The Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Amendment Act, 1939.—Partial Cancellation of Registration of Industrial Union and Partial Cancellation of

WHEREAS in respect of a discontinuance of employment by members of the Wellington Tobacco Factory Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, I am satisfied that such discontinuance has caused or is likely to cause serious loss or inconvenience and that it has been brought about wholly or partly by some mombers.

Now, therefore, I, Patrick Charles Webb, Minister of Labour, do hereby give notice that in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon me by section 2 of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration

Amendment Act, 1939, I do hereby cancel in respect of the Borough of Petone the registration of the Wellington Tobacco Factory Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, registered number 1530, as from the date of the publication of this notice in the Gazette.
