PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby grant to Lionel Lyford, of Lake Pukaki, Farmer (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee"), a license subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth to take and use from a spring situated in Section 36867, Pukaki West and Strachey Survey Districts, in the Land District of Canterbury, for the nurposes hereinafter set forth a stream of water not exceeding purposes hereinafter set forth a stream of water not exceeding twenty cubic feet per second at any one time.

1. IMPLIED CONDITIONS.

2. LICENSE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.

This license is issued under the Water-power Regulations 1934, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, and the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, and is subject thereto and to any regulations made or to be made in amplification or amendment thereof or in substitution therefore

3. Utilization of Water and Location of Headworks. Water shall be used under this license solely for the purpose of generating electricity up to a maximum capacity of \$\frac{1}{2}\$ kilowatts at 220 volts direct current, and shall be taken from the spring at the point in Section 36867, Pukaki West and Strachey Survey Districts, indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 113382, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington.

4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS.

The licensee is hereby authorized, subject to the conditions hereof, to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this license, the approximate positions of the said works being indicated on the said plan P.W.D. 113382:—

- (a) Headworks consisting of an intake with a water-race leading to the water-turbine and power-house hereinafter referred to, giving a static head of approximately 7 ft.
 (b) A power-house, with all necessary equipment, for generating electricity
- generating electricity.

 (c) Tail-race leading from the said water-turbine to Dry Creek.

5. System of Supply.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (j) of clause 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935. The generating voltage and the transmission voltage shall be approximately 220 volts direct

6. Duration of License.

Unless sooner determined, this license shall continue in force until the 31st day of March, 1962, or until electrical energy is available from an Electric-power Board or other general public source, whichever is the earlier.

7. RENTAL.

For the purpose of assessing the annual rental payable in respect of this license, the licensee may install a suitable maximum-demand indicator to the satisfaction of the Inspecting Engineer of the Public Works Department, and failing such installation the rental shall be assessed on the maximum generating capacity of the plant installed. The present plant is rated at 8½ kilowatts.

PUBLIC TRAFFIC REGULATIONS 1942, OTAGO HARBOUR. The following regulations have been agreed upon by the New Zealand Naval Board and the Otago Harbour Board.

INTRODUCTORY.

- 1. Until further notice the following regulations are to be observed by all merchant vessels (see definition, paragraph 7) approaching or moving within the Otago Harbour.

 2. Limits of the Harbour.—The limits of the Harbour of Otago shall extend to and include all waters comprised within the area enclosed by a straight line commencing at Hayward Point Trig. Station, and running thence in a north-easterly direction on a true bearing of 20° 00′ for a distance of three nautical miles; thence by a straight line in a south-easterly direction on a true bearing of 20° 00′ for a distance of one and three-quarter nautical miles; thence by a straight line running in a south-westerly direction on a by a straight line in a south-easterly direction on a true bearing of 126° 00′ for a distance of one and three-quarter nautical miles; thence by a straight line running in a south-westerly direction on a true bearing of 200° 00′ for a distance of three nautical miles to a point situated at Howlett Point, bearing 309° 00′ true and distant 550 ft. from Trig. Station N, Taiaroa Head; and thence south-westerly, north-easterly, and north-westerly by high-water mark along the shores of the Harbour of Otago as commonly known, back to the commencing point. All the said area is more particularly shown and delineated on plan marked M.D. 6816, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington.

 3. The ordinary regulations of the port are to be adhered to except where varied by these regulations.

 4. All former Public Traffic Regulations are hereby cancelled.

 5. Use of Wireless Telegraphy, Wireless Telephony, and Sound Signalling.—The use of any of the above methods of communicating or signalling for any purpose whatsoever is forbidden in the harbours of New Zealand; the only exceptions to this rule are such sound signals as are authorized to be made by the Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea, and by local regulations.

