HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council made on the second day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, and subject to the determinations as to borrowing and repayment therein set out, consent was given to the raising by the Poverty Bay Electric-power Board (hereinafter called "the said local authority") of a loan of seventy-five thousand pounds (£75,000), to be known as "Extension Loan, 1938" (hereinafter called "the said loan"):

And whereas the authority conferred by the said Order in Council has not been exercised to the extent of twenty thousand pounds (£20,000):

The Auckland Milk Pasteurizing and Distributing Depot Employees' Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1943.

This Order applies to Stonex Bros., Ltd., of Auckland, and to female workers employed by that company on work which is subject to New Zealand (except Marlborough and Wellington (Twenty-mile Radius)) Milk Pasteurizing and Bottling Factories' Employees' award, dated the 31st day of March, 1941, and recorded in 41 Book of Awards 200.

3. The provisions of the Factories Act, 1921-22, and its amendments, shall be and are hereby suspended in so far as they operate to prevent or restrict the employment of the workers mentioned in clause 2 between the hours of 8 a.m. and 11 p.m. on ordinary working-days, Sundays, holidays, and half-holidays, subject to the following conditions, namely:—

- (1) The employment of the said workers shall be in accordance with the provisions of the above-mentioned award:
- (2) Where female workers are employed after dark the employer shall, if public transport is not available, provide at his own expense a suitable conveyance for the transport of such workers:
- (3) The employer shall keep a copy of this Order posted up in the changing-room provided for the female workers.

4. This Order shall come into effect on the day of the date hereof, and shall remain in force until the 30th day of April, 1943.

The Napier Groceries Delivery Notice 1943.

PURSUANT to Regulation 4 of the Delivery Emergency Regulations 1942, the Minister of Transport doth hereby give notice as follows:—

1. This notice may be cited as the Napier Groceries Delivery Notice 1943.
2. This notice shall come into force on the Monday following the date of publication thereof in the *Gazette*.
3. The scheme set out in the Schedule hereto is hereby provided for the district described in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

THE NAPIER GROCERIES DELIVERY SCHEME, 1943.

(1) FOR the purposes of this scheme, unless the context otherwise requires,—

- “The district” means the Borough of Napier as indicated by zones marked on the plan;
 “The plan” means the plan of the district deposited for the purposes of the scheme in the Head Office of the Transport Department under No. TT. 3368;
 “Minister” means the Minister of Transport;
 “Zone” means a zone of the district marked on the plan.

(2) For the purpose of assisting in the administration of this scheme there shall be a committee as follows:—

- (a) Two members to be appointed by the Napier Borough Council;
 - (b) One member to be appointed by the Hawke's Bay Employers' Association (Master Grocers' Section);
 - (c) The Zoning Officer for the North Island.
- (3) (a) The members to be appointed to the committee by the Napier Borough Council and the Hawke's Bay Employers' Association (Master Grocers' Section) under clause (2) of this scheme shall be appointed by resolution of the Council and Association respectively as soon as may be after the coming into force of this scheme.
 (b) Any committee member appointed by the said Council or Association, as the case may be, may in like manner be removed from office.

(4) Any committee member, other than the Zoning Officer, may resign his office by writing addressed to the Minister.

(5) On the death, resignation, or removal from office of any committee member, other than the Zoning Officer, the vacancy created thereby shall be filled by appointment in the manner in which the vacating member was appointed.

(6) The functions of the committee shall be to receive and investigate complaints affecting the administration of this scheme in its area, to advise the Minister on any matters that may be referred to the committee by the Minister or that may be considered by it of its own motion, and to make recommendations to the Minister for amending this scheme.

(7) Subject to the foregoing provisions of this scheme, each committee may regulate its procedure in such manner as it thinks fit.

(8) The conditions of this scheme are that no groceries shall be delivered for any household, family, or person—

- (i) In a parcel of less than either 8 lb. in weight or 3 cubic feet in measurement;
- (ii) In zone numbered one other than on Tuesday, in zone numbered two other than on Wednesday, in zone numbered three other than on Friday morning, in zone numbered four other than on Friday afternoon, in zone numbered five other than on Thursday morning, in zone numbered six other than on Thursday afternoon;
- (iii) On Saturday to Monday (inclusive) in any week;
- (iv) On more than one occasion in any week.

THE following estimated average yields per acre of wheat, oats, and barley for the season 1942-43 have been compiled from reports furnished by Stock Inspectors of the Department of Agriculture throughout the Dominion, and are now published for general information.

The above estimates may be compared with last season's actual average yields, which were: wheat, 33.61 bushels; oats, 48.66 bushels; and barley, 35.99 bushels.

In accordance with the above estimates, the total yield of wheat for the season 1942-43 should be approximately 10,500,000 bushels, as against an ascertained yield of 8,671,244 bushels for the season 1941-42.

The area from which oats were threshed last season represented 25 per cent. of the total area under that crop. Assuming that a similar proportion is threshed this year, the total yield of grain would be approximately 2,900,000 bushels, as against a yield of 3,444,812 bushels for the season 1941-42.

On a similar assumption in regard to barley, the total yield of grain would be approximately 1,150,000 bushels, as against 1,296,630 bushels for the season 1941-42.
