**Regulations for the Government of the Royal Naval Reserves (New Zealand Division), 1937, Part I.**

**Article 73 :** *Cancel, and substitute :—*

**73. Obligatory Naval Training : Commander and Captain.**—Courses in gunnery (21 days), torpedo (21 days), navigation (7 days), and in signals, submarine, and aircraft (14 days), within six years of promotion to Commander.

These courses will, as far as the facilities or opportunities permit, be those laid down for the Royal Navy Senior Officers' Technical Course.

NOTES.

(i) Requalifying courses in these subjects may be carried out at intervals of not less than five years from the date of qualification or requalification in each particular subject.

(ii) Commanders and Captains are not permitted to carry out any courses or training other than the Senior Officers' Technical Course and the War and Tactical Courses.

**Article 75 :** *Cancel.*

**Article 104, 2 (a) :** *Insert :—*

2. (a) If, owing to active employment in his profession, or lack of adequate facilities for training, or for any other reason beyond his control an officer (other than a Captain or Commander of the Executive Branch) has been unable to perform his training or courses with regularity, he may, on completing the training due within four years in the case of officers whose training is biennial, or within six years in the case of officers whose training period is triennial, from the termination of the year in which he last performed training or courses, in the discretion of the Naval Board, be allowed to draw his training fees due to date.

If he fails to perform his training within such period, all training fees for that period, not already earned, will be forfeited, and he will, if he eventually performs training or courses, become entitled only to draw his fees for the current calendar year.

**Article 104, 2 (b) :** *Insert :—*

2. (b) Captains and Commanders of the Executive Branch will be entitled to training fees at the increased rate as from the date of promotion to the rank of Commander, and for five years subsequent to the 1st day of January following such promotion, irrespective of the completion of the courses to be carried out under Article 73. Those who have completed these courses will thereafter be entitled to training fees without further training. Those who fail to complete these courses will not be entitled to any further training fees. If, however, they eventually complete the courses, they will become entitled only to training fees for the current calendar year and for subsequent years.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR APRIL, 1940.

General Notes.—April was unseasonable throughout the Dominion, with unusually cold temperatures prevailing. Frequent southerly winds made conditions very unpleasant at times, particularly on the east coast. Rains sustained reasonable growth in the North Island, but cold night temperatures tended to counterbalance the full value of the showers. In the south the position is rather varied, but about mid-Canterbury it seems to be worst, with many of the root crops too badly affected previously by drought and insect pests to make much recovery. In other districts, however, grass is still making fair growth, and the turnip and other crops are very satisfactory. Cultivation has proceeded well and the rains have helped on the germination and early growth of autumn-sown oats and wheat. There is an absence of disease and stock are in good condition to face the winter.

Rainfall.—There were many rain days through the month, but totals were generally not excessive. Most of the rain came as showers and these were mainly light. This showery type of weather made the month's rainfall distribution very patchy, but for the major portion of the North Island as well as Westland and Otago the tendency was to be drier than normal. Most of the excesses occurred between Canterbury and East Cape.

Temperatures were below normal in all districts, the departures averaging 3° F. to 4° F. At several stations the average temperature reached record low values, so that for the whole country the month was comparable with the coldest of Aprils. Frosts were frequent, some being quite sharp and damaging vegetable crops.

Sunshine.—While sunshine figures were good in Auckland and Westland, they were close to the average in Canterbury and below average elsewhere, with the greatest deficits occurring in Hawke's Bay.

Weather Sequence.—At the commencement of the month, rain which had already developed in the far south extended northwards with the advance of a south-westerly change behind a trough of low pressure. Temperatures were cool and snow fell in the southern ranges. Meanwhile an anticyclone had been moving from the west and was over New Zealand on the 4th. The nights were clear and frosty. Weak depressions passing in the south resulted in intermittent rain in the Alps and in western districts, while northerly to westerly winds became strong, especially in the central areas. On the 7th a fresh south-westerly change brought cold and showery weather to most of the country. With a high-pressure system over the North Island during the 8th and 9th, skies were rather cloudy and some occasional rain occurred, the heavier falls being in the central provinces. On the 10th a disturbance with lowest pressure to the south passed across New Zealand. South-westerly winds predominated and the weather was cloudy with fairly general intermittent rain.

As a new anticyclone extended towards New Zealand on the 11th conditions were cold and wet in eastern areas where strong southerly winds prevailed. While the high-pressure system was centred in the south a disturbance formed over the North Island with fresh westerlies to the north and moderate to strong south-easterlies to the south. Eastern districts had a continuance of unsettled weather, the larger falls being in the Hawke's Bay - Poverty Bay region, but conditions improved on the 14th.

Another complex depression from the Tasman Sea affected the country from the 15th-17th, when northerlies prevailed and most places had some rain or drizzle which was heavier in the west. Before the trough had moved off New Zealand on the 18th a cyclonic disturbance developed in the north and moved south-eastward. Strong westerly winds blew over the Auckland Peninsula and fresh south-easterlies elsewhere. An extensive anticyclone over South Australia then moved slowly towards New Zealand. Conditions were cool and unsettled, while southerlies increased to gale force about and north of Cook Strait and squally weather prevailed on the east coast. There followed a considerable improvement which was almost general by the 22nd when the anticyclone was over New Zealand, and here it remained almost stationary for several days.

