Declaring certain Territories to be Enemy Countries for the Purposes of the Enemy Property Emergency Regulations 1939, and the Enemy Trading Emergency Regulations 1939.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Enemy Property Emergency Regulations 1939, and the Enemy Trading Emergency Regulations 1939, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare the whole of French territory in Europe (including Corsica); Algeria, the French Zone of Morocco, French Somaliland, Tunisia, and the Principality of Monaco, to be enemy countries for the purposes of the Enemy Property Emergency Regulations 1939, and the Enemy Trading Emergency Regulations 1939; and I do also declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the twenty-third day of September, one thousand nine hundred and forty.
