**ORDER IN COUNCIL.**

At the Government House at Wellington, this 19th day of April, 1939.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize the Westport Coal Company, Limited, being a company duly

incorporated under the Companies Act, 1933, and having its registered office at Water Street, Dunedin (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee"), to lay, construct, put up, place, and use electric lines within the areas of supply described in the Schedule hereto on the following conditions.

#### CONDITIONS.

##### 1. PURPOSES OF LINES.

The said lines may be used for lighting, power, and heating purposes.

##### 2. LICENSE TO BE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.

The license hereby conferred is subject to compliance by the licensee with the Electrical Wiring Regulations, 1935, the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935, and with all regulations made or to be made in amplification or amendment thereof or in substitution therefor. The conditions directed to be implied in all licenses by the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935, shall be incorporated herein and form part of this license except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

##### 3. DURATION OF LICENSE.

Unless sooner determined, this license shall continue in force until the 31st day of March, 1964.

##### 4. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be the system described in paragraph (a) of clause 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935.

##### 5. CHARGES ON SALE.

The charges for electrical energy shall not exceed one shilling (1s.) per unit for lighting purposes and sixpence (6d.) per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes: Provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor-generators for lighting purposes; and provided further that if accounts are paid within fourteen days of due date the charges shall not exceed 9d. per unit for lighting purposes and 4½d. per unit for motor-power, cooking, or heating purposes.

##### 6. CONSUMERS ENTITLED TO SUPPLY.

The licensee shall supply and sell to any person, company, or corporate body within the area of supply requiring the same, for any purposes within that area, electricity to the extent to which it may be available; Provided that such person, company, or corporate body pays the cost of connecting his or its premises with the transmission-line erected by the licensee in pursuance of this license, or, alternatively, pays a line rental at a rate not exceeding 15 per cent. on the cost of such connecting line together with any additional transmission-line required to supply such person, company, or corporate body.

#### SCHEDULE.

LINES adapted for supply as prescribed in these presents for the transmission of electricity within those areas comprising the Townships of Waimangaroa and Birchfield; the same being more particularly shown bordered red on plan P.W.D. 102022, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, the lines at present proposed to be erected being shown coloured green on the said plan.

local authority") of the sum of one hundred thousand pounds (£100,000) by a loan to be known as "Waipori Falls Electrical Power Renewal Loan, 1939" (hereinafter called "the said loan"), such consent being given subject to the determinations as to borrowing and repayment therein set out, including, *inter alia*, the provision that the rate of interest that might be paid in respect of the said loan or any part thereof should be such as should not produce to the lender or lenders a rate or rates exceeding three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum per annum:

WHEREAS the Hawke's Bay County Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority"), being desirous of borrowing the sum of twenty thousand pounds (£20,000) by way of bank overdraft under the provisions of section seven of the Local Bodies' Finance Act, 1921-22, by a loan to be known as "Flood Damage Loan, 1939" (hereinafter called "the said loan"), for the purpose of repairing damage caused by the floods of January, February, and the twenty-fifth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, has complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council as required by the said Act should be given to the borrowing as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the borrowing of moneys by the said local authority under the said section seven for the said purpose up to the amount of twenty thousand pounds (£20,000) by way of bank overdraft, and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

(1) The term for which such moneys or any part thereof may be borrowed shall not exceed five (5) years.

(2) The rate of interest payable from time to time shall not exceed the current bank overdraft rate of interest to best customers.

(3) The moneys so borrowed shall be repaid by equal annual payments of not less than four thousand pounds (£4,000) each, extending over the term as determined in (1) above.

WHEREAS the Waitaki Electric-power Board (hereinafter called "the said local authority"), being desirous of raising the sum of fifteen thousand pounds (£15,000) to be known as "Extension Loan, 1939" (hereinafter called "the said loan"), for the purpose of constructing additional transmission and distribution lines and substations and augmenting existing lines and substations, purchasing and erecting all necessary equipment therefor and generally exercising the Board's rights and powers as may be deemed expedient under the authority of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, and its amendments, has complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council as required by the said Act should be given to the raising of the said loan:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said loan for the said purpose up to the amount of fifteen thousand pounds (£15,000), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

(1) The term for which the said loan or any part thereof may be raised shall not exceed twenty-five (25) years.

(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum per annum.

(1) The term for which the said loan or any part thereof may be raised shall not exceed twenty-five (25) years.

