ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 26th day of April, 1938.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Harbours Act, 1923, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby license and permit James Andrews, Thomson Bruce, Joseph Foster, and Thomas Isbister, all of Paremata, as trustees for the fishermen in the district (hereinafter called "the trustees"), to use and occupy all those parts of the foreshore at Paremata, as shown on plan marked M.D. 5820, approved on the eighth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington for the purpose of the use of the site for the cleaning and painting of fishing-boats, such license to be held and enjoyed by the trustees upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the terms—

"Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides:

"Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides:

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the foreshore as shown on plan M.D. 5820.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the trustees shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister an annual rental of 1s. payable on demand.

4. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the 8th day of April, 1938, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the trustees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said site without payment.

6. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the trustees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

7. The trustees shall appoint all officers and servants required for the working and management of the said site.

8. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the trustees

three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last-known address of the trustees in New Zealand.

9. The trustees shall see that no nuisance is caused, and that no fish or fish offal shall remain on or about the said site.

10. In case the trustees shall—

- (1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions herein-before set forth, or any of them;
- (2) Cease to use or occupy the said site for a period of thirty consecutive days;
- (3) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions; or
- (4) Become bankrupt, or be brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy—

then, and in any of the said cases, this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the trustees or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the trustees, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

11. The occupation of the site shall be deemed to be an acceptance by the trustees of the conditions of this Order in Council.

Consenting to the Raising of Part (£35,000) of the Poverty Bay Electric-power Board's Loan of £68,000 and prescribing the Conditions thereof.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 12th day of April, 1938.

Present :

THE RIGHT HON. M. J. SAVAGE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council made on the twenty-seventh day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, consent was given to the raising by the Poverty Bay Electric-power Board (hereinafter called "the said local authority") of the sum of sixty-eight thousand pounds (£68,000) by a loan to be known as "Extensions Loan, 1930" (hereinafter called "the said loan"), of which the sum of thirty thousand pounds (£30,000) has been borrowed :

And whereas by section nine of the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Amendment Act, 1934, the authority conferred by the said Order in Council was revoked, in so far as it had not been exercised, and it is not now lawful or competent for the said local authority to borrow any moneys to which such Order in Council relates except in accordance with the provisions of an Order in Council that may be made under section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 :

And whereas the said local authority is desirous of borrowing a further thirty-five thousand pounds (£35,000), and it is expedient to authorize the said local authority to borrow on the conditions hereinafter mentioned the said sum of thirty-five thousand pounds (£35,000) (hereinafter called "the said sum"), being portion of the moneys to which the said Order in Council relates :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, and by section nine of the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Amendment Act, 1934, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the borrowing by the said local authority of the said sum of thirty-five thousand pounds (£35,000) for the purpose for which the said loan was authorized, and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows :—

- (1) The term for which the said sum or any part thereof may be raised shall not exceed ten (10) years.
- (2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said sum or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum per annum.

(3) The said sum, together with interest thereon, shall be repaid as follows :—

(a) By twenty equal payments of one thousand two hundred and twenty-four pounds and sixpence (£1,224 0s. 6d.), one of such payments to be made at the end of every half-year commencing from the date on which the said sum is borrowed. Each such half-yearly payment shall be applied firstly in payment of interest computed at the rate of three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum per annum on the amount of the principal for the time being outstanding at the beginning of each such half-year, and the balance of such half-yearly payment in reduction of such principal.

(b) By a payment at the end of the tenth year from the date of the borrowing of the said sum of a sum equal to the amount to which the principal has been reduced in accordance with the preceding paragraph (a) hereof after payment of the aforesaid twenty (20) half-yearly payments :

(4) The payment of such instalments shall be made in New Zealand and no such instalment shall be paid out of loan-money.

