(i) Description, *i.e.*, single or coils;
(ii) Sizes and quantity of each by weight;
(iii) Purpose for which they are used.

- (ii) Date when order placed;
  (iii) Description, sizes, and quantity of each by weight;
  (iv) Purposes for which they are intended to be used.

(ii) Gauges;

(iii) Quantities of each kind by weight;
(iii) Purpose for which such wire is intended to be used.
