N pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section twenty-five of the Naval Defence Act, 1913, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby amend and supplement the regulations referred to in the Schedule hereto as shown therein.

## Article 51: Cancel, and substitute:

51. Entry of Recruits, Engagements, Re-engagements, &c.—Candidates for entry must be the sons of British-born subjects. They will normally be required to engage for a period of twelve years from date of entry, or, if under the age of eighteen years, until that age is reached and for twelve years thereafter.

2. Subject to the proviso that the candidate is not more than one month older than the maximum age-limit on the date when final entry would be effected, the date of application for entry shall be taken in deciding the age qualification of a candidate who would otherwise be too old for entry if this were determined from the date of actual engagement. In such cases, particularly, every effort should be made to reduce the time taken to effect final entry to an absolute minimum.

3. All candidates for entry will be required to be of the physical standard laid down from time to time for the various classes of ratings, and to pass the prescribed medical and, if so ordered, educational examination. Director of Recruiting is authorized finally to enter or reject candidates who have already been provisionally entered.

4. Ratings may be permitted, at the discretion of the Naval Board, to re-engage for further periods of five years each, but in certain cases the Board may authorize shorter periods of re-engagement.

5. Subject to requirements and suitability for further service, ratings may normally be permitted to re-engage when within two years of completing their current engagements. In normal circumstances re-engagements should be effected for the unexpired portion of the current engagement plus a period of five years or such lesser period as may be authorized, but see clause 6 below.

6. Ratings selected for the purpose of qualifying abroad for officer rank will be required to re-engage to serve for a period of five years from the anticipated date of completion of the course.

7. Ratings will not be selected for the purpose of qualifying abroad for higher substantive or non-substantive rating unless the conditions of re-engagement as prescribed hereunder are satisfied:

(a) Ratings qualifying for Mechanician, Observer's Mate, and Air Gunner will be required to re-engage to serve for a period of five years from

the date of expiration of their first twelve years' engagement.

(b) Ratings qualifying for Gunner's Mate, Torpedo Gunner's Mate, V/S 1

and W/T 1, will be required to re-engage to serve for a period of five years from the anticipated date of completion of the course. (c) Ratings qualifying abroad in all other substantive or non-substantive rates will be required to re-engage to serve for a period of three

years from the anticipated date of completion of the course. Note.—Where any rating is under orders to serve in the Royal Navy for a period to gain experience after he has qualified for higher substantive or non-substantive rate, this period of service is to be regarded as part of a qualifying course for purposes of

8. Applications for courses are not to be made until it has been verified that the conditions of the preceding paragraphs are satisfied.

9. Ratings shall be compulsorily retired at the following age -viz., Chief and Petty Officers, fifty years; other ratings, forty-five years. S bject to the foregoing, ratings will generally be compulsorily retired after twentytwo years man's service, but the Naval Board may from time to time call for applications from ratings who are qualified by age to re-engage for periods of three or five years after completing twenty-two years' service. No applications are to be forwarded unless steps are taken by the Board to call for them.

Article 55: Cancel clause 2, and substitute:-

2. Boys are not to be entered under the age of fifteen years and three months, or over the age of sixteen years and three months, except in very special circumstances with the approval of the Director of Naval Recruiting, and then only when within one month of these age-limits. 3. Full particulars of the unit and rank in the case of Territorials, and of division and rating in case of Reserve personnel, who reply in the affirmative, and whom it is desired to enter, are to be reported to the Naval Secretary by the Director of Recruiting.

4. Final entry is not to be effected until notification has been received from the Naval Secretary to the effect that the Defence Department or the Naval Board, as the case may be, have authorized the release of the individuals concerned from their existing obligations.

### Article 60: Cancel, and substitute:

Such men are to be regarded as re-engaging under Article 51, and should be required to execute engagements for five years, unless they are willing and eligible to enter for the full period of twelve years, but the authority of the Naval Board is to be sought in every instance before the entry or re-entry is effected.
- 3. Ratings who may be accepted for permanent transfer from the Royal Navy or Dominion Navy will retain their former rating and seniority in the New Zealand Division for the purpose of full pay, but for advancement purposes their original roster positions will be adjusted so as to ensure that their transfer does not act to the detriment of New Zealand ratings entered prior to the date of transfer.
- 4. Royal Naval ratings serving in the New Zealand Division on loan or "interchange" service will be retained on the advancement rosters of their port divisions and will be advanced from their depots in the ordinary course on reaching their turn if qualified and recommended. Promotion to Commissioned Rank in the Accountant Branch.—Ratings of the Writer and Supply Branches of the New Zealand Division of the Royal Navy will be eligible to be considered for promotion to commissioned rank in the Accountant Branch of the New Zealand Division under the following conditions.
- 2. Candidates who are specially recommended may be permitted to take the examination for warrant rank (King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions, Appendix XII, Part 9, Section IV) at any time after completing three years' service (including time under training), and provided they have obtained a first-class certificate in the Higher Educational Test

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examinations in general knowledge, English history, and geography (taken at one sitting), and are under twenty-five years of age and unmarried. The rule contained in paragraph 2 of Articles 318 and 319 of King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions that Writer and Supply ratings must have seven years' service before taking the examination for warrant rank will be waived, but only for candidates who are specially recommended for commissioned rank and who have passed the Higher Educational Test in the subjects mentioned above (first-class certificate).

3. The names of candidates who have passed the examination for warrant rank under the conditions set out in the preceding clause will be noted in Navy Office. The Naval Board will appoint a Selection Committee in October or November each year to interview all candidates who are still specially

recommended.