(5) The rate payable for brokerage, underwriting, and procuration fees in respect of the raising of the said sum shall not in the aggregate exceed one-half per centum of any amount raised.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Exhibitions Act, 1910 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize the holding of a public exhibition of works of industry and art, to be conducted by the Auckland Agricultural and Pastoral Association and the Auckland Manufacturers' Association at the Epsom Show Grounds, Auckland, from the fourth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, to the fourteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight (both days inclusive),

and to be known as the Auckland Winter Exhibition, and doth hereby declare the said exhibition to be an exhibition within the meaning of the said Act, and doth hereby suspend, subject, however, to the conditions set out in the Schedule hereto, all the provisions of the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22, the Factories Act, 1921-22, the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and of all awards and industrial agreements in force under the last-named Act, in so far as such provisions relate to the hours of commencing or ceasing work or to the issue of permits for overtime or extended hours, or to holidays or half-holidays, or to the closing of shops to any person, and so far as such provisions relate to hours of work done or business conducted or service carried out in or upon the premises aforesaid during the period aforesaid by or on behalf of the bodies conducting the said exhibition, or by or on behalf of any exhibitor of works of industry or art at the said exhibition, or by any person employed in or about the said exhibition.

SCHEDULE.

1. Eight hours shall constitute a day's work in or about the exhibition and, with the exception set out in clause 2 hereof, such hours shall be worked consecutively.

2. No person shall be employed in or about the exhibition for more than four hours without an interval of at least three-quarters of an hour for a meal.

3. Any person employed during any day in or about the exhibition who is employed on such day in excess of eight hours, or before the hour of 8 a.m., or after the hour of 10.30 p.m. (whether such excess employment is in or about the exhibition or otherwise), shall be paid for such excess employment at not less than one-half as much again as the ordinary rate for the first two hours and at not less than twice the ordinary rate thereafter, and any person employed in or about the exhibition on any day that would, but for the provisions of this Order in Council, have been a whole holiday for such person by virtue of any Act or of any award or industrial agreement, shall be paid for all work done on such day at not less than twice the ordinary rate, whether such work is performed wholly in or about the exhibition or otherwise.

4. No male under eighteen years of age and no female shall be employed in or about the exhibition after the hour of 10.30 p.m.

5. For the purposes of the enforcement of an award or industrial agreement any provision of which has been suspended by this Order in Council any officer of the industrial union or association concerned who is authorized in writing in that behalf by such union or association shall be entitled to interview at his place of employment any person employed in or about the exhibition under that award or industrial agreement, at such time or times as may be agreed upon by and between such officer and the employer of such person, and for this purpose any such officer shall be entitled at any reasonable time to have access to the Register of Passes issued by the Auckland Winter Exhibition Executive.

6. Nothing in this Order in Council shall be deemed to affect any provisions in an award or industrial agreement requiring workers subject to such award or industrial agreement to be members of a union.

3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. Any four members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at the meeting.

6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be chairman for such meeting.

7. If by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise, the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself, without reasonable cause, from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.

8. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. And whereas the said 4.856 per centum per annum is made up of an annual charge of 4½ per centum per annum for interest at the rate aforesaid, and 0.606 per centum per annum for the repayment of the said sum of £205,000 :

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers vested in me in that behalf by section 6 of the Rangitaiki Land Drainage Act, 1910, and section 11 of the Finance Act (No. 2), 1937, and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, Frank Langstone, Minister of Lands, do hereby make and levy special rates on the unimproved value of all land within the district constituted under the said Rangitaiki Land Drainage Act, 1910, on a graduated scale according to the classification of such land made in accordance with section 6 of the Rangitaiki Land Drainage Act, 1910, being the graduated scale as set out in the Schedule hereto :

And I declare that the foregoing special rates shall be annually recurring rates, and may be levied year by year without further proceeding by the Minister until the moneys in respect of which they were made are paid off, and shall, in respect of the financial year ending on the 31st March, 1938, be payable on the 16th day of May, 1938, and shall in respect of every future financial year be payable on the 30th day of August in such year :

And I further declare that the said special rates shall be payable at the office of the Collector of Rates, Chief Drainage Engineer's Office, Room 45, Government Buildings, Customs Street West, Auckland, at which office the rate-book may be inspected. A copy of the rate-book may be inspected at the office of the Chief Drainage Engineer, at Thornton, near Whakatane.
