HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council made on the twenty-seventh day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, consent was given to the raising in New Zealand by the South Canterbury Hospital Board (hereinafter called "the said local authority") of the sum of twenty thousand pounds (£20,000) by a loan to be known as "Building Supplementary Loan, 1938," such consent being given subject to the determinations as to borrowing and repayment therein set out, including, *inter alia*, the provision that the rate of interest that might be paid in respect of the said loan or any part thereof should be such as should not produce to the lender or lenders a rate or rates exceeding three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum per annum:

And whereas a portion of the said loan amounting to seventeen thousand six hundred pounds (£17,600) (hereinafter called "the said sum") has not yet been raised:

And whereas the said local authority, pending the raising of the said sum in accordance with the said determinations, is desirous of borrowing the said sum or part thereof by hypothecation or mortgage pursuant to section thirty-four of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, of the debentures authorized to be issued in respect of the said sum:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section seven of the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Act, 1932-33, and by section eight of the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Amendment Act, 1933, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the said local authority, pending the raising of the said sum in accordance with the said determinations, borrowing the said sum of seventeen thousand six hundred pounds (£17,600) or any part thereof by the hypothecation or mortgage of the said debentures at a rate of interest not exceeding four pounds ten shillings (£4 10s.) per centum per annum, and hereby prescribes that the money borrowed by the hypothecation or mortgage of the said debentures shall, pending the raising of the said sum, be repaid by annual instalments equivalent to the instalments of principal which would have been repaid if on the first day on which any moneys are borrowed by such hypothecation or mortgage the whole of the said sum of seventeen thousand six hundred pounds (£17,600) had been raised on the terms prescribed by the Order in Council made on the twenty-seventh day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the Waitemata County Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority") proposes, pursuant to the provisions of section three of the Main Highways Amendment Act, 1928, to borrow the sum of eight hundred and twenty-five pounds (£825) by a loan to be known as "Main Highways Loan, 1938, No. 2 (Additional)" (hereinafter called "the said loan"), for the purpose of meeting its share of the additional cost of reconstructing and strengthening the Parkhurst Main Highway.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising by the said local authority of the said loan for the said purpose up to the amount of eight hundred and twenty-five pounds (£825), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

(1) The term for which the said loan or any part thereof may be raised shall be five (5) years.

(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum per annum.

(3) The said loan, together with interest thereon, shall be repaid by equal aggregate annual instalments extending over the term as determined in (1) above.

(4) No moneys shall be borrowed under this consent after the expiration of two years from the date hereof.

WHEREAS the Napier Borough Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority"), being desirous of raising the sum of six thousand pounds (£6,000) by a loan to be known as "Works Loan, 1938" (hereinafter called "the said loan"), for the purpose of carrying out the following works—Napier South Stormwater Drainage; Extension of Kennedy Road; Tutaekuri River-diversion; Parade Amusement Area; South Pond Recreation Area; Breakwater Road realignment; Breakwater Road Water-main—has complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council as required by the said Act should be given to the raising of the said loan:

Vesting the Management of the Wharf at Waikato Heads in the Port Waikato Harbour Board.

GALWAY, Governor-General.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 9th day of November, 1938.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Harbours Act, 1923, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby vest in the Port Waikato Harbour Board (hereinafter called "the Board," which term shall include its successors and assigns unless the context requires a different construction) the management of the wharf at Waikato Heads for the purpose of the use of the wharf for a term of fourteen years computed from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, such license to be held and enjoyed by the Board upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term—

"Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides :

"Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides :

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto necessary for the maintenance of the said wharf.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the Board shall pay to the Minister an annual rental of 1s., payable on demand, such rent to date from the date of this Order in Council.

4. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, upon payment of proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all reasonable times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said wharf without payment.

6. The Board shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair ; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at the Board's own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels : Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. All dues and rates received on account of the said wharf by the Board shall be applied to keeping the said wharf and all erections on or in connection therewith in good order and repair and for the renewal or the extension of the said wharf when such is found necessary.

8. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof, and upon the Minister leaving at or posting to the last-known address of the Board in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring the Board within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to make good or repair the same, the Board, shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

9. The master of all vessels discharging ballast at the said wharf shall have all such ballast taken away and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The Board shall not erect, or suffer to be erected, on the said wharf, any building or structure whatever, except with the consent of the Minister.

11. The Board shall keep a separate bank account for all receipts and expenditure in respect of the said wharf, and shall cause an account of such receipts and expenditure to be balanced to the 30th day of September in every year, and shall send a copy of such account when balanced to the Minister, and shall supply any particulars in reference thereto as may be required by the Minister.

12. The Board shall appoint all officers necessary for the working and management of the said wharf.

13. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Board to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations thereunder and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

14. The rights, powers, and privileges hereby conferred shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the 1st April, 1938, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority, and the Board shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

15. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Board three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last-known address of the Board in New Zealand.

16. The Board shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the part of the Board.

17. In case the Board shall—

(1) Commit or suffer breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them ; or

(2) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty consecutive days ;

then, and in either of the said cases, this Order in Council and every license, right, power, or privilege may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the Board or any other proceedings whatsoever ; and publication in the *Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Board and to all persons concerned or interested that this Order in Council and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred have been revoked and determined.

18. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the Board shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said wharf entirely from the site and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of the revocation or expiry, as the case may be, and if the Board fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said wharf to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the Board.

Vesting the Control of Scenic Reserves in the Punakaiki Scenic Board.

GALWAY, Governor-General.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section thirteen of the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand doth hereby vest the control of the reserves described in the Schedule hereto (being land reserved under the said Act), for the period of five years from the date hereof (unless previously altered or revoked under the said Act) in the undermentioned persons, namely:—

The Commissioner of Crown Lands, Hokitika, *ex officio*,
 Frederick Arthur Kitchingham,
 William McKay, M.D.,
 John Henry Powell,
 Herbert Vincent Mathias, and
 Frederick Edward Roud,

who are hereby constituted for that purpose a special Board by the name of the Punakaiki Scenic Board (herein referred

to as "the Board), in trust, for the preservation of scenery, and with the powers and subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The first meeting of the Board shall be held on Wednesday, the twenty-third day of November, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, at one o'clock p.m., in the residence of Mr. F. A. Kitchingham at Punakaiki, and thereafter the Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the fourth Wednesday in each quarter at the time and place aforesaid, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board.

2. The members of the Board shall at their first meeting and thereafter at the annual meeting hereinafter provided, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote.

3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. Any three members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at the meeting.

6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman for such meeting.

7. If by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself, without reasonable cause, from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.

8. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meeting to be held in the month of May in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

9. The Board shall control the said reserves in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and of the regulations made thereunder.

IN pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling me under the Government Railways Act, 1926, and its amendments, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, I, Daniel Giles Sullivan, Minister of Railways, do hereby make the following alterations in the General Scale of Charges made on the 4th day of November, 1931, and published in the *Gazette* of the 13th day of November, 1931, and to the Goods—Local Rates Scale of Charges made on the 17th day of October, 1935, and published in the *Gazette* of the 18th day of October, 1935, in force on the New Zealand Government Railways open for traffic.