 (2) For the proper enforcement of the above, the wireless-telegraph office or offices of such ships while in harbour will be sealed by the Customs or other officer to whom this responsibility has been assigned. During the stay of the vessel in harbour access to the wireless-telegraph office(s) will only be allowed under the following condition: If the vessel is remaining in harbour for such a period that it is necessary for the wireless staff to have access to the office(s) in order to attend to the batteries, &c., the Master of the merchant vessel will be responsible for warning the Customs officers, who may arrange for the breaking of the seals.

access to the office(s) in order to attend to the batteries, &c., the Master of the merchant vessel will be responsible for warning the Customs officers, who may arrange for the breaking of the seals. The Master will be held responsible that no messages are transmitted while the office(s) is (are) open, and should state for how long access is required in order that the Customs officers may afterward go on board and reseal the office(s).

(3) In vessels fitted with wireless switches (whereby the Master can prevent the operator from sending messages without his knowledge unless the latter tampers with the apparatus) the procedure detailed above may be dispensed with.

(4) Any breach of these regulations renders the Master of an offending ship liable to a fine not exceeding £1,000.

6. Signalling by light in the Otago Harbour limits is restricted to urgent or essential messages only, and to the use of a light of

to urgent or essential messages only, and to the use of a light of minimum brilliancy consistent with efficient communication. Neither the light nor its reflection should be visible from a ship at sea.

7. Definitions.—For the purpose of these regulations—

(a) Fog
(b) Thick weather

(c) Is considered to exist when it is impossible, owing to meteorological or other conditions.

(e) The term "Examination Vessel" includes any vessel employed in the Examination Service which displays the signals specified in paragraph 23:
(f) The Examining Officer is the officer of the Examination Service normally in the Examination Vessel who examines merchant vessels wishing to enter a defended port prior to their entry. As a result of his examination he permits or does not permit a merchant vessel to enter a defended port. defended port.

PART I.—ENTRY INTO THE PORT.

11. Advice to Shipowners and Shipping Agents.—Shipowners and shipping agents are advised that, in their own interests, and in order to avoid delays to their vessels in their recognition by and

passage through the Examination Service, they should, when circumstances permit-

passage through the Examination Service, they should, when circumstances permit—

(a) As a general rule arrange for their vessels to arrive at the port during daylight:

(b) Give notice of the expected arrival of their vessels at the port to the Chief Examining Officer, the Harbourmaster, Dunedin, stating the following particulars:—

(i) Name of vessel(s):

(ii) Date and time due at the port:

(iii) Appearance and distinguishing features such as funnel marks, &c.

(iv) Nature of cargo:

(v) Ports of loading and ports of discharge of cargo:

(vi) Number of passengers, if any.

(c) See that their vessels are provided with a complete set of International Code flags, and two white and two red lanterns ready and available for use, in addition to the regulation navigation lights.

12. Instructions for Merchant Vessels wishing to enter the Port (for special regulations for small craft wishing to enter the port, see paragraph 29).—Merchant vessels arriving from seaward may proceed to the Examination Anchorage and there anchor at any time.

(2) Normally, merchant vessels are permitted to enter the port by day and night after having passed through the Examination

13. Merchant vessels approaching the port are especially cautioned against making use of private signals of any description either by day or by night; the use of such signals will render merchant vessels liable to be fired on.

either by day or by night; the use of such signals will render merchant vessels liable to be fired on.

14. All merchant vessels must pass through the Examination Service before they are permitted to enter the port.

15. All merchant vessels approaching a New Zealand port at which the Examination Service is in force must hoist their signal letters on arriving within visual signalling distance of the port, and are not to wait for the signal "What ship is that?" to be made by the Examination Vessel or signal station. Vessels, however, which hoist their signal letters when approaching the port War Signal Station may haul their letters down as soon as the signal has been acknowledged by the Taiaroa Head Signal Station.

16. Merchant vessels (other than small craft—for definition of which see paragraph 7 and for instructions for which see paragraph 29) wishing to enter the port are to proceed to the Examination Anchorage and there anchor, unless, before anchoring, they are given permission and the necessary instructions to proceed into the port by the Examining Officer.

17. All orders and instructions necessary to enable a merchant vessel to enter the port will be given by the Examining Officer, whose orders and instructions are to be implicitly obeyed. Disobedience will render a merchant vessel liable to be fired on.

18. As a general rule merchant vessel will be examined by the Examining Officer in the order of their arrival in the Examination Anchorage.

