Register of Engineers.

Office of the Minister of Public Works, Wellington, 15th May, 1941.

IN pursuance of section 13 of the Engineers Registration Act, 1924, a certified copy of the names, qualifications, and addresses entered in the Register of Engineers, as at 31st March, 1941, is published for general information. Under the heading of "Qualifications" is shown the particular clause of section 6 of the Act under which the applicant has been registered.

Section 6 of the Act is as follows:—

"6. (1) Every person shall, on payment of the prescribed fee, be entitled to be registered under this Act as an engineer who—

"(a) Holds some recognized certificate as hereinafter defined, and who satisfies the Board that he has had not less than three years' practical experience in engineering; or

"(b) Has attained the age of twenty-five years, and has been engaged during a period of not less than six years before the commencement of this Act in the acquisition of professional knowledge or in the practice of engineering in a manner satisfactory to the Board, and who makes application for registration within twelve months after the commencement of this Act; or

"(c) Passes or has passed an examination or examinations approved by the Board, and who satisfies the Board that he has had not less than three years' practical experience in engineering.

"(2) For the purposes of this section the term 'recognized certificate' means a certificate, diploma, degree, or license granted by some university, college, or other public institution (whether in New Zealand or elsewhere), and which is recognized by the Board as furnishing sufficient evidence of the possession of the requisite knowledge and skill for the efficient practice of the profession of engineering."

In 1928 an amendment to the Act was passed.

Subsection (1) of section 2 of the amendment reads as follows:—

"2. (1) In addition to the classes of persons entitled to be registered as engineers under the principal Act any person may on payment of the prescribed fee be registered as an engineer who, being registered at the date of the passing of the principal Act as a licensed surveyor under the Surveyors' Institute and Board of Examiners Act, 1908, satisfies the Board that he had prior to the coming into operation of the principal Act substantial practical experience in engineering as part of his practice or employment, whether on his own account or otherwise howsoever, and who makes application for registration within six months after the passing of this Act."

Applicants who have qualified for registration under the 1928 amendment are shown accordingly, under the heading of "Qualifications."

Notice of Provisional Plan for Electric-range Manufacturing Industry.

In the matter of the Industrial Efficiency Act, 1936.

WHEREAS pursuant to section 9 of the above-entitled Act, the Minister of Industries and Commerce instructed the Bureau of Industry to prepare an industrial plan for the organization of the industry referred to in a notice given by the Minister pursuant to section 14 of the Industrial Efficiency Act, 1936, on the 4th day of December, 1936, and published in the *Gazette* on the 10th day of December, 1936, and therein described as the "Manufacture of electric ranges, including the assembly of parts thereof":

And whereas the Bureau thereupon proceeded to prepare a provisional plan and submitted the same to the Minister:

And whereas in the opinion of the Minister the appointment of a Special Industrial Committee is desirable in connection with the said industrial plan:

Now, therefore, pursuant to the said Act, the Minister hereby gives public notice that the material proposals contained in the plan are as follows:—

1. The organization of the industry will be effected by means of:—

- (a) The maintenance of the licensing system now in force.
- (b) The continued application to the said industry of the Licensed Industries General Regulations 1940 as modified by the proposed special regulations herein-after referred to.
- (c) The appointment of an Industrial Committee not exceeding seven members in manner to be prescribed by the proposed special regulations.

2. The notice published in the *Gazette* on the 10th day of December, 1936, referred to above, so far as it relates to the industry aforesaid, will continue in force with the consequence that the industry will be able to be carried on only pursuant to a license issued under Part III of the said Act and in conformity with the terms and conditions of such license.

3. The Minister will respectfully recommend the Governor-General to make regulations in the terms set out in the Schedule hereto (herein called "the proposed special regulations"), and will move the Executive Council to give its advice and consent to the making of the proposed special regulations.

4. In accordance with the provisions of section 9 of the said Act, the regulations in relation to the plan, as finally approved by the Minister, will not be brought into force unless the Governor-General in Council is satisfied that the material proposals contained in the plan and in the regulations have been submitted to and have been approved by a majority of the persons engaged as principals in the industry or have been approved by persons employing a majority of the workers engaged in the industry.

And it is further notified that the Minister will forthwith after the 29th day of May, 1941, refer to the Bureau for consideration any recommendations or objections relating to this provisional plan that may be received by him pursuant to the said Act, and all such recommendations or objections should accordingly be delivered to the Minister not later than the last-mentioned date.

SCHEDULE.

PROPOSED SPECIAL REGULATIONS.

1. THESE regulations may be cited as the Industrial Efficiency (Electric Range) Regulations 1941.

2. These regulations shall be deemed to be special regulations within the meaning of the Licensed Industries General Regulations 1940 (hereinafter called "the general regulations"), which shall apply as hereby modified in relation to the industry referred to in the next succeeding regulation.

