Commission to Inquire into and Report on the Milk-supply in the Four Metropolitan Areas.

To all whom these presents shall come, and to William Robert Tuck, Esquire, George William Dell, Esquire, Arthur Hugh Ward, Esquire: GREETINGS:

WHEREAS it is expedient that inquiry should be made into the present circumstances of the supply of milk to the four metropolitan areas of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, and Dunedin, and such other areas as may be directed from time to time by the Minister of Agriculture, and any alterations and reorganizations that may be necessary, and also into the supply of milk for the Armed Forces:

Now, therefore, I, Cyril Louis Norton Newall, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908, as extended by the Commissions of Inquiry Emergency Regulations 1941, and all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby constitute and appoint you, the said

William Robert Tuck, Esquire, of Auckland, Barrister and Solicitor,

George William Dell, Esquire, of Christchurch, Secretary, and Arthur Hugh Ward, Esquire, of Wellington, Dairy Economist, to be a Commission to inquire into and report on the following matters:—

- (a) The present circumstances of the supply of milk to the four metropolitan areas of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, and Dunedin, and to such other areas as may be directed from time to time by the Minister of Agriculture:
- (b) The alteration and reorganization in methods of supply, collection, treatment, and distribution that may be necessary in such areas to ensure at reasonable prices adequate supplies of milk of high standard:
- (c) The supply of milk for the Armed Forces, including Allied Forces in such areas.

And, with the like advice and consent, I do further appoint you, the said

William Robert Tuck,

to be Chairman of the said Commission.

And for the better enabling you, the said Commission, to carry these presents into effect, you are hereby authorized and empowered to make and conduct any inquiry under these presents at such times and places in the said Dominion as you deem expedient, with power to adjourn from time to time and place to place as you think fit, and to call before you and examine, on oath or otherwise, as may be allowed by law, such person or persons as you think capable of affording you information in the premises; and you are also hereby empowered to call for and examine all such books, papers, plans, documents, or records as you deem likely to afford you the fullest information on the subject matter of the inquiry hereby directed to be made, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all lawful means whatsoever:

And, using all diligence, you are required to report to me under your hands and seals, not later than the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and forty-three, your opinion as to the aforesaid matters:

And it is hereby declared that these presents shall continue in full force and virtue although the inquiry is not regularly continued from time to time or from place to place by adjournment:

And, lastly, it is hereby declared that these presents are issued under and subject to the provisions of the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908, as extended by the Commissions of Inquiry Emergency Regulations 1941.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Marshall of the Royal Air Force Cyril Louis Norton Newall, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Member of the Order of Merit, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, on whom has been conferred the Albert Medal of the First Class, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief in and over His Majesty's Dominion of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and issued under the Seal of the said Dominion, this 10th day of March, 1943.

Price Order No. 128 (Eggs).

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY.

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 128, and shall come into force on the 13th day of March, 1943.
2. (1) Price Order No. 118† is hereby revoked.
- (2) The revocation of the said Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

3. (1) In this Order,—

“Egg-marketing area” means an egg-marketing area or a special egg-marketing area, as constituted for the time being under the Egg Marketing Regulations 1940‡ or under the Egg Marketing Emergency Regulations 1942§;

“Egg-price area” means an egg-price area as defined in the First Schedule hereto.

(2) Every egg-price area that is defined in the First Schedule hereto by reference to the counties included therein shall include all such counties, and shall also include all cities, boroughs, and town districts that are situated within or are contiguous to the boundaries of any such county. Where any city, borough, or town district as aforesaid is not itself contiguous to the boundaries of a county but is contiguous to any other city, borough, or town district that is contiguous to a county, all such contiguous cities, boroughs, and town districts shall be deemed to be included in the same egg-price area.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER.

4. (1) Except as provided in the next succeeding subclause, this Order applies with respect to all sales, whether wholesale or retail, of eggs of domestic fowls or ducks (whether fresh, chilled, or preserved).

(2) This Order shall not apply with respect to the sale of eggs for the purpose of hatching.

CLASSIFICATION OF EGGS FOR PURPOSES OF THIS ORDER.

Hen-eggs.

5. (1) For the purposes of this Order every lot of hen-eggs sold by a producer, or wholesaler, or retailer shall be classified as “Heavy Grade”, “Standard Grade”, “Medium Grade”, “Pullet Grade”, or “Ungraded”.

