Consenting to the Raising of a Loan of £13,000 by the Otago Central Electric-power Board and prescribing the Conditions thereof.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 14th day of January, 1942.

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the Otago Central Electric-power Board (hereinafter called "the said local authority") being desirous of raising the sum of thirteen thousand pounds (£13,000) by a loan to be known as "Electrical Generation Loan, No. 2, 1941" (hereinafter called "the said loan"), for the purpose of constructing additional headworks and a further generating station at the Roaring Meg Stream and access thereto, has complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, as required by the said Act, should be given to the raising of the said loan:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said loan for the said purpose up to the amount of thirteen thousand pounds (£13,000), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

(1) The term for which the said loan or any part thereof may be raised shall not exceed ten (10) years.

(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate or rates exceeding three pounds fifteen shillings (£3 15s.) per centum per annum.

(3) The said loan or any part thereof, together with interest thereon, shall be repaid by equal aggregate annual or half-yearly instalments extending over the term as determined in (1) above.

(4) The payment of such instalments shall be made in New Zealand, and no instalments shall be paid out of loan-moneys.

(5) The rate payable for brokerage, underwriting, and procurement fees in respect of the raising of the said loan or any part thereof shall not in the aggregate exceed one-half per centum of any amount raised.

(6) No moneys shall be borrowed under this consent after the expiration of two years from the date hereof.

THE HON. W. NASH PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Harbours Act, 1923, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby vest in the Akaroa County Council (hereinafter called "the Council," which term shall include its successors or assigns unless the context requires a different construction), the management of the wharf at Le Bon's Bay, as shown on approved plan marked M.D. 2344 and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, such vesting to be subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto, and doth hereby prescribe that the dues and rates set forth in the Second Schedule hereto shall be charged and taken by the Council for the use of the said wharf.

CONDITIONS OF MANAGEMENT.

1. THE vesting of the said wharf is subject to the Foreshore License Regulations 1940, and the provisions of those regulations shall, so far as applicable, apply hereto.

NOTICE is hereby given that, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Supply Control Emergency Regulations 1939, and the Munitions Emergency Regulations 1941, the Minister of Supply and Munitions doth hereby give notice and direct as follows:—

1. This notice may be cited as the Tires and Tubes Control Notice 1942.

2. The Tires and Tubes Control Notice 1941, and the Tires and Tubes Control Notice 1941, No. 2, are hereby revoked, but so that such revocation shall not affect the continuing liability of any person under the Supply Control Emergency Regulations 1939 for any breach of the requirements of those notices committed during the time when those notices were in force.

3. This notice shall apply to all tires and tubes suitable for use or capable of being used on the wheels of vehicles except (a) metal tires for horse-drawn vehicles, and (b) tires and tubes suitable only for use on pedal-bicycles.

4. All tires and tubes to which this notice applies are declared to be munitions for the purposes of the Munitions Emergency Regulations 1941.

5. No person being the owner thereof shall sell, supply, dispose of, or part with the possession or control of any new or used tires or tubes to which this notice applies and which are not affixed to a vehicle as part of the normal equipment thereof except with the precedent consent of the Secretary, Ministry of Supply and Munitions (as delegate of the Munitions Controller), or of some other person appointed by the Secretary for the purpose.

6. No person who on the 14th day of December, 1941, had in his possession or control or on order by him any new or used tires or tubes to which this notice applies, not affixed to a vehicle as part of the normal equipment thereof, shall use any of those tires or tubes except with the precedent consent of the Secretary, Ministry of Supply and Munitions (as delegate of the Munitions Controller), or of some other person appointed by the Secretary for the purpose.

7. No person whose business or part of whose business is the sale of tires or tubes shall use any new tires or tubes to which this notice applies except with the precedent consent of the Secretary, Ministry of Supply (as delegate of the Munitions Controller), or of some other person appointed by the Secretary for the purpose.

RESOLUTION.

THE following regulations were laid before the members of the committee of the Canterbury Jockey Club at a meeting held on the 24th day of January, 1942, at Trentham, with a recommendation by the Chairman of such club, Mr. Arthur S. Elworthy, that the same be passed at once with a view to their approval by His Excellency the Governor-General in pursuance of the Gaming Act, 1908, section 33.

Mr. Arthur S. Elworthy, the Chairman of such club, and the meeting moved, and Mr. H. D. Greenwood seconded, and it was resolved that such regulations should be adopted and that the Chairman and Secretary be authorized to sign the same in authentication thereof.

The following are the regulations referred to:—

CANTERBURY JOCKEY CLUB.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Canterbury Jockey Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as “the said club”) doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the Motukarara Domain situated in the district of Motukarara, and known as the Banks Peninsula Racing Club's Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. These regulations shall come into force on the date of the same being published in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

2. In these regulations the words “bookmaker,” “racing club,” and “race meeting” shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms respectively by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

3. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely:—

- (a) Bookmakers.
- (b) Bookmakers' clerks, bookmakers' assistants, and bookmakers' agents.
- (c) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association.
- (d) Common prostitutes and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible means of support.
- (e) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues, and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues, convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908. Provided always that the Executive Committee appointed by the New Zealand Racing Conference, upon being satisfied by evidence as to character and otherwise that any person who, by reason of any conviction, comes within the scope of this regulation, should have relief from the effect thereof, may grant exemption to any such person, and may at any time revoke any such exemption without notice to such person, and without assigning any reason for such revocation.

The foregoing regulations of the Canterbury Jockey Club were made and passed by such club on the 24th day of January, 1942, and signed by the Chairman and Secretary.