3. These regulations shall apply in relation to the industry referred to in a notice given by the Minister pursuant to section 14 of the Industrial Efficiency Act, 1936, on the 4th day of December, 1936, and published in the *Gazette* on the 10th day of December, 1936, and therein described as follows:

"Manufacture of electric ranges, including the assembly of parts thereof."

4. Subject to Regulation 2:9 of the general regulations the Committee shall consist of such number of persons as the Minister from time to time thinks fit to appoint, not being more than seven nor less than four in number.

5. Subject to Regulations 7 and 8 hereof the Minister shall, before making any appointment of a person to be a member of the Committee, give public notice in the *Gazette* notifying his intention to make such appointment and calling upon licensees to submit to him in writing not later than a date to be specified in the notice and to be at least three weeks after the date of the first publication of the notice the names of persons to be appointed.

6. Subject to Regulations 7 and 8 hereof the Minister shall not make any appointment to the Committee until after the date specified in the notice published pursuant to Regulation 5

hereof, and shall not appoint to be a member of the Committee any person whose name has not been submitted to him pursuant to notice given under Regulation 5 hereof.

7. Regulations 5 and 6 hereof shall not apply to an appointment at the time of which there are at least four continuing or concurrently appointed members of the Committee who prior to appointment have been nominated pursuant to Regulation 5 hereof.

8. Regulations 5 and 6 hereof shall not apply to an appointment by way of reappointment of a person whose period of membership is expiring if every licensee signifies to the Minister, with such formality as the Minister thinks sufficient, the acquiescence of the licensee in the proposed reappointment.

9. Every appointment to membership of the Committee shall take effect on the day on which notice of the appointment is published in the *Gazette*, or any later date specified or referred to in such notice.

10. Every member of the Committee shall hold office during the Minister's pleasure, so that he may at any time be removed from office by the Minister by notice in writing published in the *Gazette*.

11. Subject to the last preceding regulation every member of the Committee, appointed after compliance with the formalities prescribed by Regulations 5 and 6 or Regulation 8 hereof, shall hold office for a term to be specified in the instrument of appointment and the notice thereof published in the *Gazette* and not to exceed thirteen months.

12. It shall be lawful for the Committee acting under Regulation 2:8 of the General Regulations to make by-laws enabling members or any specified members of the Committee to attend and vote by proxies appointed in such manner as the by-laws may provide.

NOTE.—Hail occurred on two occasions. On the 23rd a violent southerly squall passed over Wellington and was accompanied by heavy rain, thunder, and hail, which fell to a considerable depth along the eastern side of the harbour.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR APRIL, 1941.

General Notes.—April was fairly dry and cold with frequent southerly winds. The cooler temperatures now prevailing have checked most garden growth. The chief dairying districts report ample feed with pastures still growing slightly, but production is dwindling. Supplementary fodder supplies for the winter are mainly satisfactory, but in some cases turnip and rape crops have not recovered from the effects of moth and insect earlier in the year. Seasonal cultivation and the autumn wheat sowings have suffered few interruptions.

Rainfall.—The totals were below normal over most of the country, the distribution being somewhat erratic on account of the showery nature of the precipitation. Falls were very light in Auckland, northern Taranaki, and the Manawatu, as well as in Nelson, Marlborough, and North Canterbury. On the other hand, moderate excesses occurred in South Canterbury and from Dunedin southwards. Average values were attained in a small district near Taihape and also in a few exposed stations on the eastern coast of Wellington and Hawke's Bay Provinces.

Temperatures.—In contrast with recent months, mean temperatures were everywhere colder than normal, and while departures were only about one degree in some eastern districts they frequently increased to three or four degrees towards the west. Frosts were fairly numerous, but were not unusually excessive.

Sunshine.—Except in the far south, the duration of bright sunshine equalled or exceeded average values, Nelson and Blenheim having substantial surpluses.

Weather Sequence.—For the first five days westerly depressions gave windy and showery periods, with gales in many districts on the 3rd. After the eastward passage on the 6th and 7th of a low-pressure trough, strong south-westerlies prevailed, rain being widespread, while snow fell in the ranges and down to lower levels in the south.

By the 10th the situation was of the westerly type, north-westerly winds becoming very gusty on the 12th and temperatures were milder. As an intense anticyclone centred near Tasmania extended over the Tasman Sea, a southerly change set in on the 13th, and a secondary disturbance brought stronger winds on the following day. Except in Westland and Auckland the weather was cold and squally with wintry showers. Winds decreased slowly, while conditions improved from the south, the anticyclone which had been centred well to the south being over New Zealand on the 18th. Winds from between west and south-west predominated as several minor disturbances passed, but one of these was accompanied by a cold and squally southerly on the 23rd, after which conditions improved rapidly.

From the 27th onward an anticyclone was centred immediately to the east of the South Island and pressure was relatively high to the south-west, while a depression, that developed near Lord Howe Island, remained almost stationary in the Central Tasman Sea. Over New Zealand easterly winds predominated, cloud and mist increasing, especially in the east and in the far north, where there was occasional drizzle.
