

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 5th day of November, 1941.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby grant to Ralph Forlong, of Kiwitahi, Farmer (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee"), a license subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth to obstruct, impound, or divert the waters of a stream known as Topehahae Stream situated in part 2c No. 1 Kiwitahi Block, Cambridge Survey District, in the Land District of Auckland, and to take and use therefrom for the purposes hereinafter set forth a stream of water not exceeding 10 cubic feet per second at any one time, and to erect the electric lines hereinafter described.

CONDITIONS.

1. Implied Conditions.

THE conditions directed to be implied in all licenses by the THE conditions directed to be implied in all incenses by the Water-power Regulations 1934, and the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, shall be incorporated in and shall form part of this license except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

2. License subject to Regulations.
