HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby grant to Ernest McKellar Green, of Wakefield, Nelson, Farmer (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee"), a license subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth to take and use from Granity Creek, situated in Section 4, Block XVI, Mount Arthur Survey District, in the Land District of Nelson, for the purposes hereinafter set forth a stream of water not exceeding 1.5 cubic feet per second at any one time.

CONDITIONS.

1. IMPLIED CONDITIONS.

THE conditions directed to be implied in all licenses by the Water-power Regulations 1934, and the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, shall be incorporated in and shall form part of this license except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

2. LICENSE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.

This license is issued under the Water-power Regulations 1934, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, and the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, and is subject thereto and to any regulations made or to be made in amplification or amendment thereof or in substitution therefor.

3. UTILIZATION OF WATER AND LOCATION OF HEADWORKS.

Water shall be used under this license solely for the purpose of generating electricity up to a maximum capacity of 3.5 kilowatts at 230 volts direct current, and shall be taken from the stream at the point in Section 4, Block XVI, Mount Arthur Survey District, indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 115391, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington.

4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS.

The licensee is hereby authorized, subject to the conditions hereof, to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this license, the approximate positions of the said works being indicated on the said plan P.W.D. 115391:—

- (a) Headworks consisting of a dam and intake with a water-race leading to the water-wheel, and power-house hereinafter referred to, giving a static head of approximately 56 ft.
- (b) A power-house, with all necessary equipment, for generating electricity.

5. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (d) of clause 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935. The generating voltage and the transmission voltage shall be approximately 230 volts direct current.

6. DURATION OF LICENSE.

Unless sooner determined, this license shall continue in force until the 31st day of March, 1963, or until electrical energy is available from an Electric-power Board or other general public source, whichever is the earlier.

7. RENTAL.

For the purpose of assessing the annual rental payable in respect of this license, the licensee may install a suitable maximum-demand indicator to the satisfaction of the Inspecting Engineer of the Public Works Department, and failing such installation, the rental shall be assessed on the maximum generating capacity of the plant installed. The present plant is rated at 3.5 kilowatts.
