#### The Electric Radiators Order 1943

PURSUANT to the Supply Control Emergency Regulations 1939 \* and the Electricity Emergency Regulations 1939 \*, the Electricity Controller doth hereby order and direct as the follows:

1. (1) This Order may be cited as the Electric Radiators Order 1943.

(2) This Order shall come into force on the 2nd day of July, 1943.

- 2. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,-"Electric radiator" includes any new or used electric
  - "Electric radiator" includes any new or used electric space-heating appliance or equipment: "Hospital" includes any institution, private hospital, or separate institution within the meaning of the Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1926;; and also includes any Red Cross, Plunket, or first-aid rooms or other premises used by any organization for the purpose of giving medical advice or treatment:
  - "Owner", in relation to any electric radiator or radiator element, includes any person having the radiator or element in his possession or control or on order
  - element in ms possession of courts of of the by him: "Public supply of electricity" means any system of electric lines for the distribution of electricity which is connected whether directly or indirectly and whether continuously or not with any Govern-
  - ment system of supply:
    "Radiator element" means any new or used element capable of being used in any electric radiator:
    "Supply authority" means the licensee in respect of a public supply of electricity.

3.
