PURSUANT to the Harbours Act, 1923, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby vest in the Akaroa County Council (hereinafter called "the Council," which term shall include its successors or assigns unless the context requires a different construction), the management of the wharf at Duvauchelles, Robinson's Bay, and Wainui, as shown on approved plans marked M.D. 3290; 4304, 4305; 1548 and 1549 respectively, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, such vesting to be subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto, and doth hereby prescribe that the regulations set forth in the Second Schedule hereto shall apply to the wharf at Wainui only.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. THE vesting of the said wharves is subject to the Fore-shore License Regulations 1940, and the provisions of those regulations shall, so far as applicable, apply hereto.
2. The term of the vesting shall be fourteen years from the 21st day of December, 1941.
3. The Master of every vessel discharging ballast at the said wharves shall have all such ballast taken away and deposited at high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved by the Minister or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

1. No person shall, without the special permission of the Council or their appointee, store any goods in the wharf shed for a longer period than fourteen days.
2. Every person shall stack the goods in the shed to the satisfaction of the Council or its appointee in such manner that the full storing-capacity of the wharf shed shall not be restricted.
3. The shed may be locked up between the hours of 6 p.m. and 8 a.m., and during Sundays, whenever the Council may deem it advisable.
4. The Council shall not be liable for loss or damage to goods stored.
5. No person shall stack firewood, timber, or other goods within 4 ft. of the wharf-gangway or of the tramway-rails, and no person shall leave goods of any description on the wharf for a longer period than four days.
6. No person shall leave the trolley on the public road, but shall replace the trolley on the wharf after using same.
7. Any person opening the shed door to remove goods or for any other purpose shall reclose the door before leaving.
8. Any person infringing these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

WHEREAS by Order in Council made on the eleventh day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, and published in the *Gazette* on the fifteenth day of the same month, at page 895, there were conferred on the Whakatane County Council (hereinafter referred to as "the said Council") in respect of the County of Whakatane all the powers with respect to the supply of water for domestic or industrial purposes exercisable by a duly constituted Borough Council under sections eighty-two to eighty-seven, Part XXIV (with the exception of sections two hundred and forty-five and two hundred and forty-seven) and section three hundred and thirty-nine of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920; and also section eleven of the Municipal Corporations Amendment Act, 1921-22:

And whereas by virtue of the provisions of the Acts Interpretation Act, 1924, and the Municipal Corporations Act, 1933, the powers conferred by the Order in Council aforesaid enure and are exercisable by the said Council under the corresponding provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1933:

And whereas it is expedient that further powers be conferred on the said Council in respect of that portion of the County of Whakatane described in the Schedule hereto:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section one hundred and eighty-two of the Counties Act, 1920, and section eighty-five of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1933, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby confer on the said Council all the powers of a Borough Council under the said section eighty-five of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1933, and doth hereby accordingly consent to the said Council making and levying over that portion of the County of Whakatane described in the Schedule hereto water rates and charges in respect both of the ordinary as well as of any extraordinary supply, according to the quantity of water consumed by any person receiving the same as measured by meter, at such rates or charges as may from time to time be fixed by any by-law of the said Council in that behalf, or as may be agreed on with any such person.

Authorizing Bruce Bay Timbers, Limited, to construct a Private Tramway on a Government Road.

C. L. N. NEWALL, Governor-General.

WHEREAS under section six of the Tramways Amendment Act, 1911, the Governor-General may, on the application of any person in that behalf, grant a license to that person to lay down, construct, and maintain a private tramway on, along, or across any Government road within the meaning of the Public Works Act, 1928:

And whereas application has been made by Bruce Bay Timbers, Limited, a company incorporated or deemed to be incorporated under the Companies Act, 1933, and having its registered office at Hokitika (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee"), for a license in respect of a private tramway to be laid down, constructed, and maintained across a certain Government road—namely, the Mahitahi Road—in the positions described in the Second Schedule hereto:

And whereas all steps necessary to authorize such license to be granted have been duly taken, and no ratepayer has deposited any memorial of objection under section eighteen of the Tramways Act, 1908:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the Tramways Act, 1908, and amendments, I, Cyril Louis Norton Newall, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby grant to the licensee a license to lay down, construct, and maintain a private tramway on and across the said Mahitahi Road in the positions described in the Second Schedule hereto subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. All duties, expenses, costs, and charges of and incidental to the preparation and execution of these presents and compliance with the provisions of the Tramways Act, 1908, in respect of the licensee's application for tramway rights under the said Act shall be paid by the licensee.

2. The licensee shall and will immediately have prepared and completed an engineering survey and plans of the foundations of the said tramway so far as it may affect the said Mahitahi Road, and until such plans are approved in writing by the Minister of Public Works the licensee shall have no right or license to lay down, construct, or maintain the said tramway as herein provided, and a copy of such survey and plans when so approved shall be supplied to the Minister before any work is done in the construction of the said tramway.

3. Where the tramway shall cross and intersect the Mahitahi Road such crossings shall be laid by the licensee with sleepers between the rails, and also sleepers shall be placed lengthwise alongside the outside of each set of rails for the full width of the road, such last-mentioned sleepers to be flush with the said rails and to be kept firmly fixed to the sleepers on which the said rails are laid.

4. In the event of any portion of the said tramway being above or below the level of the present formation of the said Mahitahi Road, the licensee shall grade the said tramway and the said road to the satisfaction of the Minister of Public Works. The said tramway and all such crossings and gradings shall be constructed and maintained by the licensee at its own cost and expense in all things to the satisfaction of the Minister of Public Works, and those portions of the said road over which the said tramway shall run shall be maintained by the licensee at its own cost and expense in all things to the satisfaction of the Minister of Public Works.

