THE HON. D. G. SULLIVAN PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to section eighteen of the Reserves and other Lands Disposal Act, 1942, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Anderson Gift Regulations 1943.
2. These regulations shall come into force on the day following their notification in the *Gazette*.
3. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the following words shall have the meanings given to them in this regulation:—

“Board” means the Anderson Trust Board established under section 18 of the Reserves and other Lands Disposal Act, 1942:

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the said Board:

“Minister” means the Minister of Lands:

“The said Act” means section 18 of the Reserves and other Lands Disposal Act, 1942.

4. (1) The office of a member of the Board shall become vacant if he—
  - (a) Dies; or
  - (b) Resigns his office by writing addressed to the Chairman; or
  - (c) Becomes of unsound mind; or
  - (d) Becomes bankrupt, or makes any composition with his creditors for less than twenty shillings in the pound, or makes an assignment of his estate for the benefit of his creditors; or
  - (e) Is convicted of an offence punishable by imprisonment; or
  - (f) Is guilty of any negligent, improper, or fraudulent conduct which, in the opinion of the Minister, renders him unfit for office; or
  - (g) Is absent without sufficient cause from three successive ordinary meetings of the Board without the leave of the Board.
- (2) The Chairman shall forthwith cause the Minister to be notified of every vacancy in the membership of the Board as it occurs.

5. (1) The Board shall meet at the office of the Commissioner of Crown Lands, Invercargill, or at such other place or places as the Board may from time to time determine.

(2) The first meeting of the Board shall be held on a day to be appointed in that behalf by the Chairman.

(3) Special meetings of the Board may be called at any time by the Chairman.

(4) Subject to the provisions herein the Board may regulate its own procedure.

6. (1) An officer of the Department of Lands and Survey may, with the Minister's approval, be appointed as Secretary to the Board, and his duty will be to take charge of minute-book and all records and papers of the Board, and to do such things as shall be necessary for the proper carrying out of the duties of the Board.

(2) Any document or documents, the execution of which is required for the purposes of the said Act or of these regulations, shall be validly executed if signed by the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the Southland Land District for and on behalf of the Board.

7. (1) Before making any grant to any person in the class mentioned in subsection (8) of the said Act, the Board shall make such inquiries concerning the circumstances of that person as it thinks necessary.

(2) Any grant authorized by the Board shall not exceed the sum of £10 at any one time.

(3) For the purposes of the said Act and these regulations orphans of deceased servicemen and children of servicemen who are patients within the meaning of the Mental Defectives Act, 1911, shall be under the age of sixteen years, and shall include step-children and legally adopted children respectively.

(4) Any grant may be paid to the mother, guardian, legal representative or nearest relative of the orphan or child, to be used solely for his or her benefit, and in such case the Board shall ensure that the grant is expended for the purpose for which it is made.

(5) Any grant may be expended by the Board itself for the benefit of an orphan or child.

(6) No grant shall be made to any widow, wife, orphan, or child when the total family income exceeds an average rate of £5 a week, increased by 4s. per week in respect of each child under sixteen years of age. The weekly income shall be computed by the Board in the manner prescribed by section 4 of the Family Allowances Act, 1926.

WHEREAS the several local authorities enumerated in the Schedule hereto, being desirous of raising the respective loans stated opposite their names therein, have respectively complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, as required by the said Act, should be given to the raising of the said loans :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the respective local authorities mentioned in the first column of the said Schedule of the respective loans set out in the second column of the said Schedule up to the respective amounts specified in the third column of the said Schedule, and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows :—

- (1) The terms for which the said loans or any parts thereof may be raised shall be the respective terms (in years) stated in the fourth column of the said Schedule.
- (2) The rates of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loans or any parts thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate or rates exceeding the respective rates per centum per annum stated in the fifth column of the said Schedule.
- (3) The said respective loans or any parts thereof, together with interest thereon, shall be repaid by equal aggregate annual or half-yearly instalments extending over the respective terms as determined in (1) above.
- (4) The payment of such instalments shall be made in New Zealand, and no such instalment shall be paid out of loan-moneys.
- (5) The rate payable for brokerage, underwriting, and procurator fees in respect of the raising of the said respective loans or any parts thereof shall not in the aggregate exceed one-half per centum of any amount raised.
- (6) No moneys shall be borrowed under this consent after the expiration of two years from the date hereof.

Consenting to the Raising of Portion (£5,000) of the Te Awamutu Electric-power Board's Loan of £25,000 and prescribing the Conditions thereof.

