(c) The appointment of an Industrial Committee not exceeding ten members in manner to be prescribed

by the proposed special regulations.

2. The Industry Licensing (Footwear-manufacture) Notice 1939, will continue in force with the consequence that the industry will be able to be carried on only pursuant to a license issued under Part III of the said Act and in conformity with the terms and conditions of such license.

3. The Minister will respectfully recommend the Governor-General to make regulations in the terms set out in the Schedule hereto (herein called "the proposed special regulations") and will move the Executive Council to give its advice and consent to the making of the proposed special

4. In accordance with the provisions of section 9 of the said Act, the regulations in relation to the plan as finally approved by the Minister will not be brought into force unless the Governor-General in Council is satisfied that the material proposals contained in the plan and in the regulations have been submitted to and have been approved by a majority of the persons engaged as principals in the industry or have been approved by persons employing a majority of the

Subject to Regulation 8 hereof the Minister shall, before making any appointment of a person to be a member of the Committee, give public notice in the Gazette notifying his intention to make such appointment and calling upon licensees to submit to him in writing, not later than a date to be specified in the notice and to be at least three weeks after the date of first publication of the notice, the names of persons to be appointed.

7. Subject to Regulation 8 hereof the Minister shall not

Subject to Regulation 8 hereof the Minister shall not make any appointment to the Committee until after the date specified in the notice published pursuant to Regulation 6 date specified in the notice published pursuant to Regulation 6 hereof and shall not appoint to be a member of the Committee any person whose name has not been submitted to bim pursuant to notice given under Regulation 6 hereof.

8. Regulations 6 and 7 hereof shall not apply to an appointment at the time of which there are at least five continuing or concurrently appointed members of the Committee who who have been positive or appointment.

WHEREAS it appears to me to be expedient for maintaining supplies and services essential to the life of the community, I, Patrick Charles Webb, Minister of Labour, pursuant to the Labour Legislation Emergency Regulations 1940, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Timber Industry Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1940.

2. This order annihies to workers in the timber industry.

2. This order applies to workers in the timber industry who come within the scope of the New Zealand (except Canterbury) Timber Workers' Award, dated the 17th day of June, 1940, and recorded in Book of Awards, Volume XL, page 833, and who are engaged in the production of timber for use in the manufacture of butter-boxes and to the employers use in the manufacture of butter-boxes and to the employers of such workers in the Westland, Grey, and Inangahua Counties and also to the following employers, viz., Messrs. Ellis and Burnand, Limited (Ongarue and Manunui Mills), Whangaroa Timber Company, Limited, Rangiahua Sawmills, Limited, Tarawera Timber Company, Limited, C. R. Lovatt and Son, Limited, Wilson Timber Mills, Limited, Thompson Timber, Limited, Landing Sawmilling Company.

3. The provisions of all Acts and all regulations thereunder and of the above-mentioned award shall be and are hereby suspended in so far as they operate to prevent eight hours' overtime being worked each week at the rate of time and a half, in lieu of time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter, but such suspension shall be subject

double time thereafter, but such suspension shall be subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth.

The overtime hereinbefore referred to shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half, calculated on the rates of wages received by the workers.

All overtime worked in excess of eight hours in any week shall be paid for at the rate of double time, calculated on the rates of wages received by the workers.

6. The operations covered by this Order shall, except in the case of breakdowns or other causes over which the employer has no control, be carried out for forty-eight hours

in each week.7. This order may be extended so as to include any employer or mill in addition to those mentioned in clause 2 hereof if I am satisfied that such employer or mill is engaged in the

operations covered by this Order.
8. This Order shall come into operation on the date hereof. Dated at Wellington, this 29th day of November, 1940.

Attention is drawn to the regulations under which any teacher who considers he has good grounds of objection to his classification may lodge an appeal by letter to reach the Director of Education not later than forty clear days after the publication of this list in the New Zealand Gazette—i.e., such appeals must reach the Director not later than 14th January, 1941, and must contain the definite grounds on which the appeal is based.