(2) With respect to hen-eggs that have been graded in accordance with the Egg Marketing Regulations 1940‡, the classification of such eggs for the purposes of this Order shall correspond to the grading under those regulations.

(3) With respect to hen-eggs that have not been graded in accordance with the said regulations, the following special provisions shall apply:—

- (a) No such eggs shall be classified as “Heavy Grade”, “Standard Grade”, “Medium Grade”, or “Pullet Grade” unless they would be so graded if they were graded under the said regulations;
- (b) No such eggs shall be classified as “Ungraded” unless they are fairly representative of the normal output of eggs produced in the poultry-run from which they have been derived, or if, from the eggs produced during the same period, there has been any selection by the producer of graded eggs for the purposes of separate sale.

(4) All graded eggs bought by a retailer from a producer or wholesaler shall be sold by him as being of the same respective grades.

Duck-eggs.

6. (1) For the purposes of this Order, every lot of duck-eggs sold by a producer, wholesaler, or retailer in the Auckland Egg-price Area shall be classified as “Standard”, “Medium”, “Small”, or “Ungraded”; and every lot of duck-eggs sold elsewhere than in the Auckland Egg-price Area shall be classified as “Large”, “Small”, or “Ungraded”.

(2) With respect to the classification of duck-eggs sold in the Auckland Egg-price Area, the following provisions shall apply, namely:—

- (a) No lot of eggs shall be classified as Standard duck-eggs if any of the eggs comprised in the lot weighs less than $2\frac{7}{16}$ oz.:
- (b) No lot of eggs shall be classified as Medium duck-eggs if any of the eggs comprised in the lot weighs less than $2\frac{1}{8}$ oz. or is classifiable as a Standard duck-egg:
- (c) If all the eggs comprised in any lot weigh less than $2\frac{1}{16}$ oz. each, they shall be deemed to have been classified as Small duck-eggs:
- (d) All mixed lots of eggs—that is to say, lots comprising eggs classifiable into different grades—shall be deemed to be Ungraded.

(3) With respect to the classification of duck-eggs sold elsewhere than in the Auckland Egg-price Area, the following provisions shall apply, namely:—

- (a) No lot of eggs shall be classified as Large duck-eggs if any of the eggs comprised in the lot weighs less than $2\frac{3}{4}$ oz.:
- (b) If all the eggs comprised in any lot weigh less than $2\frac{1}{8}$ oz. each, they shall be deemed to have been classified as Small duck-eggs:

(c) All mixed lots of eggs—that is to say, lots comprising some eggs classifiable as “Large” and some classifiable as “Small”—shall be deemed to be Ungraded.

(4) All graded eggs bought by a retailer from a producer or wholesaler shall be sold by him as being of the same respective grades.

FIXING MAXIMUM WHOLESALE PRICES OF EGGS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES.

7. (1) The price that may be charged or received by any wholesaler (including a producer selling otherwise than by way of retail) for any eggs to which this Order applies, when sold for resale in any marketing area within an egg-price area, shall not exceed the appropriate maximum price specified in the Second Schedule hereto.

(2) The price that may be charged or received by any wholesaler (including a producer selling otherwise than by way of retail) for any eggs to which this Order applies, when sold for resale elsewhere than in a marketing area, shall not exceed the appropriate maximum price specified in the Third Schedule hereto.

FIXING MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICES OF EGGS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES.

8. (1) Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding subclause, the maximum retail price that may be charged or received by any retailer (other than a producer) for any eggs to which this Order applies shall be computed as follows:—

	Maximum Price per Dozen.
(a) Where the retailer's cost into store is less than 1s. 6½d. per dozen	Cost, plus 2d.
(b) Where the retailer's cost into store is not less than 1s. 6½d. but is less than 2s. per dozen	Cost, plus 2½d.
(c) Where the retailer's cost into store is not less than 2s. but is less than 2s. 4½d. per dozen	Cost, plus 3d.
(d) Where the retailer's cost into store is 2s. 4½d. per dozen or more	Cost, plus 3½d.

(2) The maximum retail price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any eggs that (having been acquired by him as ungraded eggs) have been graded by him shall be the appropriate maximum wholesale price, as for graded eggs, increased by the appropriate allowance specified in the last preceding subclause (as if such maximum wholesale price were his cost into store).

