A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor-General by the Marriage Act, 1908, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Mauriceville, Carterton, Masterton, and Castlepoint districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into three marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows :—

MASTERTON DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District bounded by a line commencing at a point in the middle of the Makakahi River in line with the western boundary of Section 21, Block XIV, Tararua Survey District ; thence down the middle of that river to the south-western boundary of Section 1, E.R. Block XIV, Tararua Survey District ; thence by the south-western boundary of that section to Bruce Road ; thence by Bruce Road to the westernmost corner of Section 171, Block XIII, Mangaone Survey District ; thence by the south-western and south-eastern boundaries of Section 171 to Mount Monro Road ; thence across that road to the southern boundary of Section 129, Block XIII aforesaid ; thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of Section 129 aforesaid to the southern boundary of Section 131, Block XIII aforesaid ; thence by the southern boundaries generally of said Section 131 to Smith's Line ; thence across Smith's Line and northerly along its eastern side to the southern boundary of Section 135, Block XIV, Mangaone Survey District ; thence along the southern boundary of Section 135 aforesaid to the Masterton-Woodville Railway ; thence across that railway and northerly along its eastern side to the southern boundary of Section 140, Block XIV, Mangaone Survey District ; thence by the southern boundary of Section 140 aforesaid to Bowen Road ; thence across Bowen Road and southerly along its eastern side to the southern boundary of Lot 2 on L.T. plan 2370, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Wellington ; thence along

the southern boundary of Lot 2 aforesaid to Mangaoronga Road; thence along Mangaoronga Road to Mangamahoe Road and along Mangamahoe Road to the eastern boundary of Section 65, Block XIV, Mangaone Survey District; thence along the eastern boundary of Section 65 aforesaid and Section 18, Block II, Kopuaranga Survey District, to the south-eastern corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along the southern boundaries of Sections 19 and 8, Block III, Kopuaranga Survey District, to Ihuraua Road; thence across that road and northerly along its eastern side to Dagg's Road; thence along the southern and western side of Dagg's Road to the south-eastern boundary of Section 95, Block IV, Kopuaranga Survey District; thence along the south-eastern boundary of Section 95 aforesaid to the northernmost corner of Section 100; thence along the south-western and south-eastern boundaries of Section 96, Block IV, Kopuaranga Survey District, to the northernmost corner of Section 17, Block IV aforesaid; thence by the north-eastern and south-eastern boundaries of Section 17 aforesaid to the westernmost corner of Section 22, Block I, Mangapakeha Survey District; thence along the south-western boundary of Section 22 to its southernmost corner; thence north-easterly along the south-eastern boundaries of Sections 22, 27, and 26, Block I aforesaid, to the easternmost corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along the southern boundary of Lot 7 on L.T. plan 1331, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Wellington, to its southernmost corner; thence along the southern boundary of Lot 4 on L.T. plan 2131, deposited as aforesaid, to its south-eastern corner; thence along the eastern boundary of Lot 4 and the south-western boundary of Lot 3 on L.T. plan 2131 aforesaid to the Taueru River; thence along that river to the northernmost corner of Section 157, Block II, Mangapakeha Survey District; thence by the north-eastern boundary of that section to its north-eastern corner; thence along the eastern boundaries of Sections 157, 145, 146, 147, 152, and 151, Block I, and Sections 150, 787, 788, and 789, Block VI, Mangapakeha Survey District, to the southernmost corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along the north-eastern boundaries of Sections 292 and 293, Block VI, Mangapakeha Survey District, to the easternmost corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along the north-western and south-western boundaries of Section 871 to the northernmost corner of Section 875, Block X, Mangapakeha Survey District; thence along the north-western and western boundaries of Section 875 aforesaid to the Bideford Road; thence along that road to the north-western boundary of part 1, Section 874, Block X aforesaid; thence south-westerly along the north-western boundary of parts 1 and 2, Section 874, to the north-eastern boundary of Section 867, Block XIII, Mangapakeha Survey District; thence along the north-eastern and north-western boundaries of Section 867 to the north-western boundary of Section 518; thence along the north-western boundary of Section 518 aforesaid to its westernmost corner; thence along the northern boundaries of Sections 520, 521, and 522 to the north-eastern boundary of the last-mentioned section; thence along that boundary to the south-western corner of Section 617, Block II, Rewa Survey District; thence along the north-western boundary of Section 617 to its northernmost corner; thence southerly, easterly, and south-easterly along the north-eastern and northern boundaries of Sections 617, 618, and part 619 to the north-eastern corner of the last-mentioned section; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of part 619 to its intersection with the northern boundary of Section 1, Block II, Rewa Survey District; thence along the northern boundaries of Section 1, Block II, and Section 2, Block III, Rewa Survey District, to the northernmost corner of Section 6, Block III, Rewa Survey District; thence along the north-western and south-western boundaries of Section 6 aforesaid to Langdale Road; thence across Langdale Road and along the north-eastern boundary of Section 9, Block III, Rewa Survey District, and that boundary produced to the middle of the Whareama River; thence down the middle of the Whareama River to the sea; thence by the sea to the mouth of the Kaiwhata River; thence up the middle of the Kaiwhata River to the south-western corner of the Tutae-hauhau Native Reserve; thence along a right line to the southernmost corner of Section 2, Block IV, Wainuioru Survey District; thence to and along the Ruamahanga Stream to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Section 2s, Westmere Settlement; thence to and along that boundary and the south-eastern boundary of Section 1s, Westmere Settlement, to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of Section 77, Block XIV, Otahoua Survey District; thence north-westerly to and along that boundary and the north-eastern boundaries of Sections 62 and 54, Block XIV, Otahoua Survey District, to the eastern boundary of the land shown on plan B. 239, deposited in the office

of the District Land Registrar at Wellington; thence along the eastern boundaries of the land shown on plans B. 238 and B. 239, deposited as aforesaid, to the Pohatu Stream; thence by the Pohatu Stream to the Taueru River; thence by the Taueru River to the Ruamahanga River and by the Ruamahanga River to the Waingawa River; thence by the Waingawa River to its source; thence by a right line to the summit of the Tararua Range; thence by the summit of the Tararua Range to a line bearing $115^{\circ} 30'$ magnetic from the said summit to the middle of the Makakahi River at a point in line with the production of the western boundary of Section 21, Block XIV, Tararua Survey District, the point of commencement.

