Any member who desires to resign his membership and forthwith to propose a candidate for membership in his stead (or to cause such a candidate to be proposed by some other member) shall lodge with the Secretary notice in writing of his resignation and at the same time submit in writing, signed either by himself or by some other member, a proposal for the election of such candidate. In the event of such candidate being rejected, the member may propose or have so proposed another candidate or candidates until some candidate shall have been elected. Pending the election of such candidate in the place of such member such member shall retain his membership and all the privileges and obligations thereof but so soon as a candidate proposed in his stead shall have been elected the resignation of such member shall thereupon take effect. shall thereupon take effect.

Add the following as subsection (a):—

- (a) Any member who desires to cease carrying on business as a sharebroker but desires meantime to retain his membership shall adopt the following procedure:—

If, after any member has given such notice as hereinbefore provided and before any candidate is elected in his stead, such member shall engage in business as a sharebroker either on his own account or in partnership with or in employment by any other sharebroker or shall take or claim to take any part in the affairs of the Exchange the Committee may forthwith by notice in writing end and determine the right of such member to propose or have proposed a candidate for election to membership in his stead and may by such notice terminate the membership of such member of such member