5. (1) All tramway traffic shall be so conducted as to interfere as little as possible with the use of the road by other traffic, and no train shall cross the road at a speed greater than five miles per hour.

(2) No engine, truck, or carriage shall be left standing in such a position as to interfere with traffic on the road.

(3) If at any time it appears to the Governor-General that this tramway can no longer be operated without undue danger to traffic using the road the Governor-General may, by writing under his hand, suspend this license until the licensee has made such alterations as will enable the road to be used with safety, and may revoke the license either forthwith or following any such period of suspension.

6. The license hereby granted shall remain in force for a term of twenty-one (21) years from the date hereof and no longer.

7. So soon as the licensee discontinues using the said tramway for the purposes of its business, or upon revocation of the license or expiry of the term hereby granted, the licensee shall remove such tramway from the said Mahitahi Road and shall restore the surface of the said road to the satisfaction of the Minister of Public Works.

8. In the event of any other person applying for a similar license to lay down, construct, and maintain another private tramway or a public tramway along, over, or across any portion or portions of the said Mahitahi Road, the Governor-General hereby reserves to himself the right to authorize such person to use such portion or portions of the said tramway by the licensee to be laid down, constructed, and maintained as aforesaid, but only upon and subject to such terms and conditions as to compensation to the licensee or otherwise as the person so applying and the licensee may

agree upon, or, in case they cannot agree, then upon and subject to such terms and conditions as to compensation to the licensee or otherwise as the Governor-General shall consider advisable and just.

9. On each side of each road-crossing warning notice-boards of the type or types from time to time in general use in the Railways Department for similar crossings shall be erected, and at all times maintained in good order and condition by the licensee.

10. In the event of any of the foregoing terms or conditions not being complied with by the licensee the Governor-General may at any time revoke the license hereby granted, and in case any damage shall have been occasioned by reason of such nonfulfilment of the said terms or conditions or any of them the licensee shall be liable therefor in damages or compensation, such damages or compensation to be assessed by the Minister of Public Works whose decision shall be final.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

The said tramway shall cross the Mahitahi Road at a point approximately 5 chains south of the north-western corner of Section 2458, Block XIV, Bruce Bay Survey District, such crossing being situate within Block XIV, Bruce Bay Survey District, in the Land District of Westland, and being more particularly shown on the plan marked P.W.D. 90635, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR DECEMBER, 1941.

General Notes.—December was a cloudy month with very unseasonable conditions during the latter portion. Pastures and crops, especially on the east coast of the South Island, received substantial benefit from the rains, but the persistence of unsettled conditions made the period very difficult for shearing and haymaking. There are still many sheep unshorn and considerable quantities of hay have been ruined. Some good ensilage crops have been harvested. Stock are well, with ample feed of moderate quality. Young turnips, rape, and chou-moullier crops are showing good progress. For fruit and vegetables the season is still very late. As yet, very few white butterflies are in evidence.

Rainfall.—Rain fell frequently throughout the month. Totals were very high about the Bay of Islands and in the Ohakune-Taihape-Wanganui area, where some stations had a new December record. Rainfall, however, was deficient in the Bay of Plenty and the East Cape regions. Over the South Island, rainfall departures from average were very variable, but there was a predominance of slight excesses. There were numerous thunderstorms, often with hail.

Temperatures.—There were some warm days in the earlier part of the month, but later on occasional very cold temperatures were experienced. On the average, however, temperatures over the North Island closely approached the normal, but in the South negative departures were rather larger, being 2° or 3° F. in Canterbury.

Sunshine.—Low sunshine totals were recorded at nearly all stations. In several cases the values were poorer than the average by the equivalent of two hours per day. For the country as a whole the month was probably the dullest December for a considerable number of years.

Weather Sequence.—During the first two days a weak disturbance over New Zealand gave a brief period of rain, but an anticyclone following intensified and covered the country. From the 5th to the 16th this high-pressure system remained centred east of New Zealand. Although fine at first conditions became warm and increasingly humid with much low cloud and, after the 9th, considerable fog or drizzle. Moderate north-easterlies prevailed, but there were short-lived southerly changes in the south.

Beneficial rain had fallen in the east of the South Island by the 16th, when a new depression introduced a south-westerly situation which persisted for several days. There were widespread passing showers, with some snow on the higher levels, but in most places there were lengthy bright intervals. Between the 18th and 21st numerous gales were experienced. On the 19th there was a local whirlwind and a particularly heavy hailstorm near Tai-Tapu.

During the 20th a disturbance advanced from the south, and after passing on to the North Island a centre associated with it deepened very considerably off the east coast. Southerly winds freshened, reaching gale force in many exposed positions, while cold, showery conditions were fairly general. The weather improved by the 26th, but a shallow disturbance then gave cloud and light drizzle. On the 31st a complex depression west of Auckland gave general rain, there being some heavy falls in the back country of Taranaki.

- Items marked AA: Allocation for imports from United Kingdom and "Other British" countries to the extent of 50 per cent. of the value of licenses granted for imports from those sources in 1940:
- Items marked B: Allocation for imports from all sources to the extent of 50 per cent. of the value of licenses granted for imports from those sources in 1940:
- Items marked BB: Allocation for imports from all sources to the extent of 100 per cent. of the value of licenses granted for imports from those sources in 1940:
- Items marked C: "Control" applications to be considered individually:
- Items marked D: Items for which no allocation made.

NOTE.—In certain cases the allocations had regard to licenses issued for imports in 1941. These were indicated in the original Schedule by an asterisk. In a few cases the allocations had regard to imports in 1938, and were set out in the original Schedule accordingly.
