The provisions of all Acts and all regulations thereunder and of the New Zealand (except Westland) Freezing Workers' Award dated the 12th day of July, 1941, and recorded in Book of Awards, Volume 41, page 692, shall be and are hereby suspended in so far as any such provisions operate to prevent the employment of the workers referred to in clause 2 hereof from Monday to Friday, inclusive, between the hours of 6 a.m. and 8 a.m. and between the hours of 5 p.m. and 7 p.m., and on Saturday for four hours between the hours of 8 a.m. and 12 noon, but such suspension shall be subject to the following condition—viz., that time worked before 8 a.m. or after 5 p.m. and time worked on Saturday shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half in addition to the ordinary weekly wage. In all other respects the award provisions shall apply.

The Tramways Industry Labour Legislation Modification Order 1942.

WHEREAS it appears to me to be necessary for securing the public safety, the defence of New Zealand, the efficient prosecution of any war in which His Majesty may be engaged, and for maintaining supplies and services essential to the life of the community, I, Patrick Charles Webb, Minister of Labour, pursuant to the Labour Legislation Emergency Regulations 1940, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Tramways Industry Labour Legislation Modification Order 1942.

2. This Order applies to all workers who are bound by awards and industrial agreements to which the New Zealand Tramways Authorities' Employees' Industrial Union of Workers is a party and to the employers of such workers.

3. The provisions of the awards and industrial agreements referred to in clause 2 hereof shall be and are hereby modified to the extent that the said workers or any of them may be called back to work on an additional day in the week subject. called back to work on an additional day in the week subject to the following conditions, viz.:-

(1) Workers called back in pursuance of this Order shall be given a minimum of eight hours' work, and payment for all time worked on the additional day shall be at the rate of time and a half. In all other respects the conditions of the award or industrial agreement shall apply.

(2) Sunday shall not be regarded as an additional day under this Order.

(4) This Order shall come into effect on and from the date of publication hereof in the Gazette.

The above estimates may be compared with last season's actual average yields, which were: Wheat, 34·15 bushels; oats, 43·41 bushels; and barley, 33·30 bushels.

In accordance with the above estimates, the total yield of wheat for the season 1941–42 should be approximately 8,600,000 bushels, as against an ascertained yield of 8,305,865 bushels for the season 1940–41.

The area from which oats were threshed for the five seasons ending with 1940–41 averaged 21 per cent. of the total area under that crop. Assuming that a similar proportion is threshed this year, the total yield of grain should be approximately 2,550,000 bushels, as against a yield of 3,114,946 bushels for the season 1940–41.

On a similar assumption in regard to barley, the total yield of grain should be approximately 1,300,000 bushels, as against 1,066,408 bushels for the season 1940-41.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Canterbury Park Trotting Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the racecourse situated in the district of New Brighton and known as the New Brighton Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings. race meetings.

- 1. These regulations shall come into force on the date of the same being published in the New Zealand Gazette.
- 2. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms respectively by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.
- 3. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely:—
 - (a) Bookmakers.(b) Bookmakers'

okmakers' elerks, bookmakers' assistants, bookmakers' agents.

(c) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association.

or the New Zealand Trotting Association.

(d) Common prostitutes and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible means of support.

(e) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues, and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues, convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908. Provided always that the Executive Committee appointed by the New Zealand Racing Conference, upon being satisfied by evidence as to Conference, upon being satisfied by evidence as to coherence, upon being satisfied by evidence as to character and otherwise that any person who, by reason of any conviction, comes within the scope of this regulation, should have relief from the effect thereof, may grant exemption to any such person, and may at any time revoke any such exemption without notice to such person, and without assigning any reason for such revocation.