4. On receipt of the report of the Selection Committee the Naval Board may promote a candidate, or candidates, to the rank of Acting Warrant Writer or Acting Warrant Supply Officer. All candidates promoted to warrant rank will be appointed to H.M.S. "Philomel" for general duties under the Accountant Officer for not less than six months.

- 5. Acting Warrant Writers or Acting Warrant Supply Officers promoted under this scheme will remain in the acting rank until they are promoted to the rank of Paymaster Sub-Lieutenant—i.e., they will not be confirmed as warrant officers after a year's service in that rank. After serving a year in the rank of acting warrant officer, and provided the candidate is still recommended for commissioned rank, an application may be forwarded to take the examination for the rank of Paymaster Sub-Lieutenant, which will be as laid down in King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions, Appendix XII, Part 9, Section 1, except papers (g) and (h). Paper (a) will not be taken by Writer candidates; paper (d) will not be taken by Supply candidates.
- 6. Should any acting warrant officer promoted under this scheme fail to sit for the examinations provided for in paragraph 5, or should he fail twice in these examinations, he will be placed on the retired list of the New Zealand Division after three years' service in that rank.

7. Candidates who are successful in passing the examinations provided for in paragraph 5 will be promoted to the rank of Paymaster Sub-Lieutenant

as from the date of taking the examination.

8. Officers promoted to the rank of Paymaster Sub-Lieutenant under this scheme will be eligible for promotion to Paymaster Lieutenant after six months' service as Paymaster Sub-Lieutenant, provided they are recommended by their commanding officers.

9. Paymaster Lieutenants promoted under this scheme will be eligible to sit for the professional examination for Paymaster Lieutenant Commander under King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions, Appendix XII, Part 9, Section II, and, if successful, will be eligible for promotion to that rank after six years' service as Paymaster Lieutenants.

10. Subsequent promotion to higher ranks will be governed by the rules in force in the Royal Navy.

The above rates cover not only the contribution towards service retired pay or pension, but also full liability under Royal Naval Regulations for disability retired pay, pension or gratuity, and widows', children's, or other dependants' pensions, &c., payable in respect of disability or death directly attributable to the conditions of service under the New Zealand Government.

(Note.—The above does not apply to re-employed retired officers or to pensioner ratings serving on non-continuous service engagements. In these cases no pensions contributions are payable to the Admiralty, and the New Zealand Government are liable for compensation in respect of disablement or death attributable to the conditions of service under the New Zealand Government, but in no case shall the pension, gratuity, or allowance awarded and paid to such officer or man, or to his widow and/or children, be less than would be payable were such officer or man serving in the Royal Navy proper at the time of the occurrence calling for the award of a pension, gratuity, or allowance.)

## Register of Engineers.

Office of the Minister of Public Works, Wellington, 16th May, 1938.

N pursuance of section 13 of the Engineers Registration Act, 1924, a certified copy of the names, qualifications, and addresses entered in the Register of Engineers, as at 31st March, 1938, is published for general information.

Under the leading of "Qualifications" is shown the particular clause of section 6 of the Act under which the applicant is been registered. been registered.

Section 6 of the Act is as follows:—
"6. (1) Every person shall, on payment of the prescribed fee, be entitled to be registered under this Act as an engineer who-"(a) Holds some recognized certificate as hereinafter defined, and who satisfies the Board that he has had not less

than three years' practical experience in engineering; or

"(b) Has attained the age of twenty-five years, and has been engaged during a period of not less than six years before
the commencement of this Act in the acquisition of professional knowledge or in the practice of engineering in a manner satisfactory to the Board, and who makes application for registration within twelve months after the commencement of this Act; or

the commencement of this Act; or

"(c) Passes or has passed an examination or examinations approved by the Board, and who satisfies the Board that he has had not less than three years' practical experience in engineering.

"(2) For the purposes of this section the term 'recognized certificate' means a certificate, diploma, degree, or license granted by some university, college, or other public institution (whether in New Zealand or elsewhere), and which is recognized by the Board as furnishing sufficient evidence of the possession of the requisite knowledge and skill for the efficient practice of the profession of engineering."

In 1928 an amendment to the Act was passed.

Subsection (1) of section 2 of the amendment reads as follows:—

"2. (1) In addition to the classes of persons entitled to be registered as engineers under the principal Act any person may on payment of the prescribed fee be registered as an engineer who, being registered at the date of the passing of the principal Act as a licensed surveyor under the Surveyors' Institute and Board of Examiners Act, 1908, satisfies the Board that he had prior to the coming into operation of the principal Act substantial practical experience in engineering as part of his practice or employment, whether on his own account or otherwise howsoever, and who makes application for registration within six months after the passing of this Act."

Applicants who have qualified for registration under the 1928 amendment are shown accordingly, under the heading of "Qualifications."

#### CAMBRIDGE TROTTING CLUB.

#### REGULATIONS

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Cambridge Trotting Club, a trotting club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said Club"), doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the racecourse situated in the district of Waikato and known as the Claudelands Racecourse while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. These regulations shall come into force on the date of the same being published in the New Zealand Gazette.

2. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms respectively by section 2 of the Gaming Act,

3. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely:—

(a) Bookmakers.
(b) Bookmakers' clerks, bookmakers' assistants, and book-

(c) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association.
(d) Common prestitutes and persons who habitally con-

(d) Common prostitutes and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful

visible means of support.

visible means of support.

(e) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues, and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908. Provided always that the Executive Committee appointed by the New Zealand Trotting Conference, upon being satisfied by evidence as to character and otherwise that any person who, by reason of any conviction, comes within the scope of this regulation, should have relief from the effect thereof, may grant exemption to any such person, and may at any

may grant exemption to any such person, and may at any time revoke any such exemption without notice to such

person, and without assigning any reason for such revocation.
