A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section thirty-five of the Public Works Act, 1928, it is provided that in the case of any land taken, purchased, or acquired for a Government work, and not required for that purpose, the Governor-General may, on recommendation by the Minister, by Proclamation declare such land to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1924, and thereupon the land may be administered and disposed of under that Act accordingly :

Now, therefore, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by section thirty-five of the Public Works Act, 1928, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare the land described in the Schedule hereto to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1924.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

THE HON. W. NASH PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section twenty-five of the Naval Defence Act, 1913, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby amend and supplement the regulations referred to in the Schedule hereto as shown therein.

SCHEDULE.

Regulations for the Government and Payment of the New Zealand Naval Forces, 1939.

Article 10 : *Cancel paragraph 2: Renumber paragraph 3.*

Article 20 : *Insert :—*

“**20. Ship’s Agents.**—The Naval Agency and Distribution Act, 1864 (Imperial), shall apply *mutatis mutandis* to the New Zealand Naval Forces as hereinafter modified and in this article is referred to as ‘the said Act.’

“2. Section 22 of the said Act shall not apply to the New Zealand Naval Forces.

“3. All Royal Proclamations and Orders in Council in force under the said Act shall apply *mutatis mutandis* to the New Zealand Naval Forces.

“4. In the application of the said Act to the New Zealand Naval Forces, references therein and in any Proclamations and Orders in Council in force thereunder to the persons, institutions, and matters set out in column (1) of the following table shall be read as references to the persons, institutions, and matters set out in column (2) thereof :—

“5. In pursuance of section 4 of the said Act, and in accordance with Article 675 of the King’s Regulations and Admiralty Instructions, the Commanding Officers of H.M. Ships of the New Zealand Naval Forces now in commission shall forthwith and the Commanding Officers of every ship of the New Zealand Naval Forces hereafter commissioned shall on commissioning appoint a Ship’s Agent so that matters relating to salvage and prize may be dealt with in accordance with the law.

“6. The form of appointment is set out in the said Act and is as follows:—

“*Form of Appointment of Ship's Agent.*

“I, _____, commanding officer of His Majesty's Ship ‘ _____ ’, hereby appoint _____ of _____ to be the ship's agent for the purposes of the Naval Agency and Distribution Act, 1864.

“7. Commanding Officers of ships of the New Zealand Naval Forces are to make themselves thoroughly acquainted with sections 557 to 568 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, which applies to H.M. Ships of the New Zealand Naval Forces in the same way as to other of H.M. Ships. The procedure laid down in King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions, Chapter XXV, must be strictly observed in all cases when H.M. Ships of the New Zealand Naval Forces are engaged in the salvage of merchant ships.

“8. Arrangements have been made to obtain Admiralty sanction for making salvage claims in regard to H.M. Ships of the New Zealand Naval Forces. Such ships, if employed on the New Zealand Station, are to forward the reports required by King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions, Article 896, clauses 4 and 5, to Navy Office. Ships employed on other stations are to forward these reports to the Commander-in-Chief for transmission to the Secretary of the Admiralty, and furnish a copy to Navy Office.”

Article 51, paragraph (7) (a): *Cancel, and substitute:—*

“(a) Ratings qualifying for Mechanician, Observer's Mate, and Air Gunner will be required to re-engage to serve for a period of three years from the date of expiration of their first twelve years' engagement.”

Article 59: *Cancel, and substitute:—*

“59. Entry from Naval Reserves, Military, or Air Territorial Forces.—

All candidates for entry into the New Zealand Naval Forces are to be questioned as to whether they are serving in any unit of the New Zealand Military or Air Territorial Forces, the Royal Naval Reserve (New Zealand), or the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve (New Zealand).

“2. Members of the Military or Air Territorial Forces may be entered in the New Zealand Naval Forces without the prior consent of the Army or Air Departments respectively, but the prior consent of the New Zealand Naval Board must be obtained to enter members of the Royal Naval Reserve (New Zealand) or Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve (New Zealand).

“3. Where members of the Military or Air Territorial Forces are entered in the New Zealand Naval Forces, the Director of Naval Recruiting is to notify the Commanding Officer of the unit to which the man belongs that he has been accepted, giving the date of entry.”

Article 93, paragraph (9): *Insert:—*

“(9) *Pension Leave.*—The provisions of King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions, Article 651, are not applicable to personnel serving in the New Zealand Naval Forces.”

Article 132, paragraph (2) (f): *Cancel, and substitute:—*

“(f) The Naval Board may require the complete renewal of all applications as and when considered desirable. On these occasions the declaration on form N.Z.N.F. 21 need not be made in the presence of or signed by the Commanding Officer provided that payment in respect of the same persons has already been authorized and that eligibility for the allowance is not due to changed circumstances.

