WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, and published in *Gazette* of the thirty-first day of that month, a road traversing Native land in Block XVI, Mangatu Survey District, was proclaimed as a public road pursuant to section four hundred and eighty-seven of the Native Land Act, 1931:

And whereas an error was made in the description of the said road in the Schedule to the Proclamation hereinbefore referred to, and it is desirable that the said Schedule should be amended:

Now, therefore, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section four hundred and eighty-seven of the Native Land Act, 1931, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, do hereby amend the Proclamation dated the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, hereinbefore referred to, by omitting from the Schedule thereto the words "Whatatutu 2c 4 Block," and by substituting therefor the words "Whatatutu 2c Block."

And whereas the fee-simple of the land described in the Schedule hereto (being land heretofore held on renewable lease tenure) has been acquired, and it is expedient that the said land should cease to be national-endowment land:

Altering the Boundaries of the Otago and the Southland Land, Registration, and Land Registration Districts.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 7th day of June, 1938.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by subsection two (d) of section twenty-nine of the Land Act, 1924, subsection one of section four of the Deeds Registration Act, 1908, and subsection two of section three of the Land Transfer Act, 1915, it is enacted that the Governor-General, by Order in Council, may from time to time alter the boundaries of any land district, registration district, and land registration district respectively:

And whereas it is desirable to alter the boundaries of the districts described in the Schedules hereto:

Now, therefore, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the hereinbefore-in-part-recited Acts and every other power and authority enabling me in this behalf, do hereby order and declare that from and after the date hereof the boundaries of the Otago Land, Registration, and Land Registration Districts shall be as described in the First Schedule hereto; and the boundaries of the Southland Land, Registration, and Land Registration Districts shall be as described in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

OTAGO LAND, REGISTRATION, AND LAND REGISTRATION DISTRICTS.

ALL that area in the Dominion of New Zealand, bounded towards the north generally by a right line from the northern side of Big Bay to Mount Aspiring; thence by the summit of the Southern Alps to Mount Hopkins; thence by the Canterbury Land District as described in *Gazette* No. 44 of 25th March, 1915, to the mouth of the Waitaki River; thence towards the south-east generally by the ocean to the eastern boundary of the Waikawa Survey District; thence towards the west generally by the Waikawa, and part of Mokoreta Survey Districts to the southern boundary of Run 162; thence by the southern, eastern, and north-eastern boundary generally of that run to the western boundary of Run 258; thence by the western boundary of that run to Section P.R. 6, Block VI, Slopedown Survey District; thence by the south-western boundary of said

Section P.R. 6; thence again by the western and north-western boundaries of Run 258 to the Waipahi River; thence again towards the west generally by parts of Slope-down and Waikaka Survey Districts to the southern boundary of Crichton Park Settlement; thence generally by the southern and eastern boundaries of said settlement to the eastern boundary Waikaka Survey District aforesaid; again towards the west generally by Waikaka, Chatton, and part of Wendon Survey Districts to the southern boundary of Run 175c; thence by the western boundary of Run 175c; thence by the western and north-western boundary of Run 202 to the western boundary of Run 253; thence by the western boundary of Runs 253, 610, 609, 608, 424B, 424D, and 424C; thence towards the south generally by the southern boundaries of Runs 436, 432, and 354B to Lake Wakatipu; thence by the southern and western shores of Lake Wakatipu to the Greenstone River; thence by that river to the south-eastern boundary of Run 431; thence by the southern and western boundaries of Runs 431 and 418; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of Run 418 to the south-eastern corner of the National Park, as set apart by Section 20 of the Reserves and other Lands Disposal Act, 1934; thence by the eastern boundary of said National Park to Cascade Creek; thence towards the south by National Park, as described in *Gazette* No. 55 of 1st August, 1935, to Mount Madeline; thence to Tutoko Peak and the summit of the leading range to Pembroke Peak; thence by the watershed between John o' Groats River and Thurso River to the sea at Stripe Point, about one mile and a half south of the mouth of John o' Groats River; and thence towards the north-west by the ocean to the northern side of Big Bay, the place of commencement: including all the adjacent islands.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

SOUTHLAND LAND, REGISTRATION, AND LAND REGISTRATION DISTRICTS.

ALL that area in the Dominion of New Zealand, bounded towards the north-east generally by the Otago Land, Registration, and Land Registration Districts hereinbefore described from Stripe Point to the sea at the south-eastern corner of Waikawa Survey District; thence towards the south and west generally by the sea to the place of commencement; with all islands adjacent thereto and including Stewart, Solander, Ruapuke, the Snares, Auckland, Enderby, Campbell, Antipodes, and Bounty Islands, and all other islands or islets within the limits of the Dominion which lie south of the forty-seventh parallel of south latitude.

