WHEREAS the several local authorities enumerated in the Schedule hereto, being desirous of raising the respective loans stated opposite their names therein, have respectively complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, as required by the said Act, should be given to the raising of the said loans :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the respective local authorities mentioned in the First Column of the said Schedule of the respective loans set out in the Second Column of the said Schedule, up to the respective amounts specified in the Third Column of the said Schedule, and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows :—

THE STATUTES OF THE IMPERIAL SERVICE ORDER.

[SEAL OF THE ORDER.]

GEORGE R.I.

GEORGE THE SIXTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, and Sovereign of the Imperial Service Order, to all to whom these presents shall come: Greeting!

WHEREAS His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh, being desirous of recognizing more fully than had theretofore been possible the faithful and meritorious services rendered to him by Members of the Civil Services of the various parts of His Empire, did, for Himself, His Heirs and Successors, by Warrant under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual dated the eighth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and two and in the second year of His Reign, institute and create a new Civil Order of Distinction—to be designated THE IMPERIAL SERVICE ORDER—and He was graciously pleased to Make, Ordain, and Establish Rules and Ordinances for the government of the same:

AND WHEREAS the Statutes of the said Order have from time to time been amended and re-enacted by Our Royal Predecessors; AND WHEREAS We deem it expedient to assemble the said Statutes and to make such alterations therein as appear to be necessary for the government of the Order:

NOW, THEREFORE, in pursuance and in the exercise of the power vested in Us by the aforesaid Statutes, We do hereby abrogate and repeal all and every the aforesaid Statutes, and in lieu thereof, We do by these Presents, Make, Ordain, and Establish the following Statutes and Ordinances:

Firstly.—It is ordained that this Order shall henceforth be styled and designated "The Imperial Service Order."

Secondly.—It is ordained that We, Our Heirs and Successors, Kings and Queens Regnant of these Our Realms are and for ever shall be Sovereigns of this Order.

Thirdly.—It is ordained that the Order shall consist of the Sovereign and the Prince of Wales, and such Companions as We, Our Heirs or Successors, shall appoint.

Fourthly.—It is ordained that only the Members of the administrative or clerical branches of Our Civil Services shall be eligible for the distinction of Companions of this Order.

Fifthly.—It is ordained that the number of Companions of this Order shall not exceed seven hundred and twenty (exclusive of those persons who were admitted into this Order in the year one thousand nine hundred and eleven at the Coronation of Our Royal Father King George V and at Our Royal Coronation in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven), of whom two hundred and fifty shall belong to Our Home Civil Service, two hundred to Our Civil Services in India and

Burma, including the Staff of Our Secretary of State for India and Our Secretary of State for Burma, and two hundred and seventy to the Civil Services of Our Dominions beyond the Seas and Countries under Our Protection or Mandated Territories, including the Staff of the Crown Agents for the Colonies.

Sixthly.—It is ordained that no person shall be eligible to be a Companion of the Order whose name has not been laid before Us, Our Heirs or Successors, by Our Prime Minister, and who has not at the time of his or her nomination rendered at least twenty-five years' meritorious service in Our said Civil Services: Provided that in the Indian Empire and Burma the minimum period of service in the case of Europeans shall be twenty years, and that in any part of Our Dominions beyond the Seas, or any Country under Our Protection or Mandated Territory, which, under the Pensions Acts or Regulations applying thereto, is recognized as unhealthy, the minimum period of service shall be sixteen years: Provided also that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs or Successors, to appoint specially to the Order persons who, not having completed the aforesaid periods of service, have rendered such eminently meritorious service as to qualify them, in Our opinion, to become recipients of this distinction.

Seventhly.—It is ordained that when We, Our Heirs and Successors, shall be pleased to appoint any person to be a Companion of this Order, such appointment shall be made by Warrant under Our Sign Manual, sealed with the Seal of this Order, and countersigned by one of the Officers of the Order.

Eighthly.—It is ordained that the names of those upon whom We are pleased to confer this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.

Ninthly.—It is ordained that the Companions of this Order shall have the privilege of adding the letters "I.S.O." after their names.

Tenthly.—It is ordained that the Badge to be worn by Companions of this Order shall be: for men—a seven pointed star of silver, in the centre thereof a medallion of gold bearing the Royal and Imperial Cypher of the Sovereign within a circle inscribed "For Faithful Service," the Cypher and inscription in dark blue enamel, the medallion ensigned with the Imperial Crown; and for women—a like medallion ensigned with the Imperial Crown and surrounded by a wreath of laurel in silver.

Eleventhly.—It is ordained that the Badge shall be worn by men on the left breast, suspended from a riband of one inch and a half in width, consisting of a strip of blue between two strips of crimson of equal size; and by women on the left shoulder, suspended from a riband of the same colour and width, fashioned into a bow.

Twelfthly.—It is ordained that the Imperial Service Order shall rank next to Our Distinguished Service Order, and that the men who are Companions of this Order shall, in all places and assemblies whatsoever, have place and precedence next to and immediately after Officers of Our Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, and that the women who are Companions of this Order shall have place and precedence next to and immediately after the wives of Officers of Our said Most Excellent Order of the British Empire; and that the Companions shall rank among themselves according to the dates of their respective nominations.