CARTERTON DISTRICT.

All that area in the Wellington Land District bounded on the north-east generally by the Masterton District hereinbefore described from the summit of the Tararua Range to the sea at the mouth of the Kaiwhata River; thence south-westerly along the sea-coast to the Waihingaita River; thence up that river to the easternmost corner of Section 168, Block VII, Mount Adams Survey District; thence along the north-eastern boundaries of Sections 168 and 213, Block VII aforesaid, to the westernmost corner of Section No. 214 of the said Block VII; thence along the south-eastern boundary of Section 232 to its easternmost corner; thence along the north-eastern boundaries of Sections 232 and 231, Block VII, Sections 230 and 228, Block VI, Mount Adams Survey District, to the north-western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence north-easterly along the north-western boundaries of Sections 227 and 222, Block II, Mount Adams Survey District, to the north-western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along the south-eastern boundary of Section 302 and the south-eastern and north-eastern boundaries of Section 301, Block XIV, Wainuioru Survey District, to the Pahaoa River; thence up the middle of the Pahaoa River to a point in line with the eastern boundary of part 1 of Section 293, Block XIV, Wainuioru Survey District; thence along the eastern and northern boundaries of said part 1 of Section 293 to the south-western corner of Section 291, Block X, Wainuioru Survey District; thence along the north-western boundaries of said Section 291 and Section 286A to the road forming the northern boundary of the last-mentioned section; thence northerly and westerly along that road to the north-eastern corner of Section 259, Block X, Wainuioru Survey District; thence north-westerly along the northern boundaries of Sections 259, 258, 257, and 254, Blocks IX and X aforesaid, to the Wainuioru River; thence down the middle of that river to a point in line with the south-western boundary-line of Section 3, Block IX, Wainuioru Survey District; thence by a right line to the south-eastern corner of that section; thence along the south-western and part of the western boundary of said Section 3 to the southern boundary-line of Section 5, Block XII, Huangarua Survey District, Mahupuku Settlement; thence along the southern boundaries of Sections 5 and 1, Block XII aforesaid, to the Whangaehu Stream; thence up the middle of the Whangaehu Stream to the Whangaehu Road on the eastern boundary of Section 40, Block VII, Huangarua Survey District; thence northerly and westerly along the north-eastern and north-western boundaries of Section 1, Block VII, Huangarua Survey District, to the south-eastern corner of Section 2, Block VII aforesaid; thence along the southern boundary of said Section 2 to Ponatahi Road; thence across that road and southerly along its western side to the south-eastern corner of Section 5, Block III, Huangarua Survey District; thence along the south-western boundaries of the said Section 5 to the Pohaturiki Stream; thence down the middle of that stream to the Waiohine River; thence up the middle of the Waiohine River to its source; thence along a right line to the summit of the Tararua Range and northerly along the summit of the range to the point of commencement.

CASTLEPOINT DISTRICT.

All that area in the Wellington Land District bounded by a line commencing at the mouth of the Aohanga River; thence by the sea to the mouth of the Whareama River; thence by the Masterton District hereinbefore described to the Taueru River at the northernmost corner of Section 157, Block II, Mangapakeha Survey District; thence by the Taueru River to a point in line with the production of the north-western boundary of Section 175, Block XV, Puketoi Survey District; thence to and along that boundary and the north-western boundary of Section 174 to the Waitawhiti Stream; thence by the Waitawhiti Stream to the western boundary of Section 193, Block XII, Puketoi

Survey District; thence along the western, southern, and eastern boundaries of said Section 193 to the north-eastern corner; thence along the northern boundaries of Sections 14, 15, and 22, Block XII, Puketoi Survey District, to the south-eastern corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along the western boundaries of Sections 19 and 221, Block XII, Puketoi Survey District, to the southern boundary of Section 16; thence along the southern and western boundaries of Section 16, Block XII, and the north-western boundary of Section 1, Block VIII, Puketoi Survey District, to the northernmost corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along the Waihoki Road to the northern boundary-line of Section 23, (E.R.) Block IX, Aohanga Survey District; thence along the northern boundary-line of that section to the westernmost corner of Section 18, Block V, Aohanga Survey District; thence by the western and southern boundaries of that section to the Waiowaka Road; thence along the western side of Waiowaka Road to Spur Road; thence along the northern and eastern side of Spur Road to the road forming the northern boundary of Sections 7 and 6, Block XI, Aohanga Survey District; thence by that road and the north-eastern boundary of said Section 6 to its easternmost corner; thence along the southern and eastern boundaries of Section 5, Block XI, Aohanga Survey District, to the Waingongora Stream; thence by that stream to its confluence with the Aohanga River; and thence by the Aohanga River to the sea, the place of commencement.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the first day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor-General by the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1924, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing registration districts known as the Mauriceville, Carterton, Masterton, and Castlepoint districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into three registration districts, the names whereof shall be the Masterton, Carterton, and Castlepoint districts, and the boundaries whereof shall be conterminous with the boundaries of the marriage districts bearing the same names as are set forth in a Proclamation of even date herewith, made under the provisions of the Marriage Act, 1908:

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the first day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine.
