6. Except with the precedent consent of a District Manager of the Internal Marketing Division of the Marketing Department (as delegate of the Timber Controller), no person referred to in paragraphs (a),

(b), (c), or (d) of clause 4 of this notice shall sell or offer for sale or contract to sell or otherwise dispose of any used fruit-case to any person who is not the occupier of an orchard registered under the Orchard Registration Regulations 1937, and no person who is the occupier of any such orchard shall use any used fruit-case acquired by him pursuant to the provisions of this notice for any purpose other than the repacking of apples or pears.
