HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

TN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize the Ohakune Borough Council (hereinafter with its successors and assigns referred to as "the licensee"), subject to the conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto, to lay, construct, put up, place, and use the electric lines described in the Second Schedule hereto, and doth hereby revoke the Order in Council dated the fourth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, and published in the Gazette on the seventh day of the same month at page 1857, authorizing the Ohakune Borough of the same month at page 1857, authorizing the Ohakune Borough Council to erect certain electric lines.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. LICENSE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.

In respect of the lines hereby authorized, the licensee shall comply with the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, and with any regulations made or to be made in amendment or amplification thereof or in substitution therefor, provided that the licensee shall not by virtue of this clause be required, except in the normal course of alteration, repair, or maintenance, to reconstruct to conform with the regulations herein before meatinged. except in the normal course of alteration, repair, or maintenance, to reconstruct to conform with the regulations hereinbefore mentioned any electric lines which were erected prior to the date of this license and which conform to the regulations in force at the time of construction. The conditions of clause 27–11 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, directed to be implied in all licenses, shall be incorporated in and shall form part of this license except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

2. Purposes of Lines.

The said lines may be used for lighting, power, and heating purposes.

3. System of Supply.

Bulk supply at a nominal pressure of 11,000 volts between phases shall be received from the Public Works Department's substation at Ohakune. The system of supply shall be as described in paragraphs (a) and (f) of clause 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935. The primary distribution voltage shall be 6,600volts between phases.

4. DURATION OF LICENSE.

Unless sooner determined, in accordance with the provisions Unless sooner determined, in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, this license shall continue in force until the 31st day of May, 1956. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

5. CHARGES FOR ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

The charges for electrical energy shall not exceed ls. per unit Ine charges for electrical energy shall not exceed is. Per unit for lighting purposes, and 6d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes: Provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor-generators for lighting purposes; and, provided further, that if accounts are paid within fourteen days of due date the charges shall not exceed 10d. per unit for lighting purposes and 4½d. per unit for motor-power, cooking, and heating purposes.

6. RAILWAY AND POST AND TELEGRAPH DEPARTMENTS' LINES.

The licensee shall rectify, to the satisfaction of the Minister of Telegraphs or Minister of Railways, any interference or disturbance caused by the erection or operation of the licensee's system that affects the satisfactory working of the telegraph-lines which are the property of the Railway or Post and Telegraph Departments, and which were erected prior to the licensee's lines.

struction and use of the above-mentioned lines or any of them.

(d) Common prostitutes and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible means of support:

means of support:

(e) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering, or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908:

Provided always that the Executive Committee appointed by rroylded always that the Executive Committee appointed by the New Zealand Racing Conference, upon being satisfied by evidence as to character and otherwise that any person who, by reason of any conviction, comes within the scope of this regulation, should have relief from the effect thereof, may grant exemption to any such person, and may at any time revoke any such exemption without notice to such person and without assigning any reason without notice to such person, and without assigning any reason for such revocation.
