

In accordance with the above estimates, the total yield of wheat for the season 1939–40 should be approximately 8,370,000 bushels, as against an ascertained yield of 5,564,136 bushels for the season 1938–39.

The area from which oats were threshed for the five seasons ending with 1938-39 averaged 20 per cent. of the total area under that crop. Assuming that a similar proportion is threshed this year, the total yield of grain should be approximately 2,240,000 bushels, as against a yield of 2,604,817 bushels for the season 1938-39.

On a similar assumption in regard to barley, the total yield of grain should be approximately 870,000 bushels, as against 1,076,774 bushels for the season 1938–39.
