3. Utilization of Water and Location of Headworks.

Water shall be used under this license solely for the purpose water snan be used under this neemes solely for the purpose of generating electricity up to a maximum capacity of 3 kilowatts at 230 volts direct current, and shall be taken from an unnamed stream at the point indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 101823, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works.

4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS.

The licensees are hereby authorized, subject to the conditions hereof, to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this license, the positions of the said works being indicated on the said plan P.W.D. 101823:—

(a) Headworks consisting of an intake, water-race, and pipe-lines leading to the water-wheel and power-house hereinafter referred to, giving a static head of approximately 100 ft.

(b) A power-house situated on part Section 4, Block IX, Hope Survey District, with all necessary equipment, including water-turbine or wheel, generators, lightning-arresters, switchboards, switches, and other appliances for generating electricity.

5. System of Supply.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (d) of clause 21–01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935. The generating voltage and the transmission voltage shall be approximately 230 volts direct current.

6. DURATION OF LICENSE.

Unless sooner determined, this license shall continue in force until the 31st day of March, 1960, or until electrical energy is available from an Electric-power Board, or other general public source, whichever is the earlier.

7. RENTAL.

For the purpose of assessing the annual rental payable in respect of this license, the licensees may install a suitable maximum demand indicator to the satisfaction of the Inspecting Engineer of the Public Works Department; and, failing such installation, the rental shall be assessed on the maximum generating capacity of the plant installed. The present plant is rated at 3 kilowatts.