THE HON. D. G. SULLIVAN PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council made on the twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and forty-one, and subject to the determinations as to borrowing and repayment therein set out, consent was given to the raising by the Te Awamutu Electric-power Board (hereinafter called "the said local authority") of the sum of twenty-five thousand pounds (£25,000), to be known as "Extension Loan, 1940" (hereinafter called "the said loan") :

And whereas the authority conferred by the said Order in Council has not been exercised to the extent of seventeen thousand pounds (£17,000) :

And whereas the authority has lapsed in accordance with the provisions of clause six of the said Order in Council, and it is not now lawful or competent for the said local authority to raise the said amount of seventeen thousand (£17,000) or any portion thereof, except in accordance with the provisions of a further Order in Council that may be issued pursuant to section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act") :

And whereas the said local authority is now desirous of raising a portion amounting to five thousand pounds (£5,000) (hereinafter called "the said sum"), and it is expedient to authorize the said local authority to raise the said sum on the conditions hereinafter set out :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said sum up to the amount of five thousand (£5,000) for the purpose for which the said loan was authorized, and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows :—

- (1) The term for which the said loan or any part thereof may be borrowed shall not exceed twenty-five (25) years.
- (2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding three pounds fifteen shillings (£3 15s.) per centum per annum.

Each such half-yearly instalment includes a repayment of principal of the amount set opposite such instalment in the third column of the said Schedule and a half-year's interest calculated at the rate of three pounds seven shillings and sixpence (£3 7s. 6d.) per centum per annum, as specified in clause two of the said Order in Council, on the amount of principal outstanding immediately prior to the date of payment of such instalment.

All that area comprising the counties of Mangonui, Whangaroa, Hokianga, Bay of Islands, Hobson, Whangarei, Otamatea, Rodney, together with all boroughs and town districts lying within or contiguous to the boundaries of such counties, other than the boroughs of Devonport, Takapuna, Northcote, Birkenhead, and New Lynn, but including Kawau Island in the Hauraki Gulf.

*Appointing Districts and Places for Payment of Sales Tax under the Sales Tax Act, 1932-33.*

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 4 of the Sales Tax Act, 1932-33, I, Arnold Henry Nordmeyer, Acting Minister of Customs, do hereby revoke so much of the Schedule to the Warrant of appointment made by the Minister of Customs on 27th March, 1933, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on 28th March, 1933 (under which certain districts and places were appointed for the purpose of collecting sales tax) as is set forth in the First Schedule hereto:

And I do hereby appoint the districts mentioned in Column No. 1 of the Second Schedule hereto as districts for the purpose of collecting sales tax as imposed by the said Act, and I direct that each such district shall respectively comprise the counties the names of which are set opposite to the name of such district in Column No. 2 of the said Second Schedule, and all boroughs and town districts which are within the outer boundaries of those counties or which are bounded by those counties or are between those counties or any part thereof and the sea:

And I do further appoint that the place mentioned in Column No. 3 of the said Second Schedule opposite the name of any district shall be the place in the said district at which sales tax shall be paid:

Provided that with respect to goods liable to sales tax under paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section 11 of the said Act the following special provision shall apply, namely:—

Where the goods are imported by post and entered for home consumption under the Customs Act, 1913, at any post-office, sales tax shall be payable at the post-office at which the goods are so entered or are deemed to be so entered.

(b) One member to be appointed by the parties to the scheme;

(c) The Subdistrict Oil Fuel Controller, Hokitika.

(3) Any committee member other than the Subdistrict Oil Fuel Controller may resign his office by writing addressed to the Minister.

(4) On the death, resignation, or removal from office of any committee member, other than the Subdistrict Oil Fuel Controller, the vacancy created thereby shall be filled by appointment in the manner in which the vacating member was appointed.

(5) The functions of the committee shall be to receive and investigate complaints affecting the administration of the scheme in its area, to advise the Minister on any matters that may be referred to the committee by the Minister or that may be considered by it of its own motion, and to make recommendations to the Minister for amending the scheme.

(6) Subject to the foregoing provisions of this scheme the committee may regulate its procedure in such manner as it thinks fit.

(7) It shall be a condition of this scheme that subject to the provisions of the next succeeding clause, meat may be delivered in the district to any person on such three days in any week during the months of December, January, and February in each year, and on such two days in any week during the months of March to November (inclusive) in each year, as the Minister or a Zoning Officer shall from time to time appoint in respect of the scheme, but that otherwise meat may be delivered in the district to the premises of wholesale purchasers only.