“The particulars given are to be compared with those on the forms in the possession of the Accountant Officer or attached to the rating's service certificate. If any irregularities are found, the person concerned is to be called upon for an explanation and any adjustments which may be necessary in the allowances already credited are to be effected in his account.”

Article 176, paragraph (4): *Insert:—*

“(4) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph 2, the Naval Board, in time of war or emergency, may extend payment of hard-lying money, at rates not exceeding the full scale in New Zealand Naval Regulations, Article 161, paragraph 3, section I, to the crews of small craft taken up for naval service.”

Article 260, paragraph (4): *Cancel, and substitute* :—

“(4) *General*.—Should an officer’s service in the New Zealand Naval Forces be terminated owing to his misconduct or unsatisfactory service or should an officer voluntarily withdraw from service in the New Zealand Naval Forces prior to the completion of the period for which lent, the Government do not hold themselves responsible for his return passage or, whether normally eligible or otherwise, for the return passage of his wife and family.

“An officer who, at his own request, reverts to the Royal Navy prior to the expiration of his period of loan service in the New Zealand Naval Forces will be required to defray all expenses incurred in connection with the passage to New Zealand of his relief unless very strong reasons are put forward why such charges should not be made.”

Article 291, paragraph (1): *Cancel, and substitute* :—

“**291 Subsistence Allowance**.—The following are the rates at which subsistence allowance is payable when travelling on duty :—

Article 360 : *Cancel, and substitute* :—

“**360. Communications to and from the Naval Board**.—All communications and orders of the Naval Board to the Commodore Commanding and ships of the New Zealand Naval Forces will be issued through the Naval Secretary.

“2. The Assistant Naval Secretary is the deputy of the Naval Secretary and in the absence of the Naval Secretary acts for him in all respects. By virtue of his office the Assistant Naval Secretary is authorized in his discretion to sign memoranda ‘for Naval Secretary.’

“3. Communications for the Naval Board are to be addressed to

“ ‘The Naval Secretary,
“ Navy Office,
“ Wellington.’ ”

“4. Telegrams for the Naval Board are to be addressed to

“ ‘Naval,
“ Wellington.’ ”

Article 361 : *Cancel, and substitute* :—

“**361. Correspondence** : *General*.—The rules for the conduct of correspondence laid down in the King’s Regulations and Admiralty Instructions, Articles 874 to 886, are generally to be observed, except where at variance with orders issued by the Naval Board or the Commodore Commanding (*vide* Article 3).

“2. All letters and minutes addressed to the Naval Secretary are to be forwarded in duplicate, and are to be numbered.

“3. *Correspondence on Squadron Matters*.—No Commanding Officer shall communicate direct with the Naval Board on matters of importance, or in which principle, secrecy, or controversy is involved, unless he is specially instructed so to do. All such correspondence is to be addressed to the Commodore Commanding who, should he think fit, will refer the matter with his remarks to the Naval Board for their information or consideration. Should the junior officer consider that the matter is one which should be brought to the notice of the Naval Board sooner than the report could reach the Navy Office if made through the Commodore Commanding, he is still to address his report to the Commodore Commanding, but is to transmit a copy direct to Navy Office, informing the Commodore Commanding that he has done so.

" 4. Commanding Officers may communicate direct with the Naval Secretary on routine and unimportant matters.

" 5. *Correspondence from the Captain-in-Charge, Auckland.*—As Superintendent of the Naval Repair Yard, as officer in command of civil establishments, and in his office as Director of Naval Recruiting, the Captain-in-Charge, Auckland, is to communicate direct with the Naval Board and with the recruiting authorities in the Dominion of New Zealand. On all other matters he is to communicate with the Commodore Commanding the New Zealand Squadron.

" 6. *Correspondence affecting Imperial Vessels.*—Correspondence and messages on matters affecting Imperial Interests and Imperial vessels are to be addressed through the usual Service channels to the Naval Secretary for the Chief of the Naval Staff.

" 7. *Questions relating to the Fleet Air Arm.*—The administration of the Fleet Air Arm is vested in the Naval Board who will regard the Air Board as advisers on all technical matters.

" 8. Correspondence on the Fleet Air Arm is to follow the same procedure as that on Naval matters.

" 9. *Correspondence from Naval Base Officers and the Armament Supply Officer.*—The Manager of the Base, the Base Stores Officer, and the Armament Supply Officer will, for purposes of correspondence, be regarded as principal officers, and Article 215 of the Home Dockyard Regulations is to apply to their correspondence. The terms 'Admiralty,' 'Superintendent,' and 'Heads of Departments at the Admiralty' are for this purpose to be understood to mean 'Navy Office, Wellington,' 'Captain-in-Charge, Auckland,' and 'Naval Secretary,' respectively.