Thirteenthly.—It is ordained that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, by an Ordinance signed by the Sovereign and sealed with the Seal of the Order and on a recommendation to that effect by or through Our Prime Minister, to cancel and annul the appointment of any person to this Order, and that thereupon his or her name in the Register shall be erased; provided that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, to restore to the Order any person whose appointment may have been so cancelled and annulled when such recommendation has been withdrawn.

Fourteenthly.—It is ordained that those Members of Our Civil Services who are not eligible for appointment as Companions of this Order may, on retirement from Our said Services, after not less than twenty-five years of meritorious service, or, in the case of Europeans serving in the Indian Empire, or in Burma, after not less than twenty years of such service, or in the case of service in any part of Our Dominions beyond the Seas or any Country under Our Protection or Mandated Territory which under the Pensions Acts or Regulations applying thereto is recognized as unhealthy, after not less than sixteen years of such service, be awarded a Medal to be designated "The Imperial Service Medal": Provided that such Medal shall be granted only on the recommendation of Our Prime Minister: Provided also

that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs or Successors, to confer the Medal upon not more than five Members of Our Civil Services in each year, who have retired after less than the specified years of service, should the special circumstances justify the grant.

Fifteenthly.—It is ordained that the Imperial Service Medal, for men and women, shall be a circular medal of silver bearing the effigy of the Sovereign on the obverse, and on the reverse the words " For Faithful Service " ; and that the name of the recipient shall be engraved on the rim : and it is further ordained that the Imperial Service Medal shall be worn in similar manner to that prescribed for the Imperial Service Order.

Sixteenthly.—It is ordained that the names of those persons to whom the Imperial Service Medal shall be granted shall be duly published in the London Gazette.

Seventeenthly.—It is ordained that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, by an Ordinance signed by the Sovereign and sealed with the Seal of the Order and on a recommendation to that effect by or through Our Prime Minister, to cancel and annul the award to any person of an Imperial Service Medal, and that thereupon his or her name in the Register shall be erased. Provided that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, to restore any Imperial Service Medal which may have been so forfeited when such recommendation has been withdrawn. And every person to whom the said Medal is awarded shall, before receiving the same, enter into an agreement, should his or her name be erased as aforesaid, to return the Medal to the Registrar of the Order. Such agreements entered into under past Statutes, Warrants, or Regulations of this Order shall have effect as if made under this Statute and an agreement made to return a Medal when called upon to do so by an Under-Secretary of State shall have effect as though it had been an agreement to return a Medal at the request of the Registrar of the Order.

Eighteenthly.—It is ordained that the Seal of this Order shall consist of the Arms : Gules, a representation of the Badge of the Order impaling Our Royal Arms, with the following circumscription " The Seal of the Imperial Service Order " ; and that the Statutes of the Order shall be sealed by and with the same.

Nineteenthly.—It is ordained that the following Officers shall be appointed to this Order, that is to say a Secretary and a Registrar.

Twentiethly.—It is ordained that the Secretary of this Order shall be the Permanent Secretary to the Treasury, that he shall collect and tabulate the names of all those persons who are to be submitted to Us, Our Heirs or Successors by Our Prime Minister, whether in the Home Civil Service or, on the recommendation of a Secretary of State, for one of the other allocations, for admission to this Order or to be awarded the Medal of the Order, and that in all ceremonies of this Order he shall wear pendent from a gold chain round his neck, a representation of the badge of the Order, with, in the centre, two pens in saltire in pearl enamel in place of the Royal and Imperial Cypher, the whole within a circle of gold inscribed " Secretary of the Imperial Service Order."

It is ordained that the Registrar of this Order shall be the Secretary of the Central Chancery of Our Orders of Knighthood, that he shall have the custody of the archives of the Order, and in all ceremonies of the Order shall wear pendent from a gold chain round his neck, a representation of the badge of the Order with, in the centre, a closed book in red enamel, in place of the Royal and Imperial Cypher, the whole within a circle of gold inscribed " Registrar of the Imperial Service Order."

On the resignation or decease of an Officer of the Order, his Badge of Office shall be restored for the Service of the Order.

Twenty-firstly.—It is ordained that the miniature Badges worn by the Companions of this Order shall be half the size of the Badges worn by the Companions ; and that sealed patterns of the said miniature Badges shall be deposited and kept in the Central Chancery of Our Orders of Knighthood.

Twenty-secondly.—We reserve to Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors, full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting, or dispensing with these Statutes and Regulations or any part thereof, by a notification under the Sign Manual of the Sovereign of the Order.

Given at Our Court at Saint James's, this first day of October, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight in the Second Year of Our reign.

WITH reference to the memorandum from the Secretary of State for Dominion Affairs, published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 21st September, 1933, at page 2438, the following supplementary information contained in a recent despatch from the Secretary of State is published for general information.

