WHEREAS the Richmond Borough Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority"), being desirous of raising a loan of nine thousand pounds (£9,000) to be known as "Water-supply Loan, 1941" (hereinafter called "the

said loan") for the purpose of constructing a pipe-line for the purpose of connecting the present borough water-supply with the Roding River Scheme, has complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, as required by the said Act, should be given to the raising of the said loan:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said loan for the said purpose up to the amount of nine thousand pounds (£9,000), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

up to the amount of nine thousand pounds (29,000), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

(1) The term for which the said loan or any part thereof may be raised shall not exceed thirty (30) years.

(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum per annum.

- (3) The said local authority shall, before raising the said loan or any part thereof, make provision for the repayment thereof by establishing a sinking fund under the Local Bodies' thereof by establishing a sinking fund under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, or under such other statutory enactment as may be applicable, and shall thereafter make payments to such sinking fund at intervals of not more than one year at a rate or rates per centum which shall be not less than two pounds (£2), such payments to be made in respect of every part of the said loan for the time being so borrowed and not repaid, the first such payment to be made not later than one year after the first day from which interest to the lender or lenders is computed on the said loan or any part thereof so raised. thereof so raised.
- (4) The payment of interest and the repayment of principal in respect of the said loan shall be made in New Zealand.
- (5) No amount payable as either interest or sinking fund in respect of the said loan shall be paid out of loan-moneys.
- (6) The rate payable for brokerage, underwriting, and procuration fees in respect of the raising of the said loan or any part thereof shall not in the aggregate exceed one-half per centum of any amount raised.
- (7) No moneys shall be borrowed under this consent after the expiration of two years from the date hereof.

WHEREAS by Order in Council made on the ninth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and forty-one, and subject to the determinations as to borrowing and and subject to the determinations as to borrowing and repayment therein set out, consent was given to the borrowing of moneys by the King-country Electric-power Board by way of bank overdraft under section seventy-one of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925:

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Wanganui Jockey Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the reaccourse situated in the district of Marton, and known as the Marton Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

 (c) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association.

 (d) Common prostitutes and persons who habitually consort with this was or persons who have no lawful visible.

with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible

with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible means of support.

(e) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues, and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.
