A PROCLAMATION

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section twenty of the Forests Act, 1921-22, I, Cyril Louis Norton Newall, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting on the recommendation of the Minister of Lands, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands described in the Schedule hereto, being part of Provisional State Forest Reserves Nos. 1622 and 1667, set apart by Proclamations dated the eleventh day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and gazetted on the fourteenth day of that month, and the twenty-ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and gazetted on the eighth day of May of that year, respectively, are required for settlement purposes; and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, such lands shall, from and after the day of the gazetting hereof, cease to be provisional State forest, and shall become subject to the provisions of the Land Act, 1924.

## Consenting to the Borrowing of Moneys by the Waitara Borough Council by way of Bank Overdraft

## ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 5th day of May, 1943

Present :

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS the Waitara Borough Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority"), being desirous of borrowing the sum of seven hundred pounds (£700) by way of bank overdraft under the provisions of section seven of the Local Bodies' Finance Act, 1921-22, by a loan to be known as "Wharf Flood Damage Loan, 1942," for the purpose of erecting a protective bank along the site of the old wharf, has complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, as required by the said Act, should be given to the borrowing as aforesaid :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the borrowing of moneys by the said local authority by way of bank overdraft under the said section seven up to the amount of seven hundred pounds (£700), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows :—

- (1) The term for which such moneys or any part thereof may be borrowed shall not exceed four (4) years.
- (2) The rate of interest payable from time to time shall not exceed the current bank overdraft rate of interest to best customers.
- (3) The moneys so borrowed shall be repaid by annual payments of not less than one hundred and seventy-five pounds (£175) each.
- (4) No amount payable as interest in respect of the said moneys shall be paid out of loan-money.
- (5) No moneys shall be borrowed under this authority after the expiration of two years from the date hereof.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL

Present :

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS by Order in Council made on the eleventh day of November, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two, and subject to the determinations as to borrowing and repayment therein set out, consent was given to the raising in New Zealand by the Stratford Hospital Board (hereinafter referred to as "the said local authority"), of the sum of fourteen thousand five hundred pounds (£14,500), by a loan to be known as "Buildings and Heating Services Extensions Loan, 1942" (hereinafter referred to as "the said loan") :

And whereas the authority conferred by the said Order in Council has not yet been exercised, and it is expedient to vary the determinations aforesaid in respect of the said loan :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby vary the determinations aforesaid in respect of the said loan by prescribing as follows :—

(1) In lieu of a rate of interest not exceeding three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum per annum, as specified in clause two of the said Order in Council, the rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding three pounds seven shillings and sixpence (£3 7s. 6d.) per centum per annum.

(2) In lieu of repayment by equal aggregate annual or half-yearly instalments of principal and interest, as specified in clause three of the said Order in Council, the said loan shall be repaid by half-yearly instalments in the half-years set out in the first column of the Schedule hereunder of the amounts set opposite each half-year in the second column of the said Schedule. Each such half-yearly instalment includes a repayment of principal amounting to three hundred and sixty-two pounds ten shillings (£362 10s.) and a half-year's interest calculated at the rate of three pounds seven shillings and sixpence (£3 7s. 6d.) per centum per annum as specified in clause one above, on the amount of principal outstanding immediately prior to the date of payment of such instalment.

“That, for the purpose of providing the interest and sinking fund and other charges on a loan of £1,150, authorized to be raised by the Levels County Council under the above-mentioned Act for the purpose of providing a share of the cost of constructing drainage works in the Seadown Drainage District, the said Council of the Levels County hereby makes and levies a special rate of 0.184134 of a penny in the pound upon the rateable value (capital value) of all rateable property in the Seadown Drainage District classified ‘A’ in the classification list of the said Seadown Drainage District and a special rate of 0.092067 of a penny in the pound upon the rateable value (capital value) of all rateable property in the said Seadown Drainage District classified ‘B’ in the said classification list; and that such special rates shall be annual-recurring rates during the currency of such loan and be payable yearly on the 1st day of August in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of thirty-five years or until the loan is fully paid off.”
