

A PROCLAMATION.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section eight (c) of the Mining Act, 1926, and of every other power and authority enabling me in this behalf, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby, as from the date of the publication hereof in the New Zealand Gazette, withdraw from the Otago Mining District that area of Crown land described in the Schedule hereto, subject to any existing registered mining privileges.

WHEREAS by Order in Council made on the twenty-eighth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, consent was given to the raising by the Mount Albert Borough Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority") of the sum of five hundred and thirty-seven thousand five hundred pounds (£537,500) by a loan to be known as "Roading Loan, 1926," of which the sum of eighty-three thousand seven hundred pounds (£83,700) has not been borrowed, and of the sum of two hundred thousand pounds (£200,000) by a loan to be known as "Drainage Loan, 1926," of which the sum of nineteen thousand five hundred pounds (£19,500) has not been borrowed (hereinafter called "the said loans"):
