PURSUANT to the Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1926, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Hospital Representation Order 1941, No. 2.

2. The Order in Council made on the twelfth day of April, no thousand nine hypothesis and thirty sight, making the property of the property

one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, making provision in regard to the representation of contributory districts on certain Hospital Boards, is amended by revoking the Schedule thereto so far only as it affects the representation of the combined district of Tauranga County and Mount Maunganui Town District.

3. The numbers of members to be elected to the Board of the hospital district named in the first column of the Schedule hereto as the representative or representatives of the contributory districts named in the second column thereof shall be the numbers specified in the third column

thereof respectively.

4. The following provision is made for particular cases:-

(a) The first election of representatives for the Tauranga County shall take place on the date of the next ordinary general election of County Councils.

(b) The first election of a representative for the Mount Maunganui Town District shall take place on the date of the next ordinary general election of members of Town Beards. of Town Boards.

(c) The present representatives of the combined district of Tauranga County and Mount Maunganui Town District shall continue to hold office until the date of the next ordinary general election of County

Conferring special Jurisdiction on Native Land Court,

C. L. N. NEWALL, Governor-General. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 16th day of April, 1941.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL. WHEREAS upon the acquisition by the Crown of undivided interests in the block of Native land situated at Orakei, in the City of Auckland, and known as the Orakei No. 1 Reserve (hereinafter referred to as "the reserve"), it was claimed that certain improvements then existing on the reserve belonged to certain individual aurages and not the reserve belonged to certain individual owners, and not to all

of the owners in common, of the reserve:

And whereas certain of the said improvements were located

And whereas certain of the said improvements were located on certain of the subdivisions of the reserve which have become Crown land, and it was alleged that no payment had been made in respect thereof by or on behalf of the Crown:

And whereas there was referred to a Royal Commission (hereinafter referred to as "the Commission"), appointed on the twenty-second day of June, nineteen hundred and thirty-eight, to inquire into and report as to grievances alleged by Maoris with regard to the reserve and certain other lands at Orakei, the question, inter alia, as to whether the Crown paid to those vendors whose interests it purchased in the reserve a fair and reasonable price for those interests

Crown paid to those vendors whose interests it purchased in the reserve a fair and reasonable price for those interests having regard to the value of the reserve at the date of the purchase of such interests:

And whereas the report of the Commission showed that there were or are upon the subdivisions of the reserve which have become Crown land certain buildings which belonged to Natives and which have not been paid for by the Crown, and the Commission was of the opinion that, if any of the said buildings belonged to a Native who disposed of his interest in the reserve to the Crown, such building should be paid for by the Crown, or, if any of the said buildings belonged to a Native who had not so disposed of his interest to the Crown or was not an owner in the reserve, that person should have the right to remove the same: should have the right to remove the same:

And whereas the Commission was unable to express a final opinion as to who are the persons entitled to the said buildings, or to receive payment in respect thereof, or to remove the same, or as to the value of the said buildings:

And whereas claims have been preferred by Natives to the effect that they are entitled to certain buildings standing upon a certain area of Crown land situated at Orakei and shown as Lots 1, 2, and 3 on the plan lodged in the office of the Chief Surveyor at Auckland under number 1330 P. (blue) (hereinafter referred to as "the church-site land"):

And whereas the Commission in reporting on certain questions touching the church-site land expressed the opinion that if the persons entitled to the buildings thereon could be ascertained they should be given a limited time in which to remove the same:

And whereas it is desirable that certain matters and questions relating to the rights of Natives in and to the buildings hereinbefore mentioned should be determined by the Native Land Court:

the Native Land Court:

Now, therefore, pursuant to the provisions of section thirty-four of the Native Land Act, 1931, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby confer upon the Native Land Court jurisdiction to hear and determine, upon the application of the Minister of Lands, any question as to who are the persons entitled to the buildings erected upon the reserve and the church-site land and mentioned in the Schedule hereto, together with any outbuildings pertaining to who are the persons entitled to the buildings erected upon the reserve and the church-site land and mentioned in the Schedule hereto, together with any outbuildings pertaining hereto, or as to who are the persons equitably entitled to receive any compensation money which might be payable by or on behalf of the Crown in respect thereof, or as to who are the persons who should be granted the right to remove the same, or as to whether payment of compensation money ought to be made by or on behalf of the Crown in respect of any such building or outbuilding and, if so, what amount of compensation money ought to be so paid by or on behalf of the Crown, or whether the persons entitled to any such building or outbuilding should be granted the right to remove the same, and any other matter or question incidental to the ownership or possession of any of the said buildings and outbuildings or arising thereout, with power to make such order or orders in the premises as to the Court shall seem necessary or expedient, and to impose thereby such limitations of time in which the possession of any such building or outbuilding shall be undertaken, and such other terms and conditions as the Court thinks right, just, reasonable, and equitable. reasonable, and equitable.

Notes on the Weather for March, 1941.

Notes on the Weather for March, 1941.

General Notes.—March was a mild month with pleasant weather for the first twelve days and a sustained unsettled spell thereafter. Heavy rains alleviated the effect of the predominantly dry conditions in eastern districts and everywhere good autumn growth is assured. Especially in the north, pastures are making phenominal growth, and rorotorps are making a fair recovery from drought and moth and insect damage. The softened ground has enabled seasonal cultivation to proceed apace, and heavy autumn wheat sowings are expected.

Rainfall.—Except on the west coast of the South Island and in Southland, rainfall was in excess. In parts of Taranski and south Auckland falls exceeded double the average, while between Blenheim and Dunedin there were many places with three or four times average falls. For these it was the wettest March and, in some cases, the wettest of any month for a considerable number of years. As the rains began with a light drizzle, a fair amount of water soaked into the parched ground, but there was extensive flooding. Several stations had over 6 in. of rain within twenty-four hours. Numerous thunderstorms occurred over the North Island during the 17th.

Temperatures.—Mean temperatures were above normal almost generally. There were some sultry days in the earlier part of the month, and towards the end there were one or two light frosts in sheltered inland localities.

Sunskine.—As a result of the very bright spell of weather followed by a very dull period the duration of sunshine was fairly close to normal, there being no general significant trend in the departures.

Weather Sequence.—The spell of settled weather prevailing at the end of February lasted until the 12th March, with only one brief interruption on the 6th caused by the passage of a weak disturbance separating the two anti-cyclones responsible for the fine weather.

A disturbance arriving from the north-west on the 13th gave a good deal of rain in western and central districts. On the 16th a cyclonic

scattered light rain in the far south.
