A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto is Crown land, and is required to be set apart for railway purposes in connection with the Kawakawa-Hokianga Railway:

And whereas by section twenty-five of the Public Works Act, 1928, it is enacted that whenever any Crown land is required to be set apart for any public work the Governor-General may at any time, by Proclamation, set the same apart for such public work without complying with any of the provisions of that Act in respect of the taking or setting-apart of other lands for such purpose:

Now, therefore, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is hereby set apart for railway purposes in connection with the Kawakawa-Hokianga Railway, and I also hereby declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the twenty-first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and forty-one.

*Oil Fuel Retail Hours (Palmerston North) Order 1940, Amendment No. 1.*

**P**URSUANT to the Oil Fuel Retail Hours Emergency Regulation 1940 (No. 2), and pursuant to a requisition in writing received in that behalf, I, Frederick Jones, acting for the Minister of Labour, do hereby direct as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Oil Fuel Retail Hours (Palmerston North) Order 1940, Amendment No. 1.
