IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of every other power in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the following resolution passed by the Horowhenua County Council on the eighth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two, viz.:—

"The Horowhenua County Council, being the local authority having control of the roads in the County of Horowhenua, by resolution this eighth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two, declares that the provisions of section one hundred and twenty-eight of the Public Works Act, 1928, shall not apply to that portion of Gladstone Road edged red on the attached plan and adjoining part Horowhenua Block No. 3E, Section 4, Blocks II, III, VI, and VII, Waiopahu Survey District; containing 619 acres 2 roods 5 perches, being the whole of the land described in Certificate of Title, Volume 174, folio 290, Wellington Registry";

subject to the condition that no building or part of a building shall at any time be erected on the land fronting the portion of Gladstone Road (described in the Schedule hereto) within a distance of thirty-three feet from the centre-line of the said portion of road.

Vesting the Control of a Scenic Reserve in the Northcote Borough Council.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section thirteen of the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand doth hereby vest the control of the scenic reserve described in the Schedule hereto (being land reserved under the said Act) in the Northcote Borough Council, subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, that is to say:—

1. The period for which the control of the reserve is hereby vested shall be five years from the date hereof, unless the reservation is previously altered or revoked under the said Act.

2. The said Council shall prepare a report each year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of receipts and expenditure in connection with the said reserve. Such report and statement shall be sent to the Minister charged with the administration of the said Act as soon as possible after the close of the year.

3. The said Council shall control the said reserve in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and of the regulations made thereunder.

Vesting the Control of Scenic Reserves in the Rotoiti Scenic Board.

C. L. N. NEWALL, Governor-General.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section thirteen of the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand doth hereby vest the control of the reserves described in the Schedule hereto (being lands reserved under the said Act), for the period of five years from the date hereof (unless previously altered or revoked under the said Act), in the undermentioned persons, namely,—

The Chairman, Murchison County Council, *ex officio*,
Ronald Aubrey Leaper,
Harry Carlyon Fitzsimmons,
William Alfred Andrews,
Frederick Giles Gibbs,
Henry Thomas Kidson,
Keith Welch Walker,
Arthur Stratford, and
Ernest Harold Thomson,

who are hereby constituted for that purpose a special Board by the name of the Rotoiti Scenic Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Board"), in trust, for the preservation of scenery, and with the powers and subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The first meeting of the Board shall be held on Saturday, the twenty-fifth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two, at eight o'clock p.m., at the residence of Mr. F. G. Gibbs, 209 Collingwood Street, Nelson, and thereafter the Board shall meet for the transaction of business at such time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board.

2. The members of the Board shall at their first meeting, and thereafter at the annual meeting hereinafter mentioned, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. Any five members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at the meeting.

6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be chairman for such meeting.

7. If by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise, the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself, without reasonable cause, from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.

8. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman

to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

9. The Board shall control the said reserve in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and of the regulations made thereunder.