(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding three pounds (£3) per centum per annum.

WHEREAS by Order in Council made on the twentieth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, and subject to the determinations as to borrowing and repayment therein set out, consent was given to the raising in New Zealand by the Hawke's Bay Rivers Board (hereinafter called "the said local authority") of the sum of sixty thousand pounds (£60,000) by a loan to be known as "Ngaruroro River Control Loan, 1935" (hereinafter called "the said loan"):

And whereas the authority conferred by the said Order in Council has not been exercised to the extent of eighteen thousand two hundred pounds (£18,200):

And whereas the authority has lapsed in accordance with the provisions of clause six thereof and it is not now lawful or competent for the said local authority to raise the said loan or any portion thereof except in accordance with the provisions of a further Order in Council that may be issued pursuant to section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"):

And whereas the said local authority is desirous of raising the sum of eighteen thousand two hundred pounds (£18,200) (hereinafter called "the said sum"), being the balance of the said loan, and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council as required by the said Act should be given to the raising of the said sum:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said sum up to the amount of eighteen thousand two hundred pounds (£18,200), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

(1) The term for which the said sum or any part thereof may be raised shall not exceed ten (10) years.

(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said sum or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum per annum.

(3) The said sum or any part thereof, together with interest thereon, shall be repaid as follows:—

(a) By twenty equal payments of six hundred and thirty-six pounds nine shillings and tenpence (£636 9s. 10d.), one of such payments to be made at the end of every half-year commencing from the date on which the said sum is raised. Each such half-yearly payment shall be applied firstly in payment of interest computed at the rate of three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum per annum on the amount of principal for the time being outstanding at the beginning of each such half-year, and the balance of such half-yearly payment in reduction of such principal.

(b) By a payment at the end of the tenth year from the date of the raising of the said sum of a sum equal to the amount to which the principal has been reduced in accordance with the preceding paragraph (a) hereof after payment of the aforesaid twenty (20) half-yearly payments.

WHEREAS by Order in Council made on the tenth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, consent was given to the raising by the Dunedin City Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority") of the sum of one hundred thousand pounds (£100,000) (hereinafter called "the said loan") for the purpose of tramway extensions of which an amount of seventeen thousand pounds (£17,000) has not yet been raised:

And whereas by section nine of the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Amendment Act, 1934, the consent given by the said Order in Council was revoked in so far as the authority conferred thereby had not been exercised, and it is not now lawful or competent for the said local authority to borrow any moneys to which

such consent relates except in accordance with the provisions of an Order in Council under section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926:

AMENDMENT No. 47.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the Defence Act, 1909, and its amendments, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby amend in the manner and to the extent set forth in the Schedule hereto the Financial Instructions and Allowance Regulations for the New Zealand Military Forces, published in the *Gazette* dated the sixth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five.

SCHEDULE.

**Financial Instructions and Allowance Regulations for the New Zealand Military Forces.**

1. This regulation may be cited as the Financial Instructions and Allowance Regulations for the New Zealand Military Forces, 1925, Amendment No. 47.

2. This regulation shall be read together with and form part of the Financial Instructions and Allowance Regulations for the New Zealand Military Forces, 1925 (hereinafter called "the principal regulations").

3. This regulation shall come into force on the day following notification in the *Gazette* of the making thereof.

4. Regulation 199 of the principal regulations as amended in *Gazette* No. 40, dated 25th May, 1933, is revoked and the following substituted:—

"199. Pay during sick-leave shall be in accordance with the following Schedule:—

Length of Service.	On Full Pay.	On Half-pay.
Under three months ..	1 week ..	..
Over three months and under six months ..	2 weeks ..	..
Over six months and under nine months ..	1 month ..	..
Over nine months and under five years ..	1 month ..	1 month.
Over five years and under ten years ..	2 months ..	2 months.
Over ten years and under twenty years ..	4 months ..	4 months.
Over twenty years and under thirty years ..	5 months ..	8 months.
Over thirty years ..	6 months ..	12 months.

No exception will be made in the foregoing Schedule, except in the following cases:—

- (a) Sickness resulting directly from the conditions under which the officer or soldier was working.
- (b) Injury sustained by the officer or soldier in the discharge of his duties and through no fault of his own.
- (c) Disability arising out of war service.
- (d) Absence through illness or disability caused by misconduct or venereal disease will be without pay.

