Arohata Prison proclaimed.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled the Prisons Act, 1908, it is provided that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation published in the *Gazette*, declare any house, building, enclosure, or place to be a prison, and from and after the gazetting of any such Proclamation, or from any time later specified in the Proclamation, such house, building, enclosure, or place shall be deemed a prison:

Now, therefore, I, Cyril Louis Norton Newall, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the above-recited power and authority, do hereby declare that the area of land described in the Schedule hereto, and all buildings and enclosures used or occupied thereon, shall, from and after the first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two, be a prison, known as the Arohata Prison, within the meaning and for the purposes of the Prisons Act, 1908.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District containing by admeasurement 81 acres 1 rood 7 perches, situate in Block VII, Belmont Survey District, and being part Section 34, Porirua District, and bounded as follows: On the south by Section 32, Porirua District, a distance of 6325 links; on the west by Section 117, Ohariu District, a distance of 1290 links; on the north by other part of Section 34, Porirua District, a distance of 5400 links and 335 links; and on the east by the main highway, and being all the land comprised in Certificate of Title, Volume 427, folio 142, Wellington Registry.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the authority of clause sixteen of the Dunedin City Loans Conversion Order, 1934, the Dunedin City Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority") stipulated in certain of the securities issued pursuant to such Order for the redemption thereof at the option of the said local authority on such date prior to that specified in the said securities as the said local authority might fix by notice in that behalf to be published in the *Gazette* at least three (3) months before such prior date:

And whereas the said local authority proposes, in exercise of the said option, to redeem on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty-three, certain of such securities amounting in the aggregate to the sum of seventy-eight thousand pounds (£78,000), the date specified in such securities for the redemption thereof being the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty-six:

And whereas the said local authority, being desirous, in order to give effect to such proposal, of raising a loan of seventy-eight thousand pounds (£78,000), to be known as "Conversion Loan, Second Repayment Loan, 1942" (hereinafter called "the said loan"), has complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, as required by such Act, should be given to the raising of the said loan:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said loan for the said purpose up to the amount of seventy-eight thousand pounds (£78,000), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

- (1) The term for which the said loan or any part thereof may be raised shall not exceed three (3) years.
- (2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding three pounds five shillings (£3 5s.) per centum per annum.
- (3) The said loan shall be repaid on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty-six.
- (4) It shall not be necessary to establish a separate sinking fund for the Repayment Loan of seventy-eight thousand pounds (£78,000), and the proviso to subsection three of section thirty-two of the Finance Act, 1938 (as set out in subsection two of section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1941) shall apply, and accordingly the provisions of subclause two of clause twenty of the Dunedin City Loans Conversion Order, 1934, shall be construed as if the debentures amounting to seventy-eight thousand pounds (£78,000) redeemed on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty-three, had not been redeemed as at that date but had been redeemed on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty-six.
- (5) The payment of interest and instalments of principal in respect of the said loan shall be made in New Zealand, and no amount payable as interest or principal shall be paid out of loan-moneys.
- (6) The amount payable for brokerage, underwriting, and procreation fees in respect of the raising of the said loan or any part thereof shall not in the aggregate exceed one-quarter per centum of any amount raised.
- (7) No moneys shall be borrowed under this consent after the expiration of two years from the date hereof.

Consenting to the Raising of a Loan of £40,000 by the Wellington City Council and prescribing the Conditions thereof.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the Wellington City Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority"), being desirous of raising the sum of forty thousand pounds (£40,000), by a loan to be known as "Wellington City New Office Building Loan, 1942" (hereinafter called "the said loan"), for the purpose of providing new office accommodation to replace buildings damaged by earthquake, has complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, as required by the said Act, should be given to the raising of the said loan:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said loan for the said purpose up to the amount of forty thousand pounds (£40,000), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

(1) The term for which the said loan or any part thereof may be raised shall not exceed thirty-five (35) years.

(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate or rates exceeding three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum per annum.

(3) The said local authority shall, before raising the said loan or any part thereof, make provision for the repayment thereof by establishing a sinking fund under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, or under such other statutory enactment as may be applicable, and shall make payments to such sinking fund at intervals of not more than one year at a rate or rates per centum which shall be not less than one pound ten shillings (£1 10s.), such payments to be made in respect of every part of the said loan for the time being so borrowed and not repaid, the first such payment to be made not later than one year after the first day from which interest to the lender or lenders is computed on the said loan or any part thereof so raised.

(6) The rate payable for brokerage, underwriting, and procurator fees in respect of the borrowing of the said loan or any part thereof shall not in the aggregate exceed one-half per centum of any amount raised.

Regulations under the Naval Defence Act, 1913, amended.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 4th day of November, 1942.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section twenty-five of the Naval Defence Act, 1913, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby amend and supplement the regulations referred to in the Schedule hereto as shown therein.

SCHEDULE.

ARTICLE 292, paragraph 4: *Cancel and substitute:—*

4. *In special circumstances* warrants may also be issued to any other person desirous of visiting a person dangerously ill, provided that the number of warrants authorized in paragraph 3 is not exceeded.

