ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 13th day of November, 1940.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the One Tree Hill Borough Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority") proposes, pursuant to the terms of a requisition issued under section twenty-two of the Health Act, 1920, to raise the sum of thirty thousand pounds (£30,000) by a loan to be known as "Water-supply Loan, 1940" (hereinafter called "the said loan"), for the purpose of providing for the construction of an additional reservoir, the provision of a new water-main from the pumping-station to the additional reservoir, and the provision of a larger second pump in addition to the one in use at present:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said loan for the said purpose up to the amount of thirty thousand pounds (£30,000), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

(1) The term for which the said loan or any part thereof may be raised shall not exceed twenty-five (25) years.

(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding four pounds (£4) per centum per annum.

(3) The said local authority shall, before raising the said loan or any part thereof, make provision for the repayment thereof by establishing a sinking fund under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, or under such other statutory enactment as may be applicable, and shall thereafter make payments to such sinking fund at intervals of not more than one year, at a rate or rates which shall not be less than two pounds

(b) The right of the wife and family of an officer to a free passage will be forfeited—

- (i) If they do not leave England within three months of the date of departure of the officer; or
- (ii) If there is an intention that they shall not remain in New Zealand during his full period on loan.

The right to a return passage will also be forfeited—

- (i) If the wife and family return to England before the term of the officer's service expires; or
- (ii) If they remain in New Zealand for six months after the officer has departed from the Dominion for reversion to the Royal Navy.

RADIATION FROM RADIO RECEIVERS.

ATTENTION is directed to the fact that it is not permissible to operate receivers in such manner that, when in an oscillating condition, radiation is emitted from the receiving aerial. While it is necessary to avoid such radiation at all times in order to avoid interference, it is imperative that it should not be allowed to take place in war time.

This especially applies to frequencies in the neighbourhood of 500 kc/s.

2. As a general rule, the only types of receiver liable to cause radiation are—

- (a) Those in which reaction is used in the first stage. Receivers of this type must be replaced by more modern types.
- (b) Those in which the reaction stage is preceded by a single H.F. stage of obsolete design, using, for example, a triode valve. This type will be very much less troublesome than (a) and may be found to give no appreciable radiation. This can be easily verified by setting the receiver in oscillation on a particular frequency and listening in on another receiver (*e.g.*, on a nearby ship in port) adjusted for CW reception.

3. The following types of receiver, in general, do not set up appreciable radiation—

- (c) Receivers (any type) not possessing reaction, in which a separate heterodyne generator is used for reception of CW signals.
- (d) Receivers of fairly modern design in which the reacting stage is preceded by an efficient H.F. amplifying stage using screen or double screen valves.

4. In certain cases it will be found that receivers of category (c) above have been modified locally to introduce reaction so as to give increased signal strength and higher selectivity. This, of course, brings them under the category of offending receivers listed under paragraph 2 above. Such modifications are strictly forbidden and must in all such cases be removed.

5. The master of a ship is held responsible that no private broadcast receiver capable of radiation is used at sea by any passenger or member of the crew.

The following rules must therefore be strictly observed:—

- (a) Every broadcast receiver used on board ship must be notified to the master.

- (b) Each receiver must be checked by the Radio Officer or other competent authority to see if it falls within categories 2 (a) or 2 (b) above, tests being carried out where necessary as indicated under 2 (b); in this case, listening for interference could be carried out on the ship's W/T receiver.
- (c) Receivers falling under categories 2 (a) must on no account be used.

TESTING OF MERCHANT SHIPS' RADIO TRANSMITTERS.

OWING to the fact that in war time ships' transmitters may be unused over long periods, a fault may develop which may not be discovered until it is required to use the transmitter in an emergency.

In order to overcome this difficulty vessels arriving at Ports in New Zealand may test their transmitters with the permission of the Customs Authority, after the latter have boarded the vessel and before the wireless room is sealed by them. Such transmissions as may be necessary to satisfy the operator that his apparatus is working correctly should be made as indicated in the first paragraph of section 77 of the Postmaster-General's Handbook for Wireless Operators, *i.e.*, they should not be continued for more than 10 seconds and should be composed of a series of GTST's: *On no account, however*, is the ship's call sign to be transmitted but the call sign GTST is to be used by all ships when testing in this manner. No attempt to establish communication with any other station is to be made.