H. G. R. MASON, Minister of Justice.

His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington has recently drawn attention to the difficulty in the way of obtaining evidence by means of letters of request addressed to Courts in the United States owing to the inability of the State Department to secure acceptance of these documents by the Court to which they are addressed and to ensure that the necessary action will be taken by the Court.

In view of this difficulty His Majesty's Ambassador has suggested that in lieu of procedure by letter of request evidence desired in the United States should be obtained by means of commissions addressed to His Majesty's Consular officers in that country. For purposes of convenience such commissions should be made in favour of "His Majesty's Consul (or Consul-General) at _____, or his deputy."

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR DECEMBER, 1938.

General.—In the final few days of the month settled conditions obtained in the northern half of the North Island, but otherwise December was a most unseasonable month with much cold, wet weather, and persistent strong winds in many places. The exceptionally frequent rains have seriously interfered with haymaking, while shearing and cultivation operations, especially in the higher country, are well behind schedule. Although the strong winds have caused some drying up in the Hawke's Bay area, pasture growth has, on the whole, been well maintained, in some places almost too abundant, and stock are in good condition. Lambs, however, although growing are not fattening as well as usual. The continuation of cold, damp weather has retarded crops, gardens, and shrubs, and blights are making their appearance. Compared with recent years, however, the white butterfly and other insect pests are present in much reduced numbers.

Rainfall.—With the exception of small areas at the tip of the Auckland Peninsula and in the neighbourhood of Gisborne, rainfall everywhere was well above the normal, great numbers of places having had double or more than double the average fall, while in most of the southern half of the South Island and also in parts of the central portion of the North Island, it was the wettest December on record. Although the monthly aggregates were high, individual falls were not, on the whole, excessive, the chief characteristic of the month being the unusually great number of wet days. The only very heavy falls over extended areas, causing floods, were those which occurred in Otago and Canterbury on the 3rd and 4th and in the Taumarunui district on the following week-end. Several cloudbursts in widely scattered places in the South Island also resulted in local flooding.

Temperatures.—In marked contrast with the previous December and also with November, 1938, temperatures were below normal over the entire country and considerably below it over most districts. In Hawke's Bay and Southland the departures were small but elsewhere they were mostly close to, or in excess of, 2 degrees. At Hanmer Springs it was the coldest December since records began in 1906, the mean temperature of 52.8° being 4.7° below the average. At New Plymouth, also, it was the coldest on record, and one of the coldest in the Waikato. Night temperatures were generally low, frosts being by no means rare in some districts, even of the North Island. Snow was relatively frequent in the Southern Alps, while at Mount Egmont there were falls on four successive weeks, the usual number in December being only one or two.

Sunshine.—Considering the amount of rain experienced, the sunshine totals were not as low as might have been expected. In fact, Lincoln, with 243.5 hours was well above the average. Everywhere else, however, with the exception of Rotorua, the amount recorded was well below normal, the largest deficit being 35.4 hours at Wellington.

Thunderstorms.—The month was one of unusually frequent thunderstorms. From reports received so far, the only days on which none occurred were the 1st, 2nd, 5th, 10th, 13th, 28th, and 30th. The storms were of two distinct types. One gave widespread and prolonged thunder and lightning but little, if any, hail, while the other was the more typical hailstorm. Two cases of the first type occurred: on the night and early morning of the 7th to 8th, where practically everywhere east of the ranges between Hokitika and New Plymouth had severe electrical disturbances lasting over six hours in some places, and again in central districts on the night of the 15th to 16th. Relatively little of the hail type occurred in the North Island but has caused considerable damage to crops, gardens, and orchards in Canterbury and Otago.

Pressure Systems.—Except in the last week in the month the anticyclones which moved eastward off Australia, took a relatively northerly course when over the Tasman Sea, and families of depressions moving along their southern boundaries gave an unusual amount of westerly and south-westerly weather in the Dominion. In the southern half of the North Island, in particular, strong winds were very persistent.

The first series of depressions passed between the 2nd and 5th giving general rain with many heavy falls, followed on the latter day by severe southerly gales.

Conditions improved during the next day or two but by the morning of the 8th a very deep depression, the first of a new series, had moved on to the South Island giving rain in central districts and the south, accompanied by the thunderstorms already mentioned. There were severe north-westerly gales in the South Island, a tree being blown on to a train at Styx in North Canterbury. This depression moved off the country fairly rapidly, giving general rain in the North on the 9th. The 10th was a fine day generally, but a phenomenally deep and vigorous cyclone formed over New South Wales causing many severe northerly gales the next day in the Dominion, a 75-ton crane being overturned at Greymouth. Rain occurred in all western districts, but fortunately the centre of the storm passed to the south of New Zealand.

Apart from an intense one which gave general rain in central districts on the 20th the depressions in the next ten days, although frequent, were fairly weak, the weather being changeable with scattered rains and intervals of fair weather. This was the period in which the majority of the thunderstorms occurred.

Conditions were better on the 22nd to 24th, but the anticyclone which was approaching moved north, and an intense disturbance crossed the Dominion over Christmas, strong and unpleasantly cold south-westerly winds prevailing on the 26th.

From then on the weather in the North Island was relatively good but remained changeable and unsettled in the South Island.