" 10. *Questions relating to Accounts, Pay, and Stores in H.M. Ships.*—With reference to K.R. and A.I., Articles 876 and 877, Accountant Officers of H.M. Ships and Establishments may communicate direct with the Naval Secretary on purely routine matters connected with cash accounts, pay, travelling-expenses, deferred pay, and pensions, insurance, taxation, savings-banks, stores, and store accounts, and similar subjects, but direct communication is to be limited to matters which do not involve any modification of, or exception to, the regulations, or any questions of principle, discipline, or controversy, or any appeal against Naval Board decisions.

" 11. *Communication with other Government Departments.*—Communications on matters referred to in K.R. and A.I., Article 13, should be made through the proper channels to the Navy Office, but this instruction should not be regarded as precluding direct correspondence with officers of other Services, District Treasury Officers, District Engineers of the Public Works Department, District Supplies and Tenders Committees, Air Department, &c., on matters of administrative detail, or as may be necessary, in order to formulate proposals or to give effect to decisions.

" 12. Direct communication with the High Commissioner for New Zealand is to be restricted to occasions on which ships of the New Zealand Naval Forces are at United Kingdom ports.

" 13. *Departmental Correspondence by Navy Office.*—By virtue of his office the Assistant Naval Secretary is authorized, in his discretion, to conduct and sign correspondence in his capacity as Controller of Finance and Stores, on subjects relating to these offices.

" 14. The Director of Naval Reserves is authorized to conduct correspondence in his own name with the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve Divisions, and with personnel of the Reserves, except on questions of policy, finance, or stores."

Article 390, paragraphs (3) and (4): *Cancel, and substitute:—*

" 3. All Medical Officers' Journals and Medical Returns are to be forwarded to the Director for examination and transmission to the Naval Secretary. He will maintain medical records and take steps to co-ordinate the Naval medical administration within the port of Auckland to the best advantage under the authority of the Captain Superintendent. He will prepare draft regulations as required on medical matters.

" 4. Correspondence on medical matters intended for the consideration of the Naval Board is to be forwarded to the Director who will forward it with his observations thereon to the Naval Secretary.

" 5. The Naval Board will communicate with the Director by Board minute on any medical matter upon which they desire to seek his advice."

Article 391 : *Cancel, and substitute :—*

391. Medical Report on an Officer or Rating prior to Discharge or Reversion to the Royal Navy.—Each officer and rating serving in the New Zealand Naval Forces is to be examined on the following occasions by the medical officer of his ship or establishment to determine whether he suffers from any disability either attributable to or aggravated by his service in the New Zealand Naval Forces :—

“ (i) On final discharge to shore whether he belongs to the New Zealand Naval Forces permanently or is on loan.

“ (ii) Before reversion to the Royal Navy on completion of his period of loan.

“ (iii) On completion of his Royal Navy engagement but continuing to serve under a loan agreement.

“ 2. The medical and dental examination is to be carried out as laid down in Confidential Admiralty Fleet Order 1990/24.

“ 3. Form N.Z.D. 50 is to be completed at this examination in accordance with the instructions on the form and forwarded to the Director of Medical Services for transmission to the Naval Secretary. The forms are to be forwarded to Navy Office in duplicate in respect of all officers and ratings who have served in the Royal Navy.

“ 4. Medical officers are to exercise the greatest care in completing the form and to ensure that all details are correctly furnished. The Naval Board should be in a position to know the exact nature and degree of any disability at the time of the examination, answers to questions 6 to 9 being framed accordingly.

“ 5. Form N.Z.D. 50 is not required when an officer or rating is invalided from the Naval Service.

“ 6. When personnel are found to be suffering from any disability it will be necessary to obtain the services of a second medical officer. When no other ship is in company at ports on the New Zealand Station the local surgeon and agent should be employed. When a ship is paying off in England application should be made for the services of a medical officer to be loaned from the Naval Barracks at the port where the ship is lying.

“ 7. *Medical and Dental History Sheets.*—Medical and dental history sheets are to be completed to show the results of the above examinations. Where the ratings continue to serve in the New Zealand Naval Forces the history sheets are to continue in use, but on discharge to shore in New Zealand or reversion to the Royal Navy they are to be forwarded to Navy Office through the Director of Medical Services. History sheets in respect of personnel who have completed their Royal Navy engagement but who continue to serve in the New Zealand Naval Forces will be forwarded on their discharge to shore in England to the Medical Director-General, Admiralty, by Navy Office.”
