THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the Southland Hospital Board (hereinafter called "the said local authority"), being desirous of raising a loan of twenty thousand pounds (£20,000), to be known as "Dee Street Hospital Building Loan, 1942" (hereinafter called "the said loan"), for the purpose of building additions to and renovating Dee Street Hospital, including hot-water service, electrical installation, sterilizer installation, and refurnishing, has complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, as required by the said Act, should be given to the raising of the said loan:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said loan for the said purpose up to the amount of twenty thousand pounds (£20,000), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

- (1) The term for which the said loan or any part thereof may be raised shall not exceed twenty (20) years.
- (2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate or rates exceeding three pounds twelve shillings and sixpence (£3 12s. 6d.) per centum per annum.
- (3) The said loan or any part thereof, together with interest thereon, shall be repaid by equal aggregate annual or half-yearly instalments extending over the term as determined in (1) above.
- (4) The payment of such instalments shall be made in New Zealand, and no instalments shall be paid out of loan-moneys.
- (5) The rate payable for brokerage, underwriting, and procurator fees in respect of the raising of the said loan or any part thereof shall not in the aggregate exceed one-half per centum of any amount raised.
- (6) No moneys shall be borrowed under this consent after the expiration of two years from the date hereof.

WHEREAS by Order in Council made on the eighteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, and subject to the determinations as to borrowing and repayment therein set out, consent was given to the raising by the Wellington City Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority") of the sum of two hundred thousand pounds (£200,000) by a loan to be known as "Sewerage Loan, 1937":

And whereas by Order in Council made on the fourth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and forty, the period within which the amount then unraised, amounting to twenty-six thousand one hundred pounds (£26,100) (hereinafter called "the said sum"), might be borrowed was extended to six (6) years from the date of the Order in Council made on the eighteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven:

And whereas the said sum has still not yet been raised, and it is expedient to vary the determinations aforesaid in respect of the said sum by again extending the period within which the said sum may be raised:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby again vary the determinations in respect of the said sum by prescribing that in lieu of a term of six (6) years, as specified in clause two of the Order in Council made on the fourth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and forty, no moneys shall be borrowed under the consent contained in the Order in Council made on the eighteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, after the expiration of eight (8) years from the date thereof.

PURSUANT to section fifty-one of the Native Purposes Act, 1931, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations with respect to the Arawa District Trust Board.

REGULATIONS.

PRELIMINARY.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Arawa District Trust Board Regulations 1941, Amendment No. 2.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Arawa District Trust Board Regulations 1941 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations").

3. These regulations shall come into force on the day of the making thereof.

COMMITTEES.

4. From its members the Board may from time to time appoint committees for the regulation and management of or for inquiring into and reporting upon such matters as it thinks fit, and may fix and alter the quorum, and appoint and remove the chairman of any such committee, and may discharge any such committee.

5. (1) Every such committee may meet at such times and places as it thinks fit and may adjourn any meeting, and in the absence of the chairman may appoint some member present to be chairman of the meeting.

(2) No business shall be transacted at any meeting of a committee unless a quorum is present.

(3) All questions coming before a committee at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present thereat, and, in the case of an equality of votes, the chairman shall have a casting vote.

TRAVELLING ALLOWANCES AND EXPENSES.

6. Out of the Board's funds there may be paid or refunded to any member in respect of his attendance at any meeting of a committee, or in respect of his performance of any business or work authorized by the Board or a committee to be done or performed, the same costs and expenses as he would be entitled to be paid or have refunded, in accordance with the provisions of Regulation 38 of the principal regulations, for his attendance at a meeting of the Board.
