"Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides:

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto necessary for the maintenance of the said slipway at the site shown on the plan marked M.D. 7925.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the trustees shall pay to the Minister an annual rental of 1s. payable on demand.

4. All persons shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said slipway, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all persons in the Government service acting in the execution of their duties, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said slipway without payment.

6. The trustees shall maintain the said slipway in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at the trustees' own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times, enter upon the said slipway and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last-known address of the trustees in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such slipway requiring the trustees within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the trustees shall with all reasonable speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the trustees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The master of each vessel discharging ballast at the said wharf shall have all such ballast taken away and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the trustees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, and the trustees may be required to remove the said slipway at the trustees' own cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the trustees three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last-known address of the trustees in New Zealand.

12. The trustees shall be liable for any injury which the said slipway may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the trustees' part.

13. In case the trustees shall—

- (1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2) Cease to use or occupy the said slipway for a period of thirty consecutive days;
- (3) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions; or
- (4) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any Act for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy—