Authorizing Hugh John McGaw, of Purekireki, Farmer, to use Water for the Purpose of generating Electricity and to erect certain Electric Lines

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 7th day of June, 1938.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby grant to Hugh John McGaw, of Purekireki, Farmer (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee"), a license subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth to obstruct, impound, or divert the waters of the Owaka River at a point opposite the northern boundary of Section 8, Block 8, Wairepa Survey District in the Land District of Otago, and to take and use therefrom for the purposes hereinafter set forth a stream of water not exceeding three cubic feet per second at any one time, and to lay, construct, put up, place, and use the electric lines hereinafter described.

CONDITIONS.

1. IMPLIED CONDITIONS.

THE conditions directed to be implied in all licenses by the Water-power Regulations, 1934, and the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935, shall be incorporated in and shall form part of this license, except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

2. LICENSE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.

This license is issued under the Water-power Regulations, 1934, and is subject thereto and to the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935, and the Electrical Wiring Regulations, 1935, and to any regulations made in amplification or amendment thereof or in substitution therefor.

3. UTILIZATION OF WATER AND LOCATION OF HEADWORKS.

Water shall be used under this license solely for the purpose of generating electricity, and shall be taken from the stream at the point opposite the northern boundary of Section 8, Block 8, Wairepa Survey District, indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 98408, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works.

4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS.

The licensee is hereby authorized, subject to the conditions hereof, to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this license, the positions of the said works being indicated on the said plan P.W.D. 98408:—

- Headworks consisting of a dam, intake, and pipelines leading to the water-wheel and power-house hereinafter referred to, giving a static head of approximately 37 feet.
- Tail-race leading from the said water-wheel to the said stream.
- A power-house situated on the licensee's premises in Section 8, Block 8, Wairepa Survey District, with all necessary generating and switching equipment.
- Electric lines leading from the power-house aforesaid across the Clinton-Owaka Road to the licensee's dwelling situated in the said Section 8, Block 8, Wairepa Survey District, all being in the Land District of Otago.

5. DURATION OF LICENSE.

Unless sooner determined, this license shall continue in force until the 31st day of March, 1958, or until a supply of electrical energy is available from an Electric-power Board, or other general public source, whichever is the earlier.

6. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply is classified as being under paragraph (d) of clause 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935. The generating and transmission voltages shall be approximately 230 volts direct current.

7. RENTAL.

For the purpose of assessing the annual rental payable in respect of this license, the licensee may install a suitable maximum-demand indicator to the satisfaction of the Inspecting Engineer of the Public Works Department, and, failing such installation, the rental shall be assessed on the maximum generating capacity of the plant installed. The present plant is rated at 8 kilowatts, and falls within the class described in paragraph (c) of subclause (B) of clause (1) of Regulation 6 of the Water-power Regulations, 1934.

Licensing Edward Mizen to use and occupy a Part of the Foreshore at Mercury Island as a Site for a Cattle-race.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 1st day of June, 1938.

THE RIGHT HON. M. J. SAVAGE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Harbours Act, 1923, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby license and permit Edward Mizen, of Mercury Island (hereinafter called "the licensee" which term shall include his executors, administrators, and assigns unless the context requires a different construction), to use and occupy all that part of the foreshore at Mercury Island, shown on plan marked M.D. 5821, approved on the thirteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, for the purpose of the use of the cattle-race as shown on the said plan for a term of fourteen years computed from the thirteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the terms—

“Foreshore” means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides :

“Low-water mark” means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides :

“Minister” means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore occupied by the said cattle-race as shown on plan marked M.D. 5821.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall pay to the Minister the sum of £1, and thereafter an annual sum of £1 in advance, payable on the first day of April in each year, the proportionate part of such rental in respect of the period from the 13th day of May, 1938, until the 31st day of March following to be paid on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said cattle-race and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said cattle-race without payment.

6. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned cattle-race in good order and repair and shall at all times exhibit from the said cattle-race and maintain at the licensee's own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels : Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said cattle-race and view the state of repair thereof, and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last-known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such cattle-race requiring the licensee within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensee shall with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the 13th day of May, 1938, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority ; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. The said rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last-known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

11. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said cattle-race may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the licensee's part.

12. In case the licensee shall—

(1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them ;

(2) Cease to use or occupy the said cattle-race for a period of thirty consecutive days ;

(3) Become bankrupt, or be brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy ; or

(4) Fail to pay the sum specified in clause 3 of these conditions—

then, and in any of the said cases, this Order in Council and every right, power, or privilege may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceedings whatsoever ; and publication in the *Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee and to all persons concerned or interested that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred have been revoked and determined.

13. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the licensee shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said cattle-race entirely

from the site and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of the revocation or expiry, as the case may be ; and, if the licensee fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said cattle-race to be removed and the site so restored and may recover from the licensee the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration.

14. The occupation of the said cattle-race shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the licensee of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.