19. Any merchant vessels attempting to leave the Examination



23. Examination Vessels.—The Examination Vessel will be found in the Examination Anchorage or in the vicinity thereof, and will be known by the following distinguishing marks:—

(a) By Day.—They will fly a special flag—white and red horizontal surrounded by a blue border—at the fore masthead and the Blue Ensign.



Should the port be closed (see paragraph 24), they will hoist, in addition to the above, three red balls vertical 6ft. apart in a position where they are clearly

(b) By Night.—They will carry in addition to the ordinary navigation lights three lights vertical 6tf. apart in a position where they are clearly visible all round the horizon. These three lights will be white when the port is open and red when the port is closed.

24. "Port closed": Meaning of the Term.—The term "port closed" means that vessels are not permitted to proceed further than the Examination Anchorage. The port will be closed between the hours of sunset and sunrise and at any other time by order of the Naval Officer in Charge.

No merchant vessel is permitted to proceed to sea from the Examination Anchorage without permission from the Examining Officer (see paragraph 19).

27. Regulations to be observed when in the Examination Anchorage.—Except to save life, or to avoid accident, or with previous permission from the Examining Officer, Masters of merchant vessels are forbidden to—

(e) Allow any person to leave the vessel, or any part of the el, cargo, stores, &c., to be removed.

- (2) Should it be necessary in order to save life or to avoid accident, to do any of these things without previous permission of the Examining Officer, this officer is to be communicated with at once.
- 28. To get into Communication with the Examining Officer when

28. To get into Communication with the Examining Officer when in the Examination Anchorage:—

(a) By Day—Merchant vessels are to hoist flags D.P.G., International Code.
(b) By Night—Merchant vessels are to hoist two lights, red over white, 3 ft. apart at the fore masthead.
29. Special Regulations for Small Craft wishing to enter the Port.—All small craft are to report to the Examination Vessel from whom permission to enter must be obtained.
(2) Small craft, other than vessels provided with a Naval Clearance Certificate, are forbidden to proceed outwards beyond a line ioning Harrington Point and the Spit Jetty. This prohibition a line joining Harrington Point and the Spit Jetty. This prohibition applies by day as well as by night.

(3) The Naval Clearance Certificate referred to above may

34. Local Authority controlling Internal Movement.—The Harbourmaster, Otago Harbour Board, is the local authority controlling internal movement. No movement in the port is to take place without the authority of this officer.

35. Restrictions on Merchant Vessels entering certain Areas in the Port.—No gunpowder or explosives shall be loaded or discharged unless under the jurisdiction of the Harbourmaster or other duly authorized officer. Vessels with quantities of explosives in excess of 5 tons are to proceed as directed by the Examining Officer, and vessels requiring medical examination to the Health Officer's examination ground.

36. Routes to be followed.—Are as laid down in the New Zesland Pilot.

37. Speed Limits in Victoria Channel.—The speed of vessels of 300 tons and over from a point due east of Burkes to Dunedin shall be limited to 6 knots.

38. Anchorages.—Are as laid down in the New Zealand Pilot and on Admiralty charts.

39. Lights to be shown or obscured at Night in the Port and in the Examination Anchorage by all Merchant Vessels:—

(a) When under way the regulation lights are to be displayed:
(b) When at anchor or secured, if lighting restrictions have been imposed in the port, no lights are to be visible from outboard (but see paragraph 40); the Chief Examining Officer is responsible for informing Masters of incoming vessels what restrictions (if any) are in force.

40. When a merchant vessel is under way, merchant vessels

When a merchant vessel is under way, merchant vessels at anchor or secured are to show anchor lights (see paragraph 42) at anchor or secured are to show anchor lights (see paragraph 42) until such vessel is anchored or secured, or, in the case of a merchant vessel leaving, until such vessel is clear of the port. Vessels at anchor in the Examination Anchorage are to obscure their lights when the vessel under way is clear of the Examination Anchorage.

41. Steaming and Bow Lights.—Merchant vessels permitted to navigate within the port and in the Examination Anchorage in the dark hours are not to employ electrically lit lanterns as steaming or large lights.

bow lights.

42. Anchor Lights.—Electrically lit lanterns are not to be used. Normal brilliancy of all lanterns used is to be reduced by one-half. All lanterns used are to be fitted with overhead screens

one-half. All lanterns used are to be fitted with overhead screens arranged so as to cut off the light at an angle of between twenty and twenty-five degrees above the horizontal.

