WHEREAS by section three hundred and two of the Land Act, 1924, as amended by section ten of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1926, it is enacted that on the disposal of any national-endowment land by way of sale, or on the acquisition of the fee-simple of any such land, the Governor-General may by Proclamation declare that such land shall, as from a date to be specified in the Proclamation, cease to be national-endowment land;

And whereas the fee-simple of the land described in the Schedule hereto (being land heretofore held on renewable lease tenure) has been acquired, and it is expedient that the said land should cease to be national-endowment land:

WHEREAS the Scenery Preservation Board, constituted pursuant to the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), has recommended that the State forest lands described in the Schedule hereto should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes: And whereas the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation and Commissioner of State Forests has also, pursuant to section fifty-five of the Statutes Amendment Act, 1938, recommended that the said lands should be declared scenic reserves, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendations:

Now, therefore, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by section six of the said Act and the said section fifty-five of the Statutes Amendment Act, 1938, do hereby proclaim and declare that the State forest lands described in the Schedule hereto shall be scenic reserves under the said Act, and subject to the provisions thereof.