9. The maximum retail price that may be charged or received by any producer for any eggs sold by him by way of retail shall be the appropriate maximum wholesale price that he could charge if the eggs were sold by him by way of wholesale, increased by the appropriate allowance specified in subclause (1) of the last preceding clause (as if such maximum wholesale price were the producer's cost into store).

SCHEDULES.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

THE WELLINGTON EGG-PRICE AREA.

The counties of Akitio, Castlepoint, Clifton, Dannevirke, Egmont, Eketahuna, Eltham, Featherston, Hawera, Horowhenua, Hutt, Inglewood, Kairanga, Kiwitea, Makara, Manawatu, Masterton, Mauriceville, Oroua, Pahiatua, Patea, Pohangina, Rangitikei, Stratford, Taranaki, Waimate West, Wairarapa South, Waitotara, Wanganui, Weber, Whangamomona, and Woodville (in the North Island), and the counties of Sounds, Collingwood, Takaka, Waimea, Marlborough, and Awatere (in the South Island), together with all cities, boroughs, and town districts included in the area by virtue of clause 3 (2) of this Order.

THE HAWKE'S BAY EGG-PRICE AREA.

The counties of Patangata, Waipukurau, Waipawa, Hawke's Bay, and Wairoa, together with all boroughs and town districts included in the area by virtue of clause 3 (2) of this Order.

THE AUCKLAND EGG-PRICE AREA.

All that part of the North Island that is not included in the Wellington Egg-price Area or the Hawke's Bay Egg-price Area.

THE CHRISTCHURCH EGG-PRICE AREA.

The counties of Kaikoura, Amuri, Cheviot, Waipara, Tawera, Ashley, Kowhai, Oxford, Rangiora, Eyre, Waimairi, Mount Herbert, Heathcote, Paparua, Akaroa, Wairewa, Halswell, Springs, Ellesmere, Malvern, Selwyn, Ashburton, Geraldine, Mackenzie, and Levels, together with the city of Christchurch and all boroughs and town districts included in the area by virtue of clause 3 (2) of this Order.

THE WESTLAND EGG-PRICE AREA.

The counties of Buller, Murchison, Inangahua, Grey, and Westland, together with all boroughs and town districts included in the area by virtue of clause 3 (2) of this Order.

THE DUNEDIN EGG-PRICE AREA.

All that part of the South Island (including Stewart Island) that is not included in the Wellington Egg-price Area, the Christchurch Egg-price Area, or the Westland Egg-price Area.

The Potatoes (Transportation) Order 1943, No. 1.

PURSUANT to powers conferred on the Primary Industries Controller by the Primary Industries Emergency Regulations 1939,* and duly delegated to me by the said Controller, pursuant to clause 5 of the said regulations, I, Ross Pappriell Fraser, the Acting-Director of the Internal Marketing Division of the Marketing Department, do hereby order and direct as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Potatoes (Transportation) Order 1943, No. 1, and shall come into force on the 13th day of March, 1943.

2. While this Order remains in force no person shall, except with the permission of an officer of the Internal Marketing Division of the Marketing Department, consign any potatoes for carriage by rail, or cause any potatoes to be so consigned—

(a) To any station south of Linton from any station north of Linton on any of the following railway-lines—

- (i) The Auckland-Wellington Main Trunk railway-line:
- (ii) The Wellington - New Plymouth railway-line:
- (iii) The Wellington-Stratford-Okahukura railway-line:
- (iv) The Wellington - Palmerston North - Woodville railway-line:

(b) To any station north of Taumarunui from any station south of Taumarunui on any of the following railway-lines—

- (i) The Auckland-Wellington Main Trunk railway-line:
- (ii) The New Plymouth - Stratford - Okahukura railway-line:
- (iii) The Wellington-Stratford-Okahukura railway-line:
- (iv) The Wellington - Palmerston North - Woodville railway-line:

(c) To any station north of Turakina (including Wanganui) from—

- (i) Any station south of Turakina on the railway-line between Wellington and New Plymouth:
- (ii) Any station south of Taumarunui on the Auckland-Wellington Main Trunk railway-line:
- (iii) Any station south of Woodville on the Wellington - Palmerston North - Woodville railway-line.

3. While this Order remains in force no person shall, except with the permission of an officer of the Internal Marketing Division of the Marketing Department, consign any potatoes for carriage by sea from any port in the South Island, other than a port in the Nelson Provincial District, to any port in the North Island.

4. Unless sooner revoked or extended this Order shall continue in force until the 15th day of April, 1943, and no longer.