Paragraphs 6 to 9, inclusive: *Insert:—*

6. Persons entitled, in terms of these regulations, to free travelling warrants may be granted financial assistance to meet accommodation-expenses, provided that—

- (a) They are in necessitous circumstances; and
- (b) The personal payment of accommodation-expenses, while absent from their homes, would impose hardship on them.

7. The cost of accommodation, not exceeding 15s. per diem, or proportionately for broken periods, may be accepted as a charge to public funds. Where accommodation at that rate is definitely not obtainable, a higher rate may be accepted.

8. Where practicable, arrangements are to be made for next-of-kin to be met on their arrival at the place where the officer or rating is in hospital. These arrangements are to be made as follows:—

Where the officer or rating is in hospital at Auckland, Wellington, Lyttelton, or Dunedin—by the Naval Officer in Charge on information supplied by the Commanding Officer of the ship in which the officer or rating was serving.

Where the officer or rating is in hospital at places other than the ports of Auckland, Wellington, Lyttelton, or Dunedin—by the Commanding Officer of the ship in which the officer or rating was serving.

9. The Commanding Officer or Naval Officer in Charge making the arrangements may authorize the expenditure approved in terms of paragraph 7 of these regulations. Full details of expenditure approved, supported by received vouchers of the hotel concerned, are to be forwarded to Navy Office for the information of the Naval Board.

The Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22, and its Amendments.—Fixing the Closing-hours of Tobacconists' Shops within the Borough of Morrinsville.

WHEREAS a requisition in writing has been forwarded to the Minister of Labour from the occupiers of tobacconists' shops within the Borough of Morrinsville pursuant to section 32 of the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22:

And whereas he is satisfied that the signatures to such requisition represent a majority of the occupiers of all such shops within the said borough:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the said section 32, the Minister of Labour doth hereby direct that on and after the 23rd day of November, 1942, all such shops within the said borough shall be closed in the evening of working-days as follows: Subject to closing at not later than 1 p.m. on the day observed as the statutory closing-day, on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays at 6 p.m. and on Fridays at 9 p.m., with the following exceptions:—

- (1) Should the occupier of any shop affected by this notice observe Friday as the statutory closing-day, then and in such case the closing-hour on Thursday for such shop shall be 9 p.m.; and
- (2) On the evening of the working-day immediately preceding Christmas Day, on the evening of the working-day immediately preceding New Year's Day, and on the evening of the working-day immediately preceding Good Friday there shall be no fixed closing-hour.

The notice gazetted on the 20th May, 1937, fixing the closing-hours of (1) hairdressers' and (2) tobacconists' shops within the Borough of Morrinsville, shall be and is hereby cancelled, in so far as it relates to the shops affected by this notice, as from the date of the coming into operation of this notice.

The Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22.—Prohibiting the Sale within the Borough of Morrinsville of certain Goods comprised in the Trade of a Tobacconist.

And whereas he is satisfied that the sale of the said goods is comprised in the said trade within the said borough, and that the signatures to such petition represent a majority of the occupiers of all the said shops within the said borough:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of section 33 of the said Act, the Minister of Labour doth hereby direct that on and after the 23rd day of November, 1942, the sale of the said goods within the said borough shall be and is hereby prohibited as follows: On Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Saturdays after the hour of 6 p.m., and on Thursdays and Fridays after the hour of 9 p.m., with the following exceptions:—

On the working-day immediately preceding Christmas Day on the working-day immediately preceding New Year's Day, and on the working-day immediately preceding Good Friday the sale of the said goods is not prohibited.

The Canister Workers Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1942.

IN pursuance of the Labour Legislation Emergency Regulations 1940, the Minister of Labour doth hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Canister Workers Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1942.

2. This Order applies to Alexander Harvey and Sons, Ltd., Auckland, and to the workers employed by that company whose employment is subject to the Northern Industrial District Canister Workers' award dated the 7th day of May, 1942, and recorded in 42 Book of Awards 387, while such workers are engaged in the manufacture of chocolate emergency tins.

3. The provisions of the Factories Act, 1921-22, and its amendments, and of the said award, are hereby suspended in so far as they operate to prevent or restrict the employment of the workers hereinbefore mentioned on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth.

4. Two shifts shall be worked each day from Monday to Friday inclusive, the morning shift from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. and the afternoon shift from 3 p.m. to 11 p.m.

5. Shifts shall be rotated.

6. The provisions of clause 2 (c) of the said award relating to the payment of shift-allowance shall not apply to such shift-work, but time worked between 7 a.m. and 7.30 a.m. on the morning shift and between 5 p.m. and 9 p.m. on the afternoon shift shall be paid for at time and a half rates and time worked between 9 p.m. and 11 p.m. on the afternoon shift shall be paid for at double time rates.

7. On each shift the employer shall allow two ten-minute spells and provide tea, in addition to allowing a half-hour interval for a meal. Such spells and meal intervals shall be paid for as time worked, but no further payment shall be due in respect of such spells, intervals, and meals.

8. Wages shall be in accordance with the provisions of clauses 3 and 4 of the said award.

9. The employer shall satisfy the Secretary of the Northern Industrial District Amalgamated Engineering, Coachbuilding, and Related Trades Industrial Union of Workers that satisfactory facilities are available to enable female assistants employed on the afternoon shift to return home.

