5. CHARGES ON SALE.

The charges for electrical energy shall not exceed one The charges for electrical energy shall not exceed one shilling (1s.) per unit for lighting purposes and sixpence (6d.) per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes: Provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor-generators for lighting purposes; and provided further that if accounts are paid within fourteen days of due date the charges shall not exceed 9d. per unit for lighting purposes and 4½d. per unit for motor-power, cooking, or heating purposes.