Conditions became unsettled in the west when a new disturbance reached the South Island on the 24th. This was followed by a low-pressure trough, which resulted in fresh south to south-west winds with dull and showery weather. After a short clearance there was an outbreak of southerly gales and cold, showery weather. Snow fell on the ranges of both Islands. Winds soon moderated, however, and although skies continued rather cloudy, the arrival of the next anticyclone gave a more settled type of weather.

**BRITISH OFFICIAL WIRELESS MESSAGES TO  
MERCHANT SHIPS.**

Reprint of Admiralty Notice No. 3 of 1940, amended in Area 10 by Admiralty Notice No. 732 and in Area 11 by the New Zealand Naval Board.

Former Notices are hereby cancelled.

This organization provides for the transmission of important messages to British merchantmen in any part of the world on occasions when such messages may be of vital importance to their safety and welfare.

From the details given below it will be seen that arrangements have been made for such messages to be transmitted at certain scheduled times by Rugby and other selected British W/T stations in various parts of the world.

2. The world has been divided into certain areas (*vide* chart appended) and collective call signs have been introduced for (i) all British merchant ships, and (ii) British merchant ships in a particular area. These call signs are as shown in the following table:—

(b) From Falklands—

On 8,450 kc/s (35.5 metres)—at 0410 and 1610 G.M.T.

(c) From certain medium and high power W/T Stations abroad—

Between 150 kc/s (2,000 metres) and 90.9 kc/s (3,300 metres), and in certain cases on higher frequencies—at the times shown in Column 6 of the Schedule.

(d) From certain W/T Stations—

On 500 kc/s (600 metres) or, in the case of stations in Areas 1 and 2, on their working wave—at any time.

4. A list of the stations included in the organization showing the areas for which they will transmit and the waves on which messages will be broadcast is shown in the Schedule. As far as possible the times 0400 and 1600 G.M.T. have been fixed for transmissions from stations under paragraph 3 (c)

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above, since, in all areas of the world, one or other of these times will fall within a period when ships with one operator are keeping watch. Times at which messages will be broadcast from 500 kc/s (600 metres) stations are not included in the Schedule, since merchant ships keep normal watch on this wave, and messages may, therefore, be broadcast from these stations at any time. If messages are broadcast by stations shown in paragraphs 3 (c) and (d) above outside the single operator periods of their areas, steps will be taken to ensure that these messages are received by ships only keeping watch during single operator periods. Such messages, therefore, in the case of the medium and high power stations which have two or more broadcast periods a day will be retransmitted at the next routine broadcast. In the case of the 500 kc/s stations such messages will be retransmitted during the next following single operator period for their area or areas concerned. This organization results in four special 500 kc/s periods a day being available in any area, when broadcast messages may be received, in addition to such messages being made on receipt by the stations concerned.

5. Messages containing information affecting British merchant ships will be broadcast—

- (a) By Admiralty to all British merchant ships in all areas ;
- (b) By Admiralty to British merchant ships in any particular area or areas ;
- (c) By Naval Authorities abroad to British merchant ships in the areas for which they are responsible.

(ii) Messages under (a) will be broadcast from Rugby, Oxford, and Falklands with the call sign GBMS, and will also be broadcast with the same call sign by the W/T stations concerned shown in column 3 of the Schedule.

(iii) Messages under (b), in addition to being broadcast by Admiralty, will be broadcast from Rugby and/or Oxford and/or Falklands, as necessary; they will also be broadcast by the W/T stations of the area or areas concerned using the appropriate call sign. In some cases the message will be broadcast from particular W/T stations only.

(iv) Messages broadcast from the W/T stations in Areas 1 and 2 in accordance with paragraph 3 (d) may be transmitted on the Working Wave of the station after a preliminary call on 500 kc/s (600 metres). After such call a list of messages to be broadcast will be given as shown in paragraph 6 (a), and ships will be told to change to the Working Wave. Ships are to revert to 500 kc/s (600 metres) as soon as they have received all new messages.

(v) Messages under (c) will be broadcast by the W/T stations shown in column 3 of the Schedule, using the call sign for Merchant Ships in that area (*vide* paragraph 2 above). Such messages may also be broadcast from Rugby and Oxford and/or Falklands with the same call sign.

(vi) Messages may also be communicated to small ships not fitted with W/T by certain shore Signal Stations.

6. Messages referred to in paragraph 3 (a), (b), and (c) are broadcast as follows :—

(i) The W/T station will start at routine periods by broadcasting the list of messages for transmission, together with the call signs for which they are intended, in the sequence in which they will be transmitted. The messages are normally identified by their times of origin only, but should it be considered necessary, as in the case of more than one message bearing the same time of origin from different authorities, the name of the originator will be added, for example, 0216/6 from C.-in-C. East Indies.

