WHEREAS by Order in Council made on the twenty-second day of October, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, and subject to the determinations as to borrowing and repayment therein set out, consent was given to the raising in New Zealand by the Kaitaia Town Board (hereinafter called "the said local authority") of the sum of twelve thousand three hundred and sixty pounds (£12,360) by a loan to be known as "Water Supply Loan, 1936" (hereinafter called "the said loan"):
