CONDITIONS.

1. The works hereby authorized shall be constructed so as to comply with the Electrical Wiring Regulations, 1935, the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935, and the Water-power Regulations, 1934, and any regulations made or to be made in amplification or amendment thereof or in substitution thereof, which regulations shall be deemed to be incorporated herein.

2. The licensee shall substantially complete the works hereby authorized within a period of one year from the date of this Order in Council, or within such further time as the Minister may allow in the event of the work being delayed by strikes, lockouts, breakdowns, or other unavoidable causes not due to any neglect of the licensee.

3. This Order in Council shall be read in conjunction with and shall be supplementary to the Order in Council dated the 17th day of December, 1929, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 1 of the 9th day of January, 1930, at page 9, authorizing the Waimea Electric-supply and Manufacturing Company, Limited, to use water from the Wairoa River for the purpose of generating electricity and to erect electric lines in portion of the Waimea County and in Richmond Borough and the Tahunanui Town District, which Order in Council was duly assigned to the licensee and consented to by Order in Council dated the 7th day of October, 1933, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 71 of the 12th day of October, 1933, at page 2498.

WHEREAS by section three of the Judicature Amendment Act, 1933, it is enacted that in addition to the sittings of the Court of Appeal fixed pursuant to section eight of the Judicature Amendment Act, 1913, and notwithstanding anything to the contrary in that Act, special sittings of the said Court shall be held at such times and places as may in accordance with that section be from time to time appointed by the Governor-General by Order in Council published in the *Gazette*, and that the authority conferred on the Governor-General by that section shall be exercised only on the certificate of not less than three Judges of the Supreme Court (of whom the Chief Justice shall be one) given on the ground that it is not desirable or expedient that the hearing of any appeal or other proceeding, to be specified in the certificate, should be deferred until the next ordinary sitting of the Court of Appeal:

And whereas there is now pending before the Court of Appeal of New Zealand a case (commenced in the Supreme Court of New Zealand but since moved into the Court of Appeal) in which the plaintiff is Charles Edmund Godwin (a Detective-Sergeant of the New South Wales Police stationed in the City of Sydney, in the State of New South Wales, in the Commonwealth of Australia, but at present residing in and for the purposes of the discharge of his duty in the City of Auckland in the Dominion of New Zealand), and the defendant is Charles Rutherford Orr Walker (a Stipendiary Magistrate of New Zealand exercising jurisdiction as such in the said City of Auckland), and in such action the said plaintiff claims that a writ of mandamus may issue against the defendant ordering him to hear and determine the plaintiff's application for the endorsement under and in accordance with the provisions of Part II and in particular section thirteen of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, of a certain warrant issued by a Magistrate in the City of Sydney, in the State of New South Wales, in the Commonwealth of Australia, directing the plaintiff to apprehend and bring before a Magistrate in the said State of New South Wales a certain person named in the said warrant to answer a criminal charge therein contained:

And whereas a question raised by the aforesaid action is whether the provisions of Part II of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, apply to the rendition of alleged fugitive offenders from New Zealand to any specified State in the Commonwealth of Australia (or any part thereof) for trial therein or threat of an alleged offence against the criminal law of that State:

And whereas the said question is one of great importance on which in the interests of comity between the Commonwealth of Australia and the Dominion of New Zealand it has long been deemed desirable to obtain a decision by the Court of Appeal of New Zealand:

And whereas in addition to the great importance of the said issue it is essential in the interests both of the liberty of the subject and of the administration of criminal justice that the person who is alleged to be a fugitive offender and whose extradition is sought by the plaintiff should not be unduly detained in New Zealand pending determination of the question aforesaid:

And whereas three Judges of the Supreme Court (of whom the Chief Justice is one) have certified that it is not desirable or expedient that the hearing of the aforesaid action should be deferred until the next ordinary sitting of the Court of Appeal appointed to be held on the twelfth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, and all other powers him thereunto enabling, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby appoint and declare that a special sitting of the Court of Appeal of New Zealand shall be held within the Supreme Court House in the City of Auckland, commencing upon Wednesday, the third day of August, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, at half past ten o'clock in the forenoon, for the purpose of hearing such action and determining all questions of law thereon arising.

POLLUTION OF WATERS BY OIL.

THE Marine Department continues to receive complaints with reference to pollution of the coast by oil which has been discharged by vessels.

These deposits have a serious and deadly effect on bird life and on many occasions a considerable number of dead and dying penguins have been observed on the coast, particularly during May, when the larger penguins are making their way southward to their rookeries. The deposits, in addition to being responsible for the death of other sea birds, have rendered many popular beaches unusable for some time.

While the discharge of oil outside territorial waters is beyond the limits of New Zealand legislation, masters will, it is felt, readily realize the effect of such discharge and take steps to ensure that no oil, or oil and water, is pumped out until the vessel is well clear of the land or is in such a position that there is very little chance of such matter reaching the shore or territorial waters.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR JUNE, 1938.

General.—Except for the very heavy rains experienced on the eastern side of the South Island, June was a fairly average month. Temperatures were, on the whole, somewhat above and sunshine was slightly below normal. About the usual number of frosts were recorded, but there was no very severely cold weather. The sharp drop in temperature from the preceding month caused the growth of vegetation to be checked, but, generally, there is abundance of feed for stock. The latter, except for young sheep which are reported in a number of districts not to be doing very well, are in good condition. The ground is soft, making work on farms rather difficult.

Rainfall.—In Taranaki the rainfall was generally above average but elsewhere over the North Island conditions varied and excesses and deficits appear to be about equally divided. In the South Island, Westland and the Southern Alps had less than the average. In Nelson, most of Marlborough and Southland, the totals were about normal. In southern Marlborough, Canterbury, and most of Otago, the month was extremely wet. Most places had double the average and many more than three times. At Timaru and Oamaru, which each had nearly four times the average, it was the wettest June on record.

Temperatures were below normal in South Auckland and slightly below also in the coastal areas of Canterbury and Otago. At Auckland and Wellington they were about normal. Over the remainder of the country and for the Dominion as a whole the mean temperature was again above the average. Frosts were fairly numerous. From the 7th onward snow fell on the mountains on several occasions and at the end of the month they carried a moderate amount.

Sunshine.—At most places the sunshine was mostly slightly below the previous average but the reverse was the case at Tauranga (which had 160.4 hours), Rotorua, Christchurch, Dunedin, and Alexandra.

Pressure Systems.—The month began with the same type of weather prevailing as had been experienced during April and May. On the 4th a shallow cyclone formed south of Norfolk Island. The course followed on this occasion was, however, more easterly than on the earlier ones. The centre passed south of the Kermadecs on the 6th and New Zealand was comparatively little affected.

From the 8th onward the weather adopted a different habit. From this time until the end of the month, each depression as it approached from the west tended to develop a low-pressure centre off the central portion of the west coast. This led to strong northerly winds from Westland northwards as the depression neared the west coast; strong westerlies over the northern half of the North Island and moderate southerlies over the South while the centre was crossing the Dominion; finishing up with southerly gales as the system finally moved away.

The first of the series of storms of this kind passed on the 8th to 9th. The next was much more violent and controlled the weather from the 10th to the 14th. Southerly gales on the 13th brought the first really cold spell of the winter. Snow fell on the high levels in both Islands and was heavy on the ranges. The gale was a severe one; some damage was done by it; air services were interrupted; and shipping was interfered with. There was widespread heavy rain with very heavy falls, and some flooding in Taranaki and South Canterbury and North Otago. Some severe thunder and hail storms, also, were reported.
