ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby grant to Gerhard Henry Diedrichs, of Evans Creek, South Westland, Dairy-farmer (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee"), a license subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth to take and use from an unnamed stream situated in permanent State Forest Reserve, in the Land District of Westland, for the purposes hereinafter set forth a stream of water not exceeding one and a half cubic feet per second at any one time.

CONDITIONS.

1. IMPLIED CONDITIONS.

THE conditions directed to be implied in all licenses by the Water-power Regulations 1934, and the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, shall be incorporated in and shall form part of this license except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

2. LICENSE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.

This license is issued under the Water-power Regulations 1934, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, and the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, and is subject thereto and to any regulations made or to be made in amplification or amendment thereof or in substitution thereof.

3. UTILIZATION OF WATER AND LOCATION OF HEADWORKS.

Water shall be used under this license solely for the purpose of generating electricity up to a maximum capacity of fifteen kilovolt amperes at 440 volts alternating current, and shall be taken from the stream at the point in permanent State Forest Reserve indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 113364, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington.

4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS.

The licensee is hereby authorized, subject to the conditions hereof, to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this license, the approximate positions of the said works being indicated on the said plan P.W.D. 113364:—

- (a) Headworks consisting of a dam and intake with a water-race leading to the pelton-wheel, and powerhouse hereinafter referred to, giving a static head of approximately 200 ft.
- (b) A powerhouse, with all necessary equipment, for generating electricity.
- (c) Tail-race leading from the said water-wheel to Cowhide Creek.

5. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (j) of clause 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935. The generating voltage shall be approximately 440 volts alternating current and voltage of supply approximately 240 volts between any phase and neutral conductor.

6. DURATION OF LICENSE.

Unless sooner determined, this license shall continue in force until the 31st day of March, 1963, or until electrical energy is available from an Electric-power Board or other general public source, whichever is the earlier.

7. RENTAL.

For the purpose of assessing the annual rental payable in respect of this license, the licensee may install a suitable maximum-demand indicator to the satisfaction of the Inspecting Engineer of the Public Works Department, and, failing such installation, the rental shall be assessed on the maximum generating capacity of the plant installed. The present plant is rated at fifteen kilovolt-amperes.

SCHEDULE.

Regulations for the Government and Payment of the Royal New Zealand Naval Reserves, 1937.

The following instructions are to be read with reference to the above regulations, Article Nos. 17, 21, 63, 64, 68, 97, 99, 118, 123, 124, 142 :—

ROYAL NEW ZEALAND NAVAL RESERVE AND ROYAL NEW ZEALAND NAVAL VOLUNTEER RESERVE OFFICERS.—CONFIRMATION AND PROMOTION IN TIME OF WAR.

The rules for promotion and confirmation of Royal New Zealand Naval Reserve officers *in time of war* have been revised and consolidated and are issued herewith for information.

2. The names of officers who are eligible for confirmation or promotion should be reported to the Naval Board, certifying the dates on which each of the requirements has been satisfied.

3. Officers not recommended for confirmation or promotion, when qualified by age and service, are to be the subject of a special report accompanied by Form S. 206 (attention is drawn to paragraph 4 of C.A.F.O. 1312/40).

4. (a) The Naval Watch-keeping Certificate is to be worded as follows :—

“ [Rank], [Name], is competent to take charge of a watch at sea as a Lieutenant, and to perform efficiently the duties of that rank.”

(b) Where a Commanding Officer does not feel justified in awarding the full Naval Watch-keeping Certificate, as shown above, a restricted certificate may be awarded by the addition of a paragraph to the following effect :—

“ 2. This certificate is granted for [insert class of vessels] only.”

(c) Where the additional paragraph referred to above is added, the certificate will not be regarded as a full Naval Watch-keeping Certificate, and the notation (W/K) will not appear against the officer's name in the Navy List.