10. This Order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of September, 1942.

Authorizing the Laying-off of Roads of less Width than 66 ft.

The Shipping Safety (Whangaroa Harbour) Order 1942.

PURSUANT to Regulation 4A of the Shipping Safety Emergency Regulations 1940,* the Minister of Defence doth hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Shipping Safety (Whangaroa Harbour) Order 1942.

2. This Order shall take effect on the day following the date of publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

3. This Order shall apply with respect to all small craft, as defined in the Shipping Safety Emergency Regulations 1940†, to which the Shipping Control Emergency Regulations 1939‡ do not apply.

4. No master or person in charge of any small craft to which this Order applies shall cause or permit the craft to be anchored in any part of the waters described in the Schedule hereto.

5. No master or person in charge of any small craft engaged in fishing, being a craft to which this Order applies, shall cause or permit the craft while so engaged to be in any part of the waters described in the Schedule hereto.

6. Except in accordance with the terms and conditions of a written permit granted by an officer at Whangaroa, authorized in that behalf by the Naval Officer in Charge, Auckland, or his representative at Whangaroa, or the Army Board, no master or person in charge of any small craft to which this Order applies shall cause or permit the craft to enter, leave, or move in any part of the waters described in the Schedule hereto.

PROHIBITED AREA.

The Shipping Control (Whangaroa Harbour) Notice 1942.

PURSUANT to the Shipping Control Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Naval Board hereby gives notification as follows:—

1. This notification may be cited as the Shipping Control (Whangaroa Harbour) Notice 1942.

2. This notification shall take effect on the day following the date of publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

3. In this notice, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“Local small craft” means any small craft for the time being kept in Whangaroa Harbour;

“Small craft” has the same meaning as in the Shipping Safety Emergency Regulations 1940†.

4. No master or person in charge of any ship to which the Shipping Control Emergency Regulations 1939 for the time being apply shall cause or permit the ship to be anchored in any part of the waters described in the Schedule hereto.

5. No master or person in charge of any ship engaged in fishing, being a ship to which the Shipping Control Emergency Regulations 1939 for the time being apply, shall cause or permit the ship while so engaged to be in any part of the waters described in the Schedule hereto.

6. Except in accordance with the terms and conditions of a written permit granted by an officer at Auckland, authorized in that behalf by the Naval Officer in Charge, Auckland, or his representative at Whangaroa, no master or person in charge of any ship to which the Shipping Control Emergency Regulations 1939 for the time being apply, other than a local small craft, shall cause or permit the ship to enter, leave, or move in any part of the waters described in the Schedule hereto.

7. Except in accordance with the terms and conditions of a written permit granted by an officer at Whangaroa, authorized in that behalf by the Naval Officer in Charge, Auckland, or his representative at Whangaroa, or the Army Board, no master or person in charge of any local small

craft to which the Shipping Control Emergency Regulations 1939 for the time being apply shall cause or permit the craft to enter, leave, or move in any part of the waters described in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

PROHIBITED AREA.

THE waters in Whangaroa Harbour within the following limits: From North Head 004° 1·38 miles from Jones Point (lat. 35° 02' 15" S., long. 173° 46' 00" E.), in a 111° 30' direction for 7·3 cables to the shore; thence along the shore to the northern entrance point of Owanga Bay; thence in a 222° direction to the northern extremity of Peach Island; thence along the shore to the western extremity of Peach Island; thence in a 274° direction to the northern entrance point of Tararuni Cove; thence along the shore to North Head.

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RESOLUTION.

THE following regulations were laid before the members of the Levin Racing Club at a meeting held on the 3rd day of November, 1942, at the office of the club at 8 p.m., with a recommendation by the Chairman of such club, Mr. W. Ryder, that the same be passed at once with a view to their approval by His Excellency the Governor-General in pursuance of the Gaming Act, 1908, section 33.

Mr. W. Ryder, the Chairman of such club and the meeting, moved, and Mr. M. Wills seconded, and it was resolved, that such regulations should be adopted and that the Chairman and Secretary be authorized to sign the same in authentication thereof.

The following are the regulations referred to:—

LEVIN RACING CLUB.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Levin Racing Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said Club"), doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the racecourse situated in the district of Otaki and known as the Otaki Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. These regulations shall come into force on the date of the same being published in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

2. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms respectively by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

3. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely:—

(a) Bookmakers:

(b) Bookmakers' clerks, bookmakers' assistants, and bookmakers' agents:

(c) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association:

(d) Common prostitutes and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible means of support:

(e) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering, or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues, and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908:

Provided always that the Executive Committee appointed by the New Zealand Racing Conference, upon being satisfied by evidence as to character and otherwise that any person who, by reason of any conviction, comes within the scope of this regulation, should have relief from the effect thereof, may grant exemption to any such person, and may at any time revoke any such exemption without notice to such person, and without assigning any reason for such revocation.

The foregoing regulations of the Levin Racing Club were made and passed by such club on the 3rd day of November, 1942, and signed by the Chairman and Secretary.
