous northward from Wellington, and even south of that, the break during the third week brought only partial relief. Considerable damage was done to roads in the North Island by the heavy rain, and in places flooding. Slips were numerous. Fruit crops were damaged by the gale of the 4th in the north, while the humidity has been unfavourable to stone fruits. For apples it is a very good season. Except in Otago and Southland, parts of which are still suffering from a severe drought, there is abundant growth of pasture, and stock are doing well. The damp conditions are, however, congenial for insects and fungus pests, and considerable trouble is likely to be experienced from these. Potatoes and tomatoes have already suffered severely in places.

Rainfall.—The rainfall was much above average from Nelson and Marlborough northwards. The departures were fairly moderate in Taranaki and the Manawatu, but generally from twice to three times the average was recorded. Very dry weather persisted in most of Otago and Southland, large areas having less than half the normal rainfall. In the remainder of the South Island conditions varied considerably, some parts having more and some less than the average. Some extraordinarily heavy rains occurred on the 4th and again on the 16th to 18th. Most of the very heavy falls were of a rather local character, the amounts varying greatly over short distances. On the whole they were not so heavy on the high as on the low levels. This, though very unusual, was a fortunate circumstance, since otherwise there would have been far more serious flood damage. Waihi had 16.5 inches on the 4th; Matarau (Cape Runaway) 7.50 on the 4th and 5.50 on the 5th; Tolaga Bay had 2.22 inches on the 15th, 2.30 on the 16th, 0.74 on the 17th, and 7.62 on the 18th. Parts of Gisborne had as much as 6 inches on the 18th.

Temperatures.—February was the hottest month hitherto experienced in New Zealand. This is all the more remarkable if one remembers that the atmosphere was very humid, the sky generally cloudy, and the rainfall heavy. From the returns to hand the North Island had a mean temperature 5.8 degrees and the South 5.3 degrees above the normal. The only month in which these departures have been exceeded was December, 1934, when the average for the Dominion was 6.2 degrees. On that occasion, however, a draught was prevailing and there was abundant sunshine. The extreme maxima were not excessively high.

Sunshine.—As already indicated, the amount of sunshine recorded was generally below normal. This was especially the case from Nelson and Marlborough northwards, where the average deficit was something like 50 hours. Parts of the southern interior of Canterbury, and Otago and Southland, had a sunny month. Alexandra reports 239.3 hours and Lake Tekapo 220.1.

Storm Systems.—The month began with an anticyclone covering the South Island and fair weather generally. On the 3rd, however, the wind in the far North freshened from the east. By the 4th a cyclone was centred between Cape Maria van Diemen and Norfolk Island, and easterly gales were blowing in much of the Auckland Province. On the 5th the cyclone filled up. Rain fell over most of the country, with many heavy falls from Nelson and Marlborough northwards, and flooding in the Auckland Province. Considerable damage was done by the gales.

From the 11th to the 14th there was general rain with many heavy falls, due to a series of depressions following closely on one another. From the 12th to the 13th many severe thunderstorms occurred in the North Island.

From the 15th to the 19th pressure continued high to the South and low to the North, while the atmosphere was very humid and unstable. Sudden heavy rains were numerous in the North Island with much flooding, though there was usually no storm centre very near. On the 18th a slight disturbance of an unusual type caused torrential rains between Hawke's Bay and East Cape and heavy falls southward to Cook Strait. Much damage was done by floods and grave loss of life occurred at a workmen's camp in the Wairoa district.

From the 20th the weather improved in the north, but from the 24th to the 27th a series of vigorous depressions were responsible for much rain and some north-westerly gales from Wellington southwards.