(ii) All new traffic GBMS will then be broadcast, each message being sent twice. On completion, traffic for GBMS which has previously been transmitted at one or more routines is broadcast, each message being sent once only.

(iii) When all traffic for GBMS has thus been broadcast, traffic for individual areas will be broadcast in the numerical sequence of areas, new traffic in each case being broadcast first and sent twice, followed by messages previously transmitted for that area, sent once only. In the case of a message for two or more areas (other than GBMS messages) this message will only be broadcast with those for the lowest numbered area concerned.

(iv) *Example.*—Rugby (GBR) has the following messages for transmission at a routine :—

For all British Merchant Vessels. Messages 0645/6, 1720/6, 0241/7.

For all British Merchant Vessels in Area 1. Messages 1131/6, 2358/6.

For all British Merchant Vessels in Areas 1 and 6. Messages 1827/6.

For all British Merchant Vessels in Area 3B. Messages 1127/5, 0912/7.

For all British Merchant Vessels in Area 10. Messages 0916/6, 0436/7.

Of these, Messages 0241/7, 2358/6, 0912/7, and 0436/7 are new traffic; remaining messages have previously been transmitted at one or more routines.

(v) In the case of GBMS traffic broadcast from 500 kc/s stations during single operator periods, the messages for transmission will not be indicated at the beginning of the broadcast (except as shown in paragraph 5 (iv) for Areas 1 and 2), but new traffic will always be broadcast first, each message being sent twice; repetitions of previous transmissions will follow, each message being sent once only.

(vi) In Area 1 500 kc/s stations will normally broadcast GBMS traffic approximately one hour after the times shown for traffic list in the Admiralty List of Wireless Signals, Vol. I, and in Area 2, one hour after the commencement of single operator periods, since certain routine broadcasts on other frequencies occur at the beginning of these periods.

(vii) Similarly, in other areas, the times of broadcasting GBMS traffic from 500 kc/s stations during single operator periods will be so adjusted as not to coincide with routine broadcasts of GBMS traffic from other stations in these areas. Where interference between local stations is likely to occur, the times will as far as possible be staggered.

7. The messages from the Admiralty to all areas will be issued in alphabetical sequence thus: "Admiralty Message A," "Admiralty Message B," &c. After lettered message Z the sequence will be AA, AB, &c., to AZ, thereafter BA, BB to BZ, and so on. Messages to all areas not made by W/T but passed to Merchant Ships via Shore Authorities will also belong to this series and be similarly lettered. For example, messages BA and BC might be made by W/T and message BB passed only via Shore Authorities. This is to enable merchant ships to check that they have not missed any messages in the series.

Any messages which have been missed should on no account be asked for by W/T. They should be obtained by V/S from H.M. Ships or other British merchant vessels or by personal application to the British Naval Representative or Consular authorities at the next port of call.

#### SCHEDULE.

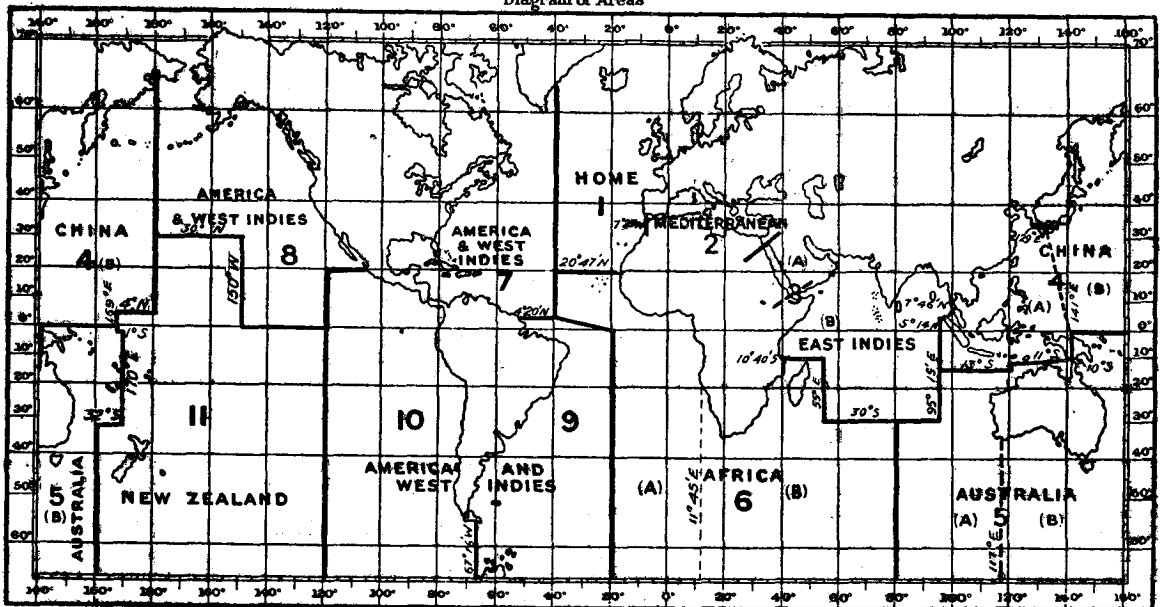