(d) Copies of Watch-keeping Certificates awarded are to be forwarded at the time of the award to the Director of Royal New Zealand Naval Reserves, or with the application for promotion if at the time of the award the officer is due for promotion.

5. Where officers have not had an opportunity of qualifying for a Naval Watch-keeping Certificate owing to the exigencies of the service, this requirement for promotion may be dispensed with if they are certified by their Commanding Officers as competent to carry out, in an efficient manner, the duties upon which they are employed. In such cases, officers without Watch-keeping Certificates will be promoted to Acting Lieutenant only.

6. In the case of officers serving in mine-sweepers and other auxiliary vessels, the award of restricted Naval Watch-keeping Certificates is to be made as follows :—

(a) *To Officers in the 25th Mine-sweeping Flotilla—*

By the Senior Officer, 25th Mine-sweeping Flotilla, on the recommendation of the respective Commanding Officers.

(b) *To Officers in Local Defence and Escort Vessels—*

By the administrative authority on the recommendation of the respective Commanding Officers.

7. Notwithstanding anything in this order, officers are not entitled to count for promotion the following service :—

(a) Service as a Probationary Sub-Lieutenant or Sub-Lieutenant below the age of twenty :

(b) Service as a rating :

(c) Time served prior to being first entered as a temporary officer during the present war.

8. In the appended tables, columns (i) and (ii) are a reprint of the peace-time rules for confirmation or promotion of permanent Reserve officers, given in Royal New Zealand Naval Reserves Regulations ; column (iii) contains the rules for confirmation or promotion of all Reserve officers during war. Officers of the permanent Reserves may qualify for confirmation or promotion under either the peace-time or war-time rules, whichever is the most advantageous, but temporary officers may only qualify under the war-time rules.

9. The regulations promulgated in this Navy Order are only retrospective to 8th May, 1940. Promotions of Reserve officers prior to that date are governed by the Regulations for the Government of the Royal New Zealand Naval Reserves.

10. A notation “ see Navy Order 585,” is to be inserted in Royal New Zealand Naval Reserves Regulations, Part I, against Articles 17, 21, 63, 64, 68, 97, 99, 118, 123, 124, 142.

By-laws regulating Traffic on certain Main Highways Bridges.

The Canterbury Aerated-water and Cordial Workers' and Brewery and Bottling House Workers' Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1942.

IN pursuance of the Labour Legislation Emergency Regulations 1940, the Minister of Labour doth hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Canterbury Aerated-water and Cordial Workers' and Brewery and Bottling House Workers' Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1942.

2. This Order applies to Ballins Breweries (N.Z.), Ltd., Christchurch, and to the adult male workers who are employed by the said company and whose employment is subject to the Canterbury Aerated-water and Cordial Workers' award dated the 11th day of July, 1940, and recorded in 40 Book of Awards 961, or the New Zealand (except Nelson and Otago and Southland) Brewery and Bottling House Workers' award dated the 7th day of October, 1941, and recorded in 41 Book of Awards 1347.

3. The provisions of the awards referred to in clause 2 hereof shall be and are hereby suspended in so far as they operate to restrict or prevent the employment of the workers referred to in the said clause 2 on shift-work between the hours of 6 a.m. and 10 p.m. from Monday to Friday inclusive, subject, however, to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth.

4. Two shifts shall be worked each day, the early shift from 6 a.m. to 2 p.m. and the late shift from 2 p.m. to 10 p.m.

5. Shifts shall be rotated.

6. Each worker shall receive in addition to his ordinary wages the sum of 3s. per shift when employed on the early shift and the sum of 4s. per shift when employed on the late shift.

7. Any worker employed for three or less shifts in any week shall be paid at overtime rates for the whole of such shifts.

8. In each shift there shall be a compulsory break of not less than fifteen minutes in addition to the usual "smoke-ohs," the workers to be paid as for eight hours' work.

9. No youth shall be employed on shift-work.

10. This Order shall come into effect on the day of the date hereof.