43. Other Lights.—No lights aloft, on deck, or below (except those mentioned in paragraphs 39 to 42 above, and such as are necessary for authorized signalling purposes) shall be permitted to be visible from outboard. This applies to all merchant vessels whether under way, at anchor, or secured.

(2) It is imperative that Masters and others in charge of

merchant vessels should see that Masters and others in charge or merchant vessels should see that this order, which is for their own protection, is carried out.

44. Approach to Government Vessels and Establishments.—No merchant vessel is to approach any Government vessel, ship, lighter, or other Government craft, or any Government dockyard or establishment without a written permit from the Naval Officer in Charge, to be obtained through the Collector of Customs. to be approached.

45. Merchant Vessels to keep clear of H.M. Ships.—Merchant vessels are to keep clear of any of H.M. ships being navigated in the

port.

46. Patrol of Internal Waterways and Approaches to the Port.—
The internal waterways of the port and the approaches thereto may be patrolled by naval patrol craft and/or other Government vessels are Captains, Masters, and others in charge of merchant vessels are hereby warned to observe any orders given by the patrols. All merchant vessels are subject to inspection and search by these patrols. Disobedience of orders given by these patrols renders a merchant vessel liable to be fired on.

PART III.—DEPARTURE FROM THE PORT.

50. Steps necessary on the Part of Masters and/or Agents before a Vessel may leave the Port:

(a) All vessels other than those specified in clauses (c) and (d) leaving the Ports of Auckland, Wellington, Lyttelton, Dunedin, and Port Chalmers, are on each occasion required to obtain—

(i) A naval clearance from the Naval Control Service

Officer of the port;
(ii) A Customs clearance from the Collector of Customs.

(b) Instructions given by the Naval Control Service Officer do not in themselves constitute sufficient authority for the departure of a vessel:

(c) A naval clearance, valid in the port of issue only, to cover a period not exceeding one month, may be granted to such vessels as the Naval Control Service Officer may recommend, and subject to such conditions as may be prescribed by him:

(d) A naval clearance need not be obtained by fishing-vessels

(d) A naval clearance need not be obtained by fishing-vessels (other than steam trawlers), pleasure yachts, or pleasure launches. (But see paragraph 29.)

51. Signal prohibiting Sailing.—No merchant ship is to leave port while the following signals are exhibited:—

(a) By Day-

PART IV .- PILOTAGE.

57. Whether Compulsory: Entering or leaving.—Pilotage is compulsory when entering or leaving. No vessel should attempt to enter this harbour without a pilot, unless the Master possesses local knowledge.

Exemptions.—The following are exempt from pilotage provided that the Master has obtained a pilotage exemption certificate for

4. After the coming into force of this notice no person shall manufacture any cardboard box or carton, and no person who has manufactured any cardboard box or carton shall use, sell, or otherwise dispose of the same, unless it conforms to the following requirements:—

(a) The top and bottom thereof shall be of the same

(a) The top and bottom thereof shall be of the same shape and size and shall be either square, rect-

shape and size and shall be either square, rectangular, oval, or circular:

(b) There shall be no projecting edges except in the case of a powder-box:

(c) If the box or carton is manufactured for the purpose of holding more than one article, the size shall be such that there will be a distance of not more than \frac{1}{2} in. from the nearest part of each article to the nearest edge of the box or carton and from the nearest part of the other article, or if there will be more than one other article in the box or carton then to the nearest part of at least two other articles:

carton then to the nearest part of at least two other articles:

Provided that any person who before the coming into force of this notice has manufactured any cardboard box or carton which does not conform to the foregoing requirements may use, sell, or otherwise dispose of the same at any time before the 1st day of January, 1943.

5. Within seven days after the date of the publication of this notice in the Gazette every manufacturer of cardboard boxes or cartons who has in his possession or control any boxes or cartons which do not conform to the requirements set out in clause 4 hereof shall furnish in writing to the Factory Controller full particulars of those boxes and cartons, stating the quantity of each type.

6. After the coming into force of this notice no person shall manufacture any suit or costume box unless it is of one of the following sizes:—