While at sea, deposition of moisture on the transmitter may have an adverse effect on its performance if it should be required, and this may to a certain extent be guarded against by running up the transmitter machine and lighting the valve filaments for half an hour every twelve hours. In order to guard against accidental transmission while this is being done, the "send-receive" switch should be placed in the "receive" position.

NOTE.—Two strong north-westerly gales were experienced, that of the 24th reaching force 9 on the Beaufort Scale. It was a very boisterous and stormy day, and in the afternoon a gust of 77 miles per hour was recorded at Kelburn. On the night of the 27th another strong north-west gale blew up and at 11.50 p.m. a gust of 72 miles per hour was recorded. Light hail was experienced on the 9th.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR OCTOBER.

General Notes.—There was much more wind during this October than in the months immediately preceding, although the windiness was not unusual for the season. The gales blowing on the 27th and the 28th were strong over a wide area, causing extensive damage to trees, telegraph poles, and numerous small buildings, besides shifting the dry top-soil from farm lands in the South Island. Windy conditions have produced some yellowing in Canterbury wheat crops and have been detrimental to orchards. The weather went through a variety of rapid changes, but, generally speaking, the month was sunny and rather cool, satisfactory growth being maintained although some of the rainfall was too intense to give the maximum benefit to the ground.

Rainfall did not depart greatly from normal over most of the country. The outstanding deviations were in eastern districts south of Christchurch and in the far south, where rainfall was extremely light and where dry north-westerlies have further accentuated the deficiency. Totals were in excess in the west and about the high country of the South Island. In the north the distribution was erratic but the surpluses were confined chiefly to the Waikato, Northern Taranaki, and the region from Hawke's Bay to East Cape. Severe thunderstorms over the northern portions of the North Island interrupted power and telephone services on the 1st. Noteworthy were the heavy rains in the southern ranges which culminated in serious flooding in Westland on the 18th and again in Southland on the 28th, when several main roadways became impassable.

Temperatures were a little below normal except in the dry area south of Christchurch where several warm days resulted from föhn winds (or "north-westers"). Throughout the month there were several moderate frosts which checked, and in some cases damaged, tender vegetable crops.

Sunshine.—Most stations received the average amount of sunshine or more. Auckland and Timaru had excesses of about 50 hours, but Napier had the highest total corresponding to an average of 8 hours daily throughout the month.

Weather sequence.—For the first two days, as a cyclonic disturbance crossed over the North Island, strong southerlies prevailed and considerable rain fell, but conditions improved with rising pressures in the south. On the 4th an old disturbance became more active in the north and caused strong south-easterly winds with some rain in the far north.

An anticyclone was over the North Tasman Sea and New Zealand on the 6th, but as a disturbance advanced over the country during the 7th to 9th north-westerly winds were replaced by fresh southerlies, accompanied by snow on the ranges. Most districts received some precipitation during this period, very heavy rain being experienced in the East Cape region.

From the 10th to the 19th the westerly type of situation persisted, winds varying between north-west and south-west and fluctuating considerably in force. Remarkably little rain fell with the earlier disturbances in the series but the weather became increasingly dull until the 16th and 17th when very heavy rain fell in and west of the Southern Alps, so that the west coast rivers were in heavy flood while the Canterbury rivers were running well above their normal level. At the same time there were a number of north-westerly or westerly gales, and central districts also experienced some of the heavy rain on the 18th.

On the 20th an anticyclone extended over New Zealand from the west and the weather was fine though cooler ; but under the influence of a depression from the South Tasman Sea conditions became unsettled in Westland during the 22nd. On the two succeeding days further substantial rain occurred in and west of the Alps, while north-westerly gales were blowing in many places from Taranaki and Wellington southward. There was little rain to the east but a southerly set in, bringing cold and showery conditions to most districts and some snow to the high country.

After a rapid but short-lived improvement the next disturbance arrived in the south on the 27th and intensified, with the result that north-westerly winds attained strong gale force about central New Zealand and over the South Island. Further extensive rain occurred in western districts, with heavy falls in the high country of the South Island as well as in parts of the North Island. The downpour in the southern lakes district resulted in damaging floods in Southland. From the 29th onward south-westerlies predominated and fine weather prevailed as New Zealand became enveloped by an anticyclone.