In the exceptional cases mentioned above, the matter will be dealt with on its merits as approved by the Minister of Defence."

Alterations in White Leading Beacons.

Position: Lat., 42° 26' S.; long., 171° 12' E. (approx.).  
Alterations: The colour of the white leading beacons will be changed to orange and a black diamond shape erected on each side of the front beacon at a distance of 7 ft., from the

centre-line; a black triangle, apex down, will be painted on the rear beacon.

A red neon light consisting of two 4 ft. tubes, vertically disposed, will be exhibited in the centre-line of each diamond shape.

The existing green light on the front and rear beacons will be replaced by a green neon light consisting of three 6 ft. tubes vertically disposed in the centre-line.

The black shapes and red neon lights in line with the rear beacon and light define the navigable width of the channel at the entrance.

The alterations will be brought into force on the 3rd May.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR MARCH, 1939.

General.—March was a mild month with little wind and about the average amount of sunshine. Droughty conditions prevailed throughout the greater part of the month in most districts. Owing to the preceding two months having been dry, conditions are now serious. In many places there is a shortage of water and, except in a few areas, pastures have been depleted and little growth is taking place. Small crops have done very poorly and in many cases autumn sowings have been impossible. The problem of winter feed for stock is causing grave anxiety, especially since even if rain comes soon it will, in many cases, be too late for much growth to be produced. Though they are beginning to feel the pinch, the condition of stock is not generally bad; lambs are, in many cases, still doing well. The milk yield has declined seriously. The drought appears to be most acute in the Auckland, Marlborough, and Nelson Provinces. Parts of Canterbury, Otago, and Southland, and the high levels in the North Island, have not fared badly. White butterflies have become rather plentiful, but conditions have been unfavourable for most pests.

Rainfall.—According to present reports, rainfall was well below average in all districts. Probably in no previous month has the shortage of rainfall been so universal. The North Island received approximately only a quarter of the average fall. Numbers of places reported the driest March on record, and at Kaipara Heads there was no rain at all. Parts of the South Taranaki Bight area fared better than the remainder of the North Island. South of Nelson and Marlborough the rain shortage ranged, generally, between 20 and 50 per cent.

Temperatures.—Temperatures were everywhere above normal. The departures were not large, the average being under 1½ degrees. Conditions were very uniform and there was an absence of extreme temperatures. There were few frosts, and such as occurred were light.

Sunshine.—The distribution of sunshine was rather variable, some places having considerably more and some considerably less than normal. On the whole it was a fairly average month. Nelson had 244.6, Napier 235.4, and Blenheim 227.8 hours.

Storm Systems.—The month was characterized by almost continuous high pressures and anticyclonic conditions. In only a very few years previously has the average pressure for March been so high. Disturbances which were quite vigorous over Australia or the Tasman Sea became in every case very feeble before reaching New Zealand. When fronts crossed the Dominion they were generally oriented in an approximately west to east direction, which is the least favourable for rain. Southerly wind changes swept northward over the country on several occasions without producing rains of any consequence. Fogs were again rather numerous.

The only depression to produce very widespread rain was one which began as a small but deep cyclone on the south coast of Queensland on the 6th. After moving on to the Central Tasman Sea by the 8th it gradually filled up but by the 12th it had produced general rain. The amount recorded was surprising and most of it far in advance of the centre of the depression. There were many heavy falls south of Nelson and Marlborough in the South Island, and in Wellington, also, there were some good totals. Elsewhere they were mainly light. These rains came at a critical period and, for the time being, the drought appeared to be broken.

After another long fine spell, a deep depression was located over the Central Tasman Sea on the 24th. It was of the type which had been causing drought-breaking rains in successively more eastward parts of Australia and the prospects for rain in the Dominion seemed very favourable. For four days storms raged in the Tasman Sea, with strong southerly gales in the western portion. From the 26th, however, pressure began to fall in southern New Zealand under the influence of some distant disturbance to the southward. By the 28th pressure became quite low in southern districts. But so far as rain was concerned the Dominion fell between two stools. From the night of the 28th to the morning of the 29th pressure rose rapidly, the storm in the Tasman Sea, which by this time was moving northward, was swept away, and though a strong, cold, southerly wind traversed the country it produced extremely little rain. This was a great disappointment.

Thereafter, a very dry type of weather again set in.
