IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the Defence Act, 1909, and its amendments, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby amend in the manner and to the extent set forth in the Schedule hereto the Financial Instructions and Allowance Regulations for the New Zealand Military Forces, published in the *Gazette* dated the sixth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five.

1. This regulation may be cited as the Financial Instructions and Allowance Regulations for the New Zealand Military Forces, 1925, Amendment No. 51.

2. This regulation shall be read together with and form part of the Financial Instructions and Allowance Regulations for the New Zealand Military Forces, 1925 (hereinafter called “the principal regulations”).

3. The principal regulations are amended by inserting therein next after Regulation 129D, the following additional regulation and heading:—

“ACCOMMODATION WHEN TRAVELLING.

“129E. Members of the N.Z. Army Nursing Service shall, when travelling on duty, be entitled to the same class of railway and steamer accommodation as by these regulations is prescribed for officers of the Territorial Force.”

The above estimates may be compared with last season's actual average yields, which were: Wheat, 29.40 bushels; oats, 47.86 bushels; and barley, 40.03 bushels.

In accordance with the above estimates, the total yield of wheat for the season 1939-40 should be approximately 8,370,000 bushels, as against an ascertained yield of 5,564,136 bushels for the season 1938-39.

The area from which oats were threshed for the five seasons ending with 1938-39 averaged 20 per cent. of the total area under that crop. Assuming that a similar proportion is threshed this year, the total yield of grain should be approximately 2,240,000 bushels, as against a yield of 2,604,817 bushels for the season 1938-39.

On a similar assumption in regard to barley, the total yield of grain should be approximately 870,000 bushels, as against 1,076,774 bushels for the season 1938-39.
